The County Feedlot Compliance Coordinator will discuss the 2023 County Feedlot Officer (CFO) Annual Report. The completion of the 2023 CFO Annual Report is a requirement of the feedlot officers that are delegated. The Excel 2023 CFO Annual Report is a form that records activities performed by the county during the calendar year and determine performance credits based on a scoring system. The Excel report relies on county-maintained data and data entered into the state wide reporting system that is administered by the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA).

The Feedlot Compliance Coordinator has attached the 2023 County Feedlot Officer (CFO) Annual report, the Goodhue County 2023 Feedlot Financial Report, and the follow-up letter from the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) of the 2023 Annual Report Year-End Review.

Dear Kelsey Petit:

On March 28, 2024, the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) completed a year-end review of the Goodhue County Maintenance (County) delegated feedlot program for the period of January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023. Based upon the review, the MPCA has determined that the County satisfactorily met 20 out of an applicable 20 or 100 percent of non-inspection minimum program requirements (MPRs). The County also satisfactorily conducted 34 inspections of the 428 feedlots required to be registered for an inspection rate of 7.94 percent.

In addition, the MPCA has reviewed the County's 2023-24 Delegation Agreement and Work Plan by comparing it to the work the county has done. No modifications to the Delegation Agreement Work Plan have been proposed at this time.
