#### BACKGROUND:

After years of preparation, Goodhue County Health and Human Services (GCHHS) was accredited by the Public Health Accreditation Board (PHAB) in June 2019.

Being accredited is about <u>continuously improving</u> toward meeting <u>national standards</u>. The benefits are described in the attached report, "The Value and Impact of Public Health Department Accreditation: A Review of Quantitative & Qualitative Data," July 2023. Note Goodhue County is quoted on page 17.

Accreditation status is valid for five years, so ours expires in June 2024. Our reaccreditation application must be submitted to PHAB between April 1, 2024, and June 30, 2024.

Currently, health department staff plan to complete the reaccreditation application in April and submit all our other documentation by August 2024. Because there are a total of 117 pieces of documentation required, GCHHS domain team members have been preparing documentation since summer 2022. From August 2023 to June 2024, a Public Health Corps AmeriCorps member has been assisting with preparation efforts. More than 60% of this documentation is ready for upload as of February 2024.

As part of our reaccreditation application, we are required to upload something showing the Health and Human Services board's support for accreditation. The Goodhue County Health and Human Services board first passed a resolution in support of accreditation in December 2014. An updated version of this resolution is attached.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

HHS Department recommends the board support the resolution for the department's application for public health reaccreditation from PHAB.
