What is Treatment Court?

14-24 months in length

• Target population is high risk/high need

Provides intensive treatment and other services they require to be sober and crime free

High accountability


Regular and random UA testing

• Frequent court appearances

Rewarded for doing well or sanctioned when they aren't in compliance

Treatment Courts in Minnesota

Minnesota has 68 operational Treatment Courts as of February 13, 2020



Why Treatment Court?



Over 25 years experience and research into these programs. They utilize evidenced based practices.

75% of graduates remain arrest free at least three years or more

Provides more comprehensive and closer supervision

6 times more likely to keep offenders in treatment long enough for it to work

Studies have shown drug courts reduces crime as much as 35%

What Can Treatment Court Help With?

- Mental Health Services
- *Housing (coordinated entry assessments)
- **Employment**
- *Health Insurance
- **SNAP** and General Assistance
- Basic Needs (clothing, shoes, food)
- Chemical Health Services
- Child Support
- *Other (social security, transportation, referrals, etc.)

Need for Treatment Court in Goodhue County

Increase in opiate overdose deaths

2016 there were 396 opioid related deaths in MN compared to 317 in 2014 and has increased in following years

Increase in Controlled Substance Filings in Goodhue County

Courts wanted new approach, as they were seeing same clients over and over regarding issues due to their addiction

Eligibility Requirements

Felony level crimes, where drugs/alcohol were a substantial factor

Felony level probation violations

Diagnosis of substance use, moderate to severe

No current or history of violence

Must assess as high risk/high need

Must enter guilty plea or admit to pv violation

Treatment Court Components

Supervision

- * Frequent Court Hearings
 - * Frequent PO contact
 - * Frequent UAs

- * Checks by local Law Enforcement
- * High accountability, program sanctions are addressed asap

Services

- * Intensive and Responsive CD
 Treatment
 - * Screening for MH services

 *Therapeutic Responses

- * Cognitive Skills Programming
- *Mentors/Peer Support Specialists
 - * Referrals for job, housing, education, etc


