Summary:

We are requesting to fill one FTE for the Administrative Assistant in the Veteran's office as soon as possible.

Background and Request:

This position is crucial in the operation of this office. The traffic in the office has grown immensely over the last few years (see attached statistics).

The Administrative Assistant position job description has been updated and has been evaluated at Range 81.

For comparison, Wabasha, Steele, and Rice counties all have one CVSO and one AA. Olmsted County has one CVSO, two ACVSOs, and one AA. Dakota County has one CVSO, 4 ACVSOs, and one AA. Each county has a separate AA in the office.

Currently, the ACVSO is doing the administrative assistant work (answering phones, scheduling rides, greeting walk-ins, scanning paperwork, ...) and is getting little training to work with the CVSO to be able to file claims or work with more detailed requests. In essence, the County is paying a higher position to do the work of the Administrative position. With the amount of the traffic in the office, we do not feel that we are providing timely and thorough service to our veterans by utilizing the ACVSO as an administrative assistant instead of the work they are qualified to do.

There are thousands of veterans in the county that have not been through this office to apply for benefits. In order to effectively communicate our services and Veteran's potential benefits, we need to establish a robust outreach program. With the current staffing level, we are not able to explore or sustain outreach opportunities.

With a full time administrative assistant to help with the daily phone, email, walk-in traffic, back scanning of files, and ride coordination, the CVSO and ACVSO will have time to meet with more Veteran's, establish an outreach program, and go to mandatory training without leaving the office unattended.

Hello,

I am submitting evidence that the Veteran Services department needs an administrative assistant position to more thoroughly provide quality service to Goodhue County veterans.

The numbers:

Phone calls:

- The veteran service office placed and received 7,606 phone calls during the year of 2022.
- This averages out to approximately 30 phone calls per day.

Interactions

- Veteran interactions began to be tracked in August 2022.
- Since then we have tracked 2704 interactions with veterans and veteran service providers.

In-Person

- Since August, 2022 we have had 540 in-person meetings with veterans.
- An average of four one-hour appointments per day.

Veteran records

- All physical files still need to be scanned and uploaded into Vet Pro
- All files in VIMMS have not been transferred to VetPro
- We have historical WW1 and similar veterans' records that need to be scanned

Veteran's Benefits Awards: 2022

- A total of \$440,000 annual income was brought into Goodhue County from compensation DIC pension claims.
- 3% increase from 2020

RE: Government Center Lower Level

As you may recall, Commissioners requested at the County Board Workshop on January 17, 2023 for staff to bring a request for a Veterans Service Office Administrative Assistant to a future personnel committee. At the same time, it was also requested to illustrate a hybrid central services concept model in the lower level of the Government Center.

Over the last few weeks, County Administration staff has met with Veteran Service Officer (VSO), Justin Kent, Facilities Maintenance Director, Tim Redepenning and Information Technology Director, John Smith and discussed options to develop a hybrid model for the lower level of the government center. Our goal is to provide the best service possible to the citizens seeking service in the building and meeting people where they are. This continues to be a work in progress as VSO, Justin Kent intends to have collaborative planning and cross training efforts between both the Veterans Service Office and the Extension Office.

The attached floor plans of the lower level and first floor of the Government Center give you a snap shot of the spaces and who could occupy them. Listed below **could** be the first steps to a multi-year/step approach to the implementation of a hybrid central services type model.

- 1. Information Technology moves to 1st floor Room 104
- 2. Veteran's Service Office and Extension moves to lower level space
- 3. Facilities Maintenance moves to 1st floor Room 101
- 4. Increase/change signage within the building.
- 5. Possible relocation of Information Technology Servers (will study this and cost)
- 6. Inventory/Scan/Clean out of storage vaults in the lower level
- 7. Redo the lower level entrance of the Government Center to an inviting/welcoming central services concept.





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LOWER LEVEL - EXISTING DEPARTMENT PLAN




