CANNON VALLEY TRAIL

Tractor Mower Grant Approval. GOODHUE COUNTY SOIL AND WATER

Water Plan Extension Request. Beau Kennedy with the Soil and Water Conservation District recommended the board request an extension to the Local County Water Plan which is set to expire in June of 2020. A draft letter was presented and upon approval and signature, would be sent to BWSR regional supervisor for consideration.

Moved by C/Anderson, seconded by C/Majerus, and carried to approve to sign the proposed letter requesting extension of the Goodhue County Local Water Management Plan which would gap between County Water Plans being phased out by the new approach of water planning.

Public Hearing: Consider Goodhue County Subdivision Ordinance Updates. Proposed amendments to the Goodhue County Subdivision Ordinance to modify language relating to road classifications, subdivision and platting processes and correct typographical errors. The Planning Advisory Commission recommended the County Board adopt the staff report into the record, accept the testimony, exhibits, and other evidence presented into the record and APPROVE the amendments to the Goodhue County Subdivision Ordinance.

Request submitted by Douglas Hill (owner) for Preliminary and Final Plat review of the proposed Comstock's Court comprising approximately 15.23 acres. Parcel 31.001.4300. 1790 Bluebird Lane, Red Wing, MN 55066. Part of the NW ¼ of the NE ¼ of Sect 01 Twp 112 R15 in Featherstone Township. R1 Zoned District.

The Planning Commission recommended approval.

Amy Anderson asked for clarification on the new subdivision that was just approved. Ms. Hanni commented that it would not be an issue since they started the process prior to the board approving the new language.

Consider: CUP Amendment - Augie's Trucking LLC. Request for Conditional Use Permit (CUP) amendment, submitted by Jason Augustine (Augie's Trucking LLC), to construct a building addition larger than the maximum size allowed by the existing CUP.

The Planning Commission recommended approval.

- Moved by C/Anderson, seconded by C/Flanders, and carried to approve the Planning Commission recommendation and adopt the staff report into the record; adopt the findings of fact; accept the application, testimony, exhibits, and other evidence presented into the record; and APPROVE the request from Jason Augustine (Augie's Trucking LLC) to amend CUP Z18-0006 to allow construction of 5,528 square foot building addition. Subject to the following conditions:
 - 1. The business must comply with all applicable Federal, State and Local rules and regulations, including but not limited to building permits and SSTS permits.
 - 2. The applicant must provide evidence (copy of completed MPCA Notification/Change in Status for Aboveground Storage Tanks Form) of compliance with MPCA rules regarding storage and handling of diesel fuel and waste oil.
 - 3. The business shall be limited to parking/storage of no more than 5 owner operated trucks (with trailers not limited). 4. Business use shall be limited to truck storage, maintenance and repair, with an accessory building limited to a 60' x 90' with an unenclosed overhang 8' x 16' outside the office door on the west side of the accessory building for a maximum square footage of 5,528 square feet.

- 5. A maximum of six non-family employees may be employed on the premises at any time.
- 6. Augie's Trucking will hire a contractor to apply CaCl dust control up to 6 times per year in front of each residence between his property and TH 19 after Public Works regrades the road, at a width of 24 feet, for a length of 400 feet per residence at a rate of 0.27 to 0.30 gal/sq. yd. with the applicator determining the precise rate based on his experience.
- 7. Augie's trucks are to drive a maximum of 30 mph on Co. Rd 41.
- 8. The hours of operation shall be limited to 8AM 6PM for the Repair Shop and 5AM 8PM for the Trucking Business. The Trucking Business will be allowed a maximum of two trips per day outside the stated hours of 5AM - 8PM.

CSAH 6 No Parking Resolution

Summary

Request the County Board approve the attached resolution for establishing CSAH 6 between the intersection of CSAH 6/TH 58 and 435th Street as a "NO PARKING" zone.

Background

As part of the Goodhue County Public Works construction program in 2020, we will be contracting for the reconstruction of a portion of CSAH 6 in the City of Zumbrota. State Aid participation will be requested for this project and as part of that, the plans need to be approved at the District level. One of the safety requirements dictated in this process is that this segment be designated as a NO PARKING zone due to the width of the roadway. In order to establish this NO PARKING area, the County is required to pass a resolution stating such.

Since the City of Zumbrota will be involved in enforcing this NO PARKING zone, the City has also approved a resolution establishing the NO PARKING zone.

<u>Alternatives</u>

This contract was for the paving on CSAH 12, CSAH 18, CSAH 19, CSAH 27, CSAH 62, and the Public Works parking lot. The contractor on this project was Rochester Sand & Gravel of Rochester, MN. Work commenced on 08 July 19 and was completed on 13 September 19. Original contract amount was \$4,160,642.74. The revised contract amount was \$4,156,873.72. Final contract amount is \$3,873,939.19. Final payment to the contractor is \$193,696.96.

Completed contract amount is 6.8% below the revised contract amount.

Summary

It is requested that the County Board approve the attached resolution to accept and disburse final payment of Contract SAP 025-627-009.

Background

During the scheduled 01 December 2015 Goodhue County Board of Commissions meeting a resolution to commit \$800,000 of Municipal State Aid Highway Construction funds was approved for the reconstruction of CSAH 27 from Main Street to 6th Avenue in the City of Pine Island.

This contract included the reconstruction of CSAH 27 which included underground utility replacement, re-grading, aggregate base, curb & gutter, and bituminous paving. The contractor on this project was A-1 Excavating, Inc of Bloomer, WI. The contract for this project was administered by the City of Pine Island with WSN acting as the City Engineer. Work commenced during the summer of 2017 and was substantially complete in 2018 with minor work and contract completion happening during the summer of 2019.

The original contract amount for the project was \$1,510,405.25. Qualifying expenses related to the use of Municipal State Aid Highway Construction funds exceeded Goodhue County's committed maximum of \$800,000. Disbursement of qualifying funds have been made excluding the 5% retainage amount. Final payment to the City of Pine Island is \$40,000.

Purpose:

In December, 2019, the Sheriff's Office applied for the annual federal supplement grant for boating safety equipment and supplies. This grant will pay for the following items – boats, motors and trailers used for boating safety work; buoys, signs, lights and other aids to navigation boaters; and equipment used for boating safety enforcement, search & rescue and boating safety education.

The Sheriff's Office applied for funds to pay for 15 new Mustang Survival's Auto Hydrostatic Inflatable PFD's. The new PFD's will replace our old PFD's that have been used for many years by our deputies patrolling waterways in our county and are in need of replacing.

The Sheriff's Office also applied for funds to pay for an 18 foot Gator Tail 40 H.P. steering drive boat. This boat will allow us to patrol certain waterways that are hard to get to in traditional boats. Along with patrolling waterways it would give us another asset when it comes to water based rescues. This new boat will replace the Lowe boat.

On February 13, 2020 the MN Department of Natural Resources approved the purchase of these items.

2019 STATE OF MINNESOTA FEDERAL BOATING SAFETY SUPPLEMENTAL EQUIPMENT GRANT AGREEMENT

This grant agreement is between the State of Minnesota, acting through its Commissioner of Natural Resources, Enforcement Division ("State") and Goodhue County Sheriff's Office, 430 W Sixth Street, Red Wing, MN 55066 (DUNS 051690642) ("Grantee"). The payment address for this grant agreement is Goodhue Co. Treasurer, 509 W. 5th St., Red Wing, MN 55066.

Recitals

- 1. Under Minnesota Statute §84.026, §86B.101 and Department of Homeland Security (FAIN 3319FAS190127, Effective 10/01/18-01/28/22) through the Recreational Boating Safety Financial Assistance program to states, commonwealth and territories (CFDA number 97.012) in U.S.C. 13101-13110 the State is empowered to enter into this grant. This is a non-research grant agreement.
- The State will make available supplementary funding in the amount noted in this agreement to cover the cost of the specific items for recreational boating safety.
- 3. The Grantee represents that it is duly qualified and agrees to perform all services described in this grant agreement to the satisfaction of the State.

Grant Agreement

1 Term of Grant Agreement

- 1.1 Effective date: March 2, 2020 or the date the State obtains all required signatures under Minnesota Statutes § 16B.98, Subdivision 5, whichever is later. Reimbursements will only be made for expenditures made according to the terms of this grant agreement.
- 1.2 *Expiration date:* August 14, 2020. The Grantee shall submit a final billing invoice within 30 days of the expiration of the grant as specified herein.
- 1.3 Survival of Terms. The following clauses survive the expiration or cancellation of this grant agreement: 8. Liability; 9. State Audits; 10. Government Data Practices and Intellectual Property; 12. Publicity and Endorsement; 13. Governing Law, Jurisdiction, and Venue; and 15. Data Disclosure.

2 Grantee's Duties

The Grantee, who is not a state employee, will be reimbursed, as specified in Exhibit A, for the purchase of the items noted there. The Grantee will submit to the State the required documents noted in Exhibit A. The State will make available supplementary funding in the amount noted in this agreement to cover the cost of the specific items for recreational boating safety noted in Exhibit "A." See Exhibit "A" which is attached and incorporated into this agreement for life jacket wear policy requirement and allowable expenditures specific to this grant. See Exhibit "B" for specific federal requirements that affect this grant. The Grantee is responsible for maintaining an adequate conflict of interest policy throughout the term of this grant contract. The Grantee shall monitor and report any actual, potential or perceived conflicts of interest to the State's Authorized Representative.

Reporting Requirements: The Grantee is bound to financial and performance requirements as noted in this grant agreement and Exhibit A which is attached and incorporated into this grant agreement.

3 Time

The Grantee must comply with all the time requirements described in this grant agreement. In the performance of this grant agreement, time is of the essence.

4 Consideration and Payment

- 4.1 Consideration. The State will pay for all services performed by the Grantee under this grant agreement as follows:
 - (a) **Compensation.** The Grantee will be paid for all boat and water safety activities performed by the Grantee during the term of the grant up to Thirty-three thousand two hundred thirty-nine dollars (\$33,239).
 - (b) **Total Obligation.** The total obligation of the State for all compensation and reimbursements to the Grantee under this grant agreement will not exceed Thirty-three thousand two hundred thirty-nine dollars (\$33,239).

4.2 Payment

- (a) Invoices. The State will promptly pay the Grantee after the Grantee presents an itemized invoice for the services actually performed and the State's Authorized Representative accepts the invoiced services. Invoices shall be submitted in a form prescribed by the State within the dates previously noted in "Term of Grant Agreement" in this contract. Invoice procedures are specified in Exhibit "A".
- (b) Federal funds. Payments under this grant agreement will be made from federal funds obtained by the State through the U.S. Coast Guard, Department of Homeland Security through the Recreational Boating Safety Financial Assistance program to states, commonwealth and territories (CFDA number 97.012) in U.S.C. 13101-13110. Exhibit "B" is attached and incorporated into this grant agreement. The Grantee is responsible for compliance with all federal requirements imposed on these funds and accepts full financial responsibility for any requirements imposed by the Grantee's failure to comply with federal requirements.

- 4.3 Contracting and Bidding Requirements per Minn. Stat. §471.345, grantees that are municipalities as defined in Subd. 1 just do the following if contracting funds from this grant contract agreement for any supplies, materials, equipment or the rental thereof, or the construction, alteration, repair or maintenance of real or personal property:
 - (a) If the amount of the contract is estimated to exceed \$100,000, a formal notice and bidding process must be conducted which sealed bids shall be solicited by public notice. Municipalities may, as a best value alternative, award a contract for construction, alteration, repair, or maintenance work to the vendor or contractor offering the best value under a request for proposals as described in Minn. Stat.§16C.28, Subd. 1, paragraph (a), clause (2).
 - (b) If the amount of the contract is estimated to exceed \$25,000 but not \$100,000, the contract may be made either upon sealed bids or by direct negotiation, by obtaining two or more quotations for the purchase or sale when possible, and without advertising for bids or otherwise complying with the requirements of competitive bidding. All quotations obtained shall be kept on file for a period of at least one year after receipt thereof. Municipalities may, as a best value alternative, award a contract for construction, alteration, repair, or maintenance work to the vendor or contractor offering the best value under a request for proposals as described in Minn. Stat.§16C.28, Subd. 1, paragraph (a), clause (2) and paragraph (c).
 - (c) If the amount of the contract is estimated to be \$25,000 or less, the contract may be made either upon quotation or in the open market, in the discretion of the governing body. If the contract is made upon quotation it shall be based, so far as practicable, on at least two quotations which shall be kept on file for a period of at least one year after their receipt. Alternatively, municipalities may award a contract for construction, alteration, repair, or maintenance work to the vendor or contractor offering the best value under a request for proposals as described in Minn. Stat.§16C.28, Subd. 1, paragraph (a), clause (2).
 - (d) Support documentation of the bidding process utilized to contract services must be included in the grantee's financial records, including support documentation justifying a single/sole source bid, if applicable.
 - (e) For projects that include construction work of \$25,000 or more, prevailing wage rules apply per; Minn. Stat. §§177.41 through 177.44 consequently, the bid request must state the project is subject to prevailing wage. These rules require that the wages of laborers and workers should be comparable to wages paid for similar work in the community as a whole. A prevailing wage form should accompany these bid submittals.

5 Conditions of Payment

All services provided by the Grantee under this grant contract must be performed to the State's satisfaction, as determined at the sole discretion of the State's Authorized Representative and in accordance with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, ordinances, rules, and regulations. The Grantee will not receive payment for work found by the State to be unsatisfactory or performed in violation of federal, state, or local law.

6 Authorized Representative

The State's Authorized Representative is Rodmen Smith, Director, Enforcement Division — Central Office, Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR), 500 Lafayette Rd., St. Paul, MN 55155-4047, (651) 259-5361, rodmen.smith@state.mn.us or his/her successor, and has the responsibility to monitor the Grantee's performance and the authority to accept the services provided under this grant agreement. If the services are satisfactory, the State's Authorized Representative will certify acceptance on each invoice submitted for payment.

The Grantee's Authorized Representative is Sheriff Marty Kelly, Goodhue County Sheriff's Office, 430 W Sixth Street, Red Wing, MN 55066 or his/her successor. If the Grantee's Authorized Representative changes at any time during this grant agreement, the Grantee must immediately notify the State.

7 Assignment, Amendments, Waiver, and Grant Agreement Complete

- 7.1 Assignment. The Grantee shall neither assign nor transfer any rights or obligations under this grant agreement without the prior written consent of the State, approved by the same parties who executed and approved this grant agreement, or their successors in office.
- 7.2 Amendments. Any amendments to this grant agreement must be in writing and will not be effective until it has been executed and approved by the same parties who executed and approved the original grant agreement, or their successors in office.
- 7.3 *Waiver*. If the State fails to enforce any provision of this grant agreement, that failure does not waive the provision or the State's right to enforce it.
- 7.4 *Grant Agreement Complete.* This grant agreement, including Exhibits "A" and "B," contains all negotiations and agreements between the State and the Grantee. No other understanding regarding this grant agreement, whether written or oral, may be used to bind either party.

8 Liability

The Grantee must indemnify, save, and hold the State, its agents, and employees harmless from any claims or causes of action, including attorney's fees incurred by the State, arising from the performance of this grant agreement by the Grantee or the Grantee's agents or employees. This clause will not be construed to bar any legal remedies the Grantee may have for the State's failure to fulfill its obligations under this grant agreement.

9 Audits (State and Single)

Under Minn. Stat. §16B.98, subd. 8 and 2 CFR 200.331, the Grantee books, records, documents, and accounting procedures and practices relevant to this grant agreement are subject to examination by the State and/or the State Auditor or Legislative Auditor, as appropriate, for a minimum of six years from the end of this grant agreement.

All state and local governments, colleges and universities, and non-profit organizations that expend \$750,000 or more of Federal awards in a fiscal year must have a single audit according to the OMB Uniform Guidance: Cost Principles, Audit, and Administrative Awards Requirements for Federal Awards. This is \$750,000 total Federal awards received from all sources. If an audit is completed, forward a copy of the report to both the State's Authorized Representative and the State Auditor.

10 Government Data Practices and Intellectual Property

10.1 Government Data Practices. The Grantee and State must comply with the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act, Minnesota Statute § 13, as it applies to all data provided by the State under this grant agreement, and as it applies to all data created, collected, received, stored, used, maintained, or disseminated by the Grantee under this grant agreement. The civil remedies of Minnesota Statute § 13.08 apply to the release of the data referred to in this clause by either the Grantee or the State.

If the Grantee receives a request to release the data referred to in this Clause, the Grantee must immediately notify the State. The State will give the Grantee instructions concerning the release of the data to the requesting party before the data is released. The Grantee's response to the request shall comply with applicable law.

11 Workers' Compensation

The Grantee certifies that it is in compliance with Minnesota Statute § 176.181, Subdivision 2, pertaining to workers' compensation insurance coverage. The Grantee's employees and agents will not be considered State employees. Any claims that may arise under the Minnesota Workers' Compensation Act on behalf of these employees and any claims made by any third party as a consequence of any act or omission on the part of these employees are in no way the State's obligation or responsibility.

12 Publicity and Endorsement

- 12.1 **Publicity**. Any publicity regarding the subject matter of this grant agreement must identify the State as the sponsoring agency and must not be released without prior written approval from the State's Authorized Representative. For purposes of this provision, publicity includes notices, informational pamphlets, press releases, research, reports, signs, and similar public notices prepared by or for the Grantee individually or jointly with others, or any subcontractors with respect to the program, publications, or services provided resulting from this grant agreement.
- 12.2 *Endorsement*. The Grantee must not claim that the State endorses its products or services.

13 Governing Law, Jurisdiction, and Venue

Minnesota law, without regard to its choice-of-law provisions, governs this grant agreement. Venue for all legal proceedings out of this grant agreement, or its breach, must be in the appropriate state or federal court with competent jurisdiction in Ramsey County, Minnesota.

14 Termination

- 14.1 *Termination by the State.* The State may immediately terminate this grant agreement with or without cause, upon 30 days' written notice to the Grantee. Upon termination, the Grantee will be entitled to payment, determined on a pro rata basis, for services satisfactorily performed.
- 14.2 *Termination for Cause.* The State may immediately terminate this grant contract if the State finds that there has been a failure to comply with the provisions of this grant contract, that reasonable progress has not been made or that the purposes for which the funds were granted have not been or will not be fulfilled. The State may take action to protect the interests of the State of Minnesota, including the refusal to disburse additional funds and requiring the return of all or part of the funds already disbursed.
- 14.3 Termination for Insufficient Funding. The State may immediately terminate this grant contract if:
 - (a) It does not obtain funding from the Minnesota Legislature
 - (b) Or, if funding cannot be continued at a level sufficient to allow for the payment of the services covered here. Termination must be by written or fax notice to the Grantee. The State is not obligated to pay for any services that are provided after notice and effective date of termination. However, the Grantee will be entitled to payment, determined on a pro rata basis, for services satisfactorily performed to the extent that funds are available. The State will not be assessed any penalty if the contract is terminated because of the decision of the Minnesota Legislature, or other funding source, not to appropriate funds. The State must provide the Grantee notice of the lack of funding within a reasonable time of the State's receiving that notice.

15 Data Disclosure

Under Minnesota Statute § 270C.65, Subdivision 3, and other applicable law, the Grantee consents to disclosure of its social security number, federal employer tax identification number, and/or Minnesota tax identification number, already provided to the State, to federal and state tax agencies and state personnel involved in the payment of state obligations. These identification numbers may be used in the enforcement of federal and state tax laws which could result in action requiring the Grantee to file state tax returns and pay delinquent state tax liabilities, if any.

16 American Disabilities Act

The Grantee must comply with the 2010 American Disabilities Act Standards for Accessible Design.

17 Invasive Species Prevention

WORK SITES WITH KNOWN AQUATIC INVASIVE SPECIES INFESTATIONS

Grantees and subcontractors must follow Minnesota DNR's Operational Order 113, which requires preventing or limiting the introduction, establishment and spread of invasive species during activities on public waters and DNR-administered lands. This applies to all activities performed on all lands under this grant agreement and is not limited to lands under DNR control or public waters. Operational Order 113 is incorporated into this grant agreement by reference and may be found at http://files.dnr.state.mn.us/assistance/grants/habitat/heritage/oporder_113.pdf. Duties are listed in Op Order 113 under Sections II and III (p. 5-8).

The grantee shall be responsible for becoming familiar with the location of any known infestations of aquatic pests. The DNR Infested Waters list is found at https://www.dnr.state.mn.us/invasives/ais/infested.html. The grantee shall prevent invasive species from entering into or spreading within a project site by cleaning equipment and clothing prior to arriving at the project site.

The grantee shall ensure that all equipment and clothing used for work in infested waters has been adequately decontaminated for (ex. zebra mussels) invasive species prior to being used in non-infested waters. All equipment and clothing including but not limited to waders, tracked vehicles, barges, boats, turbidity curtain, sheet pile, and pumps that comes in contact with any infested waters must be thoroughly decontaminated. The grantee shall use the following inspection and removal procedures for decontamination prior to entering and when leaving the water body:

- (a) Prior to leaving the waterbody, drain all water from equipment, boats, trailers, bilges, live wells, coolers, bait buckets, engine compartments and any other areas where water may be trapped or contained. Immediately after leaving the water body, drain water from transom wells onto dry land.
- (b) Inspect boat hulls, propellers, trailers and other surfaces, scrape off any attached mussels, remove any aquatic plant material (fragments, stems, leaves, or roots) and dispose of removed mussels and plants in a garbage can prior to transporting any equipment on public roads.
- (c) Flush boats (inside and outside) and all other equipment with hot water of 105 110 degrees F for a period of 30 minutes or 140 degrees F for a period of 5 minutes; or, instead of flushing equipment, leave the equipment in a location so that it dries completely for a minimum of at least 5 consecutive full days. A car wash can be used for cleaning.
- (d) If equipment or clothing arrives at the project site with soil, aggregate material, mulch, vegetation (including seeds) or animals, it shall be cleaned by grantee furnished tool or equipment (brush/broom, compressed air or pressure washer) at the staging area. The grantee shall dispose of material cleaned from equipment and clothing at a location determined by the DNR Grant Administrator or their representative. If the material cannot be disposed of onsite, secure material prior to transport (sealed container, covered truck, or wrap with tarp) and legally dispose of offsite.
- (e) Before reuse, aquatic equipment used in invertebrate infested waters shall be dried, rinsed with hot water or power washed to remove invertebrates. Aquatic equipment used in pathogen infested water(s) shall be disinfected, according to Appendix A, immediately after exiting water.

18 Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension, Ineligibility and Voluntary Exclusion - Lower Tier Covered Transactions

- 18.1 The prospective lower tier participant certifies, by submission of this agreement, that neither it nor its principals is presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this transaction by any Federal department or agency.
- 18.2 Where the prospective lower tier participant is unable to certify to any of the statements in this certification, such prospective participant shall attach an explanation to this agreement.

19 Whistleblower Protection Rights

- 1. The purpose of this grant is to provide supplementary funding to the Grantee, not exceeding the amount specified in Clause 4 of the Grant Agreement, to purchase the following specific equipment or other items that will be used for recreational boating safety activities:

 - a. An invoice from the Grantee, dated no earlier than March 2, 2020 or date grant is fully executed and not later than August 14, 2020, with a description of all the item(s) being requested for reimbursement. The purchase/invoice deadline may be modified if an extension, as noted in clause #2 above, is granted and approved by the State's representative.
 - b. A copy of the invoice(s) from the vendor(s) showing the amount the Grantee actually paid, including shipping, sales tax and any setup costs.
 - c. If the item is valued over \$5,000, the Grantee's asset number(s) & equipment serial number(s) must also be included on the invoice.

Solid Waste Designation Public Input Hearing

Why are we having another Public Hearing

- A hearing is required before a County can begin the process of considering a Solid Waste Designation Ordinance.
- MS requires that Notice of this Public Hearing must be in a paper in general circulation in the County for two consecutive weeks.
- Do to a clerical issue setting up the notices for the Public Hearing in January 2019, clerical error resulted in only one advertisement, not two.

Regulatory Requirements

- MPCA prioritizes how waste is handled in the State
 - Solid Waste Hierarchy: Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, Compost, Waste to Energy, Landfill
- MPCA requires all counties to have a Solid Waste Plan that supports the State's Hierarchy.
 - Waste to Energy ranks higher than landfill (lowest option)
- MPCA and County have discussed and negotiated the 'level of support' for Red Wing's Solid Waste Campus for over a decade.

Legislative Change to Landfill Cleanup Program

- MS 115B.39, Subd 2,
- (o) "Qualified facility" means a mixed municipal solid waste disposal facility as described in the most recent agency permit, including adjacent property used for solid waste disposal that did not occur under a permit from the agency, that:
- (2) is or was permitted by the agency and
- (ii) stopped accepting waste by January 1, 2019, and is located in a county that meets all applicable recycling goals in section 115A.551 and that has arranged for all mixed municipal solid waste generated in the county to be delivered to and processed by a resource recovery facility located in the county for at least 20 years; or

Environmental Considerations

- The Bench St. landfill is unlined.
 - There has been some leaching of chemicals over the years.
- Processing solid waste into Refuse Derived Fuel (RDF) used in Waste-To-Energy facilities is higher on the State's Solid Waste hierarchy.
 - Considered better for the environment than landfilling.
 - Beneficial use of solid waste to generate electricity compared to occupying space in a landfill.
 - Reduces future cleanup liability by preventing additional landfilling of solid waste.

Financial Considerations

- Annual cost to the County for monitoring and maintaining the landfill \$65,000
 - Expected to increase in the near future
- Bench St. landfill clean-up could exceed \$10,000,000
 - The County will be responsible for all costs if it is not in the State's Closed Landfill Program. These costs are transferred to the State if the landfill is included in the Closed Landfill Program.

Financial Considerations

- All haulers would be required to deliver the solid waste to Red Wing's Solid Waste Campus.
- Haulers may increase their customers' pickup rates.
- Over the last year, only one City in the County solicited a new garbage collection contract. The monthly rate per residence dropped instead of increasing.
- Currently a majority of the reported solid waste collected in the County is already sent to Red Wing's Solid Waste Campus.

Financial Considerations

- County Board needs to weigh the increased costs of solid waste disposal due to designation against:
 - the increased costs of monitoring the Bench Street landfill,
 - Bench Street landfill clean up, and
 - the continued clean up liability if County solid waste continues to be landfilled.

Impact to Haulers

- All haulers operating today can continue to be licensed and operate once Designation is in place.
- All solid waste collected in the County must be delivered to Red Wing's Solid Waste Campus.
- All solid waste will be charged the same rate of \$118/ Ton,
 - or those haulers who enter into an agreement with the City and County will receive the rate of \$108/Ton.

County Board's Designation Decision

- Consider Regulatory issues of meeting MPCA expectations in support of the State's solid waste management hierarchy.
- Consider the environmental impacts.
- Consider the financial impacts.
- Consider the impacts on the haulers and their customers.

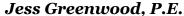

Summary

It is requested that the County Board review bid results for concrete paving CSAH 21.

Background

Bids for the concrete paving of approximately 4.4 miles of CSAH 21 from Eagle Ridge Drive to TH 61 were opened Tuesday, February 11, 2020. Two bids were received. One of the bids did not contain a valid bid bond and could not be read due to that fact. The remaining bid result amount was significantly more than the engineer's estimate. To preserve the integrity of the bidding process, the engineer's estimate has not been included in this Board report.

In communicating with industry experts and concrete contractors, staff has been informed that rebidding this project immediately should still work for the 2020 construction season as several potential bidders are still looking for work.

Another option would be to defer re-bidding the work until late in 2020 and schedule the project for the 2021 construction season. Currently, cement prices are in the process of increasing and may continue into the foreseeable future. Including this project in the 2021 construction program will require managing two concrete paving projects and hiring a consultant for inspection services.

Alternatives

- ➤ Award the contract to the lowest responsible bidder.
- ➤ Reject the bid and re-bid immediately.
- > Reject the bid and re-bid at a future date.

Recommendations

It is the recommendation of staff to reject the bid from Shafer Contracting Co., Inc and re-bid the project immediately.

SUBJECT: 2019 Investment Program Report and Outlook

Although the CD and bond market has dipped since January (3.5%-1.85%), the Goodhue County Investment Program has continued to improve its Fixed Income Investment Yield from 2.182% to 2.345% through active investing. Staff continued to find better rates through our local banks than elsewhere nationwide and locked in on those opportunities as our lower rate CDs matured. Highlights for 2019 are that we have laddered our investments more evenly, our fixed investments through local banks has grown to 27%, we are now earning a higher interest rate in our checking account, and our investment earnings went over the million dollar mark for the first time in 11 years.

Investment Program Strategy Updates

Goodhue County Investment Program made some significant gains in 2019 as outlined:

- 1. We continue to strengthen our relationships with the local banks and have been sending out emails and meeting with them inquiring about CD rates. Through our continued effort, I've invested approximately \$4.5m of additional funds through our local banks in 2019 which has increased our local investment from \$3.5m to \$8.4m or from 11% to 27% of our fixed investment portfolio or 17% of our overall portfolio. In addition, we have \$1.7m invested with other banks in Minnesota, supporting other local economies and projects.
 - o In August we worked with First Farmers & Merchants Bank and lock in \$1,490,000 at 2.50% rate, which was higher than the national average.
 - In October, when rates continued to slide, we were able to work with some other banks in Minnesota to secure rates ranging from 2.20%-2.65%. Again, these rates became known through networking.
 - O Many of the callable CDs were called as rates dropped, which we had to reinvest in the latter half of 2019, which is why it's somewhat "dubious" to purchase those.
 - o In December, we were able to negotiate with Merchants Bank an extended term at 2% for a 37-month CD, which allowed us to lock in a good rate and ladder our investments.
- 2. Through our active involvement in the investment portfolio, the County was able to improve its portfolio's Fixed Income Investment Yield from 2.311% to 2.345% in the second half or from 2.182% to 2.345% through all of 2019.
- 3. Again, this hasn't happened since 2008 but the County's interest income for the second half of 2019 came in higher than expected at \$634,704 or \$1,060,643 for the year!. We were able to receive an interest earnings of \$331,466 through our active investment in the MAGIC fund.

- 4. Staff had a chance to review five local banking proposals for the Commercial Banking RFP that we let on May 7th. As you know, on August 8th the Board approved to stay with Wells Fargo as they are offering a competitive variable interest rate far above what we were previously receiving.
- 5. Attached you can find the Local Optional Sales Tax that Goodhue County has received in 2019 and how it has been invested in higher interest CDs that mature in two years. We were projecting to receive \$2m according to the Dept. of Rev. analysis but it appears that we received just over \$3m in 2019.

Goodhue's Current Positon

- 1. **Cash and Investments Balance:** The County has a combined cash and investments balance of just over \$50.18 million, with 37% being liquid in money markets and the remaining 63% being invested in CDs with various banks.
- 2. **Overall Weighted Average:** The overall weighted average for all cash and investments slid slightly over the past six months from 2.13% to **2.12%** due in part to our two money markets dropping by 70 basis points.
- 3. **Fixed Income Investment Total:** The overall investment amount of CDs and bonds is at \$31.42m.
- 4. **Fixed Income Weighted Average:** The investment weighted average of CDs and bonds has risen in 2019 from 2.182% to **2.345%**. Although rates have dropped significantly and have now tapered off around 1.85%, we are receiving higher rates through our local banks than other banks nationwide.
- 5. **Interest Earnings:** Because many of the new investments *were* at a higher yield that those maturing, interest earnings have risen considerably with earnings totaling **\$1,060,643** in 2019. Interest earning in 2018 were approximately \$666,593 and 2017 were \$328,320, which is a 223% increase from 2017.



Goodhue's Investment Program Goals

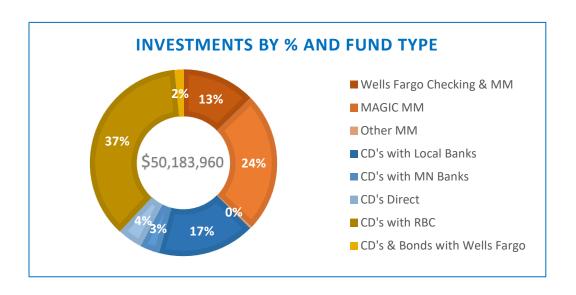
- 1. Continue to improve the Overall Weighted Average of 2.121% so it's always within 0.2% of MAGIC Fund 1.69%. This ensures that all our cash is earning interest, at a favorable market rate, where it hasn't in the past. Entering into an interest earning checking account will help us achieve this; however, the banks fees must calculated into this factor as well.
- 2. Continue to improve the Fixed Income Weighted Average of 2.345% so it's 0.3% higher than the MAGIC Fund rate of 1.69%. This ensures that we are entering the market and purchasing investments at the right time and essentially "beating the market."
- 3. Continue to take advantage of investment and market opportunities and increase our interest earnings.

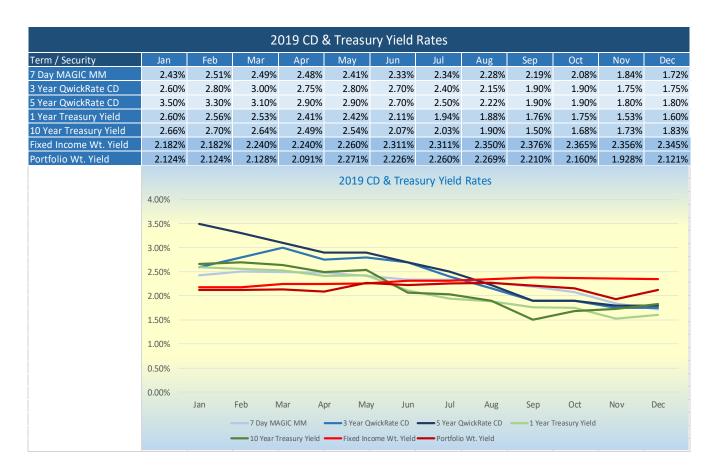
Market Trends and Outlook

This continues to be a bit of an unusual market as the two largest economies, U.S. and China, continue to thrive while many of the other industrialized nations have sank considerably over the past year. This past year there was continued talk about a recession as the trade war intensified, fears of inflation was on every investors mind, and the world economy was worsening, but many of those talking points have since lessened. The trade war has reached a tentative agreement to be signed in January, inflation hasn't risen as predicted by the low unemployment rate (the historic Phillips Curve), but the other developed countries continue to struggle. As U.S. Treasury cut its interest rates three times in 2019 from 2-2.25% - 1.5-1.75% and CD rates fell from 3.5%-1.85% while the Yield Curve inverted, the U.S. economy and stock continues chugging along.

In 2019 the NYSE had a 52 wk. low of 22,638 and a high of 28,744 for a modest gain of 27% while the NASDAQ had a gain of 40% with Apple and Microsoft leading the charge, and of course the S&P 500 increased from 2,443 to 3,250 for a 28% gain. Many investors are hopeful that the S&P 500 will maintain a decent multiple of 19, as it did in 2019, as the tech sector continues to lead the way.

Now that the yield curve is un-inverted and monetary policy is well positioned, the barrier to modifying interest rates is high. The Fed Chair Powell continues to reiterate that the U.S. economy remains sound, citing that economic activity has been rising at a moderate rate, and labor market conditions are strong. Additionally while manufacturing activity is showing signs of bottoming, it continues to remain in recessionary territory, and the U.S. consumer has been the predominant driver of economic growth. Continued wage gains from a red hot labor market will drive consumer spending for 2020, and don't foresee an economic recession in the near term. However, there is no lucrative place to turn for the fixed asset market as the bond market has bottomed out similar to the CD market.

The following table shows the various Treasury yields along with the various CD rates (MAGIC & QwickRate), which trend slightly above the Treasury. Goodhue County's Fixed Income Yield and Overall Portfolio Yield now out preform the rest of the market.

Background:

On May 13, 2019 the former Cannonball Truck Plaza went tax forfeiture and ultimately became the responsibility of Goodhue County to either use for a public purpose or sell and put back on the property tax rolls. Goodhue County has no use for the property; however, the Cannon Falls EDA has expressed interest in purchasing the property, cleaning it up, and selling it to a viable business or potential developer. The land transaction would have minimal risk to the County as the Cannon Falls EDA would pay for the tanks and building to be removed in accordance with the MPCA and then sell the property within five years.

Discussion:

On May 13, 2019 the former Cannonball Truck Plaza went tax forfeiture and ultimately became the responsibility of Goodhue County. As part of the forfeiture process that a county must follow, it can inquire if the residing municipality is interested in purchasing the property. If they are and it's for a public purpose, such as economic development, it can then purchase the property for less than the estimated market value which was reduced from \$352,600 to \$224,100 for pay 2020 (land value: \$212,200, building value: \$11,900).

However, staff had walked through the property last spring and concluded that the building needs to be razed, the fuel pumps need to be removed, and the remaining three underground fuel tanks also need to be removed. Regardless of who performs the work, the cost will ultimately be the same but if one want's to receive grants from the MPCA, they must go through the local municipality which requires a considerable amount of time and funds. Therefore, the Cannon Falls EDA has decided to purchase the property and work with the Economic Initiatives of Cannon Falls (EIC) in order to expedite the cleanup efforts and then sell the property to the suitable business or developer.

GOODHUE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

On November 12, 2019 the Land Committee met to discuss the project and concluded that this would be the best outcome for all local units of government and the economic development of the City of Cannon Falls. In addition, the Land Committee stated that due to the expected cost of the cleanup, the County should be willing to sell the property for one dollar (\$1.00) so long as the project gets competed in five years or the County can reclaim the property. Also, when the EDA sells the property, it gets to retain 90% of the net proceeds and Goodhue County can then retain 10% of the proceeds. It was also discussed that there shall be no property splits until the property has been cleaned up.

After much discussion with the Cannon Falls city administrator, an agreement has been reach. The salient terms of the sale of the Cannonball Agreement are as follows:

- a) Goodhue County will sell the property to the Cannon Falls EDA for One Dollar (\$1.00).
- b) The Agreement will run for Five Years at which time the County can either reclaim the property or extend the Agreement for another Two Years.
- c) The Cannon Falls EDA agrees to clean-up the property by removing the buildings, accessory structures and contaminated soils, remove the fuel pumps, and remove the three remaining fuel tanks.
- d) The Cannon Falls EDA agrees to pay for all clean-up costs of the property.
- e) Cannon Falls EDA agrees not to have the \$58,871.88 of special assessments reassessed on the property.
- f) If there are any proceeds from the sale of the Cannonball Property, the County shall receive 10% of the net proceeds. The Cannon Falls EDA and EIC shall receive 90% of the net proceeds.
- g) The Cannon Falls EDA shall not split any portion of the property until the entire site has been cleaned-up.
- h) The Cannon Falls EDA shall abide by the Easement Agreement dated April 12, 2002 by and between Amundson's and Aune's Cannonball, Inc. and System Capital Real Property Corporation, filed on April 25, 2002 with the Goodhue County Recorder as Document No. 466853 ("Easement Agreement"), unless and until a new easement is negotiated between the owners of the relevant parcels identified in the Easement Agreement.

Recommendation:

After much review by County staff and the County Attorney, staff recommends approval of the Contract for Purchase and Development Agreement between Goodhue County and the Cannon Falls EDA.

CONTRACT FOR PURCHASE AND DEVELOPMENT

AGREEMENT dated _______, 20___, by and between the CANNON FALLS ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY, a public body corporate and politic under the laws of the State of Minnesota ("EDA"), and GOODHUE COUNTY, a public body corporate and politic under the laws of the State of Minnesota ("County").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the County acquired real property through tax-forfeiture on May 13, 2019 which property is legally described in Exhibit A attached hereto ("Property");

WHEREAS, the County is authorized to sell tax-forfeited real property and determine the terms of such sale pursuant to Minn. Statutes 282.01;

WHEREAS, the EDA was created pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Sections 469.090-.108 and was authorized to transact business and exercise its powers by a resolution of the City Council of the City of Cannon Falls pursuant to Section 469.093 of the Act and has all the powers of an economic development authority under Minnesota law; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the EDA is authorized to undertake certain activities to acquire and prepare real property for development and redevelopment by private enterprise; and

WHEREAS, the EDA has proposed to acquire the Property from the County for removal of the existing building, petroleum tanks and contaminated soils and preparation of the Property for sale and future redevelopment by a private entity ("Project");

WHEREAS, the EDA and the Economic Initiatives of Cannon Falls, Inc. ("EIC") entered into the Cannonball Cleanup and Redevelopment Agreement dated December 11, 2019

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("Cannonball Agreement") to jointly share the anticipated costs up to \$300,000 for the environmental site assessment and remediation of environmental issues impacting the Property;

WHEREAS, the EDA believes that the Project and fulfillment generally of this Agreement is in the best interest of the EDA and the health, safety, morals and welfare of the residents of the City of Cannon Falls and in accord with the public purposes and provisions of the applicable state and local laws and requirements.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the mutual obligations of the parties hereto, each of them does hereby covenant and agree with the other as follows:

ARTICLE I. DEFINITIONS

In this Agreement, unless a different meaning clearly appears from the context:

"Act" means Minnesota Statutes, Sections 469.090-.108, as amended.

- "Agreement" [or "Contract"] means this Contract for Purchase and Development by and between the EDA and the County, as the same may be from time to time modified, amended or supplemented.
- "Articles and Sections" mentioned by number only are the respective Articles and Sections of this Agreement so numbered.
 - "City" means the City of Cannon Falls, Minnesota.
 - "County" means the County of Goodhue, Minnesota.
- "**Deed**" means the warranty deed described in Section 3.1 to be executed by the County conveying the Property to the EDA.
 - "EDA" means the Cannon Falls Economic Development Authority.
- "Event of Default" means an action by the EDA or County as provided in Article V of this Agreement.
 - "Parties" means the County and the EDA.
 - "Party" means either the County or the EDA.
- "Project" means the Property and the (i) removal of the existing building and petroleum tanks from the Property; (ii) removal of contaminated soils from the Property as delineated in the Monitoring Report Form (MPCA Guidance Document 4-08) report; and (iii) sale of the Property to a private entity for future development of the Property at a profit.
 - "Property" means the real property as legally described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto.

"Purchase Price" means the sum of One and No/100 Dollars (\$1.00) for the Property, which the EDA shall pay to the County for the purchase of the Property.

"State" means the State of Minnesota.

"Unavoidable Delays" means delays outside the control of the EDA which are the direct result of strikes, other labor troubles, fire, unusually severe or prolonged bad weather, Acts of God, litigation commenced by third parties which, by injunction or other similar judicial action, directly results in delays, or acts of any federal, state or local governmental unit which directly result in delays.

ARTICLE II. REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES

Section 2.1. Representations and Warranties by the County. The County represents and warrants that:

- (a) The County is a public body corporate and politic duly organized and existing under the laws of the State. Under the provisions of the laws of the State, the County has the power to enter into this Agreement and carry out its obligations hereunder.
- (b) The County makes no representation or warranty, either express or implied, as to the Property or its condition or soil conditions thereon, or that the Property is suitable for the EDA's needs except as specifically set forth in this Agreement.
- (c) Subject to satisfaction of the terms and conditions of this Agreement, the County will convey the Property to the EDA for development in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.
- (d) The County has received no notice of and has no knowledge of any pending or proposed special assessments affecting the Property or any proposed or pending public improvements which may give rise to any special or area assessments affecting the Property.
- (e) The County has received no notice of and has no knowledge that the Property or its use or uses are in violation of applicable law or any applicable private restriction.
- (f) The County has received no notice of and has no knowledge of any action, litigation, investigation or proceeding of any kind pending or threatened against the Property, and the County knows of no facts which could give rise to any such action, litigation, investigation or proceeding.
- (g) The County has no actual knowledge that a "well" (as defined in Minnesota Statutes Section 103I.005, subd. 21) is located on the Property.
- (h) The County has no actual knowledge of an "individual sewage treatment system" (as defined in Minnesota Statutes Section 115.55, subd. 1(g)) located on the Property.

- (i) The County has no actual knowledge of any leases, oral or written, affecting the Property nor any other right, title or interest in or to the Property granted to any third party.
- (j) The County certifies that, as of the date hereof, no methamphetamine production has occurred on the Property, pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 152.0275.
- (k) To the best of the County's knowledge, there has been no dumping or placement or burying of trash or construction debris in or on the Property.
- (l) The County will cooperate with the EDA with respect to any litigation commenced with respect to the Property or the Project.

All representations and warranties shall survive Closing.

Section 2.2. Representations and Warranties by the EDA. The EDA represents and warrants that:

- (a) The EDA is a public body corporate and politic duly organized and existing under the Act and the laws of the State. Under the provisions of the laws of the State, the EDA has the power to enter into this Agreement and carry out its obligations hereunder.
- (b) When the Property is conveyed to the EDA, the EDA will complete the Project upon the Property in accordance with the terms of this Agreement, and all local, state and federal laws and regulations (including, but not limited to, environmental, zoning, building code and public health laws and regulations).
- (c) The Project will be completed by the EDA, at its sole expense, in such manner, and at such expense as are necessary to make the Property usable for a future private development.
- (d) The EDA will complete the Project in accordance with all local, state or federal laws or regulations.
- (e) The EDA will cooperate with the County with respect to any litigation commenced with respect to the Property or the Project.
- (f) The EDA will abide by the Easement Agreement dated April 12, 2002 by and between Amundson's and Aune's Cannonball, Inc. and System Capital Real Property Corporation, filed on April 25, 2002 with the Goodhue County Recorder as Document No. 466853 ("Easement Agreement"), unless and until a new easement is negotiated between the owners of the relevant parcels identified in the Easement Agreement.

All representations and warranties shall survive Closing.

ARTICLE III.

CONVEYANCE OF PROPERTY

- **Section 3.1. Status of Property.** Subject to the satisfaction of the terms and conditions of this Agreement, the County agrees to sell the Property to the EDA and the EDA agrees to purchase the Property from the County in "as-is" condition through the execution and delivery of a warranty deed containing a right of reversion as provided under Section 5.3 of this Agreement and conveying marketable title to the Property, subject to:
 - (a) building and zoning laws, ordinances, state and federal regulations; and
 - (b) reservations of minerals or mineral rights to the State of Minnesota.

Section 3.2. Conditions to Conveyance of Property.

- (a) The County's obligation to convey the Property shall be subject to the satisfaction of, or waiver in writing by the County of, all of the following conditions precedent:
 - (i) The EDA not being in default under the terms of this Agreement.
- (b) The EDA shall be obligated to accept title to the Property subject to satisfaction, or waiver in writing by the County, of the following conditions precedent:
 - (i) The County not being in default under the terms of this Agreement;
 - (ii) The EDA's satisfaction with the results of any inspection of the Property conducted pursuant to Section 3.6; and
 - (iii) The EDA's satisfaction with the review of all documents and environmental reports provided by the County in accordance with Section 3.7.

If the contingencies have not been satisfied or waived by the parties on or before the Closing Date, or any of the respective reports or tests permitted by Sections 3.6 and 3.7 of this Agreement disclose a condition or conditions of the Property which are unsatisfactory to the EDA, in EDA's sole discretion, then the respective party may elect to terminate this Agreement by written notice delivered to the other party not later than expiration of such applicable dates. Upon such termination, neither party will have any further rights or obligations regarding this Agreement or the Property. If either party fails to terminate prior to expiration of such applicable contingency dates, then the contingencies pertaining to each such respective contingency shall be deemed waived by the party entitled to assert the contingency and the parties shall perform under this Agreement. If this Agreement is terminated as permitted under the terms of this Section, then upon request by County, the County and EDA agree to sign a cancellation of this Agreement or the EDA shall deliver a Quit Claim Deed to the Property to County. The EDA agrees to diligently proceed to satisfy the conditions of this Section.

Section 3.3. Purchase Price. The Purchase Price for the Property shall be payable by EDA to the County at Closing.

Section 3.4. Closing.

- (a) The Closing shall occur on or before June 30, 2020, provided all conditions precedent for the EDA and the County to close have either been met or waived, unless otherwise extended by the written agreement of the parties. This closing shall be at a location mutually agreed upon by the parties.
- (b) The EDA shall take possession of the Property upon execution and delivery of the Deed by the County at Closing.
- (c) The Deed shall be in recordable form and shall be promptly recorded along with this Agreement.
- (d) At Closing, the EDA shall pay:
 - (i) the cost of the ALTA Owner's title insurance policy, including the cost of any endorsements or extended coverage provisions, if any;
 - (ii) one-half of the closing fees charged by the Title Company;
 - (iii) the cost for any environmental investigation, tests, or surveys elected to be completed by EDA, including consultants hired by the EDA;
 - (iv) all taxes payable in accordance with the terms of this Agreement; and
 - (v) recording fees for documents required to be recorded at Closing.
- (e) At Closing, the County shall pay:
 - (i) the cost for issuance of the title commitment, including any search and exam fee:
 - (ii) one-half of the closing fees charged by the Title Company;
 - (iii) recording fees for documents necessary to record the Deed;
 - (iv) state deed tax relating to the conveyance of the Property and conservation fees;
 - (v) legal fees associated with the preparation of this Agreement; and
 - (vi) all taxes and assessments payable in accordance with this Agreement.
- (f) All costs incidental to the Closing not otherwise specifically allocated under this Agreement shall be allocated in accordance with the custom and practice for similar transactions in Minnesota.

Section 3.5. Title. Within fifteen (15) days after the date of this Agreement, the County shall obtain a current commitment for the issuance of a ALTA Form B owner's policy of title insurance (the "Commitment") issued by Goodhue County Abstract ("Title Company") in the amount of \$224,100, accompanied by copies of all recorded documents affecting the Property and searches for real estate taxes, bankruptcies, judgments, liens and assessments. A mortgage, monetary lien or any other lien or encumbrance against the property shall be deemed to be a title objection.

The EDA shall have ten (10) days after receipt of the Commitment to make its objections to matters disclosed in the Title Commitment in writing to the County. Any exceptions disclosed in the Commitment and not timely object to by the EDA shall be deemed permitted encumbrances ("Permitted Encumbrances"). The County shall have the right, but not the obligation within thirty (30) days after it receives such objections to have the same removed or satisfied. If EDA's objections are not removed or satisfied by the County, then the EDA may, at its sole discretion and as its sole and exclusive remedy, either (a) terminate this Agreement by written notice to the County and the County and EDA shall each be released from any further obligations and liability under this Agreement, except for any provisions of this Agreement which are made to survive the termination of this Agreement, and shall execute a mutual cancellation agreement evidencing the termination of this Agreement, or (b) waive such objections by written notice to the County and proceed to closing with the understanding that such uncured objections shall be included as Permitted Encumbrances on the Deed at Closing; provided, however that if the EDA has not notified the County of its election to either waive such objections or terminate this Agreement within ten (10) days after expiration of the County's period to cure such objections, the EDA shall be deemed to have elected to waive such objections pursuant to clause (b) above.

Section 3.6. Physical Inspection. The EDA and its agents will have the right, from time to time prior to the Closing, to enter upon the Property to examine the same and the condition thereof and to conduct such surveys and to make such engineering and other inspections, tests and studies as the EDA determines to be reasonably necessary, all at the EDA's sole cost and expense. The EDA will conduct such examinations or surveys during normal business hours to the extent practicable. The EDA will conduct all examinations and surveys of the Property in a manner that will not harm or damage the Property so that it cannot be restored to its prior condition or cause any claim adverse to the County and will restore the Property, to the extent reasonably practical and satisfactory to the County, to its condition prior to any such examinations or surveys immediately after conducting the same. Subject to the limitations under Minn. Stat. ch. 466, the EDA will indemnify, defend, and hold the County harmless from and against any claims for injury or death to persons, damage to property or other losses, damages or claims, including, in each instance, reasonable attorneys' fees and litigation costs, arising out of any action of any person or firm entering the Property on the EDA's behalf as aforesaid, which indemnity will survive the Closing and any termination of this Agreement without the Closing having occurred. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the EDA will not be liable merely for the discovery of a preexisting condition at the Property.

Section 3.7. Documents and Materials. Within 5 business days after the Contract Date, the County shall deliver to the EDA copies of all documents, reports, studies, tests, drawings, surveys, agreements, contracts, and all other documentation relating to the Property in the County's possession or control or to which the County has knowledge or access (collectively, the "Property Documents"), including without limitation, any existing environmental reports and assessments, a copy of an existing survey covering the Property, and as built surveys and information on utilities serving the Property.

Section 3.8. Obligations at Closing. At or prior to the Closing Date:

(a) The County shall execute and deliver to the EDA the following:

- (i) <u>Deed.</u> A Deed in recordable form and reasonably satisfactory to EDA, which shall include the following well representations: "Seller certifies that the Seller does not know of any wells on the described Property."
- (ii) <u>Seller's Affidavit</u>. A standard form affidavit by the County indicating that on the date of Closing there are no outstanding, unsatisfied judgments, tax liens or bankruptcies against or involving the County or the Property; that there has been no skill, labor or material furnished to the Property for which payment has not been made or for which mechanic's liens could be filed; and that there are no other unrecorded interests in the Property.
- (iii) Non-Foreign Person Certification. A certification in form and content satisfactory to the parties hereto and their counsel, properly executed by the County, containing such information as shall be required by the Internal Revenue Code, and the regulations issued there under, in order to establish that the County is not a "foreign person" as defined in §1445(f)(3) of such Code and such regulations.
- (iv) <u>Storage Tanks</u>. If required, an affidavit with respect to storage tanks pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 116.48.
- (v) <u>Well Certificate</u>. If there is a well located on the Property, a well disclosure certificate in form and substance true to form for recording.
- (vi) Other Documents. All other documents reasonably determined by either party or the title insurance company to be necessary to transfer and provide title insurance for the Property.
- (b) The EDA shall execute and deliver at Closing:
 - (i) Purchase. The Purchase Price.
 - (ii) Other Documents. All other documents reasonably determined by either party or the title insurance company to be necessary to transfer and provide title insurance for the Property.

ARTICLE IV. PROJECT AND SALE REQUIREMENTS

Section 4.1. Project Requirements. The EDA agrees that it will complete the Project on the Property in accordance with terms of this Agreement.

Section. 4.2. EDA Sale of Property.

- (a) Upon the EDA's sale of the Property, or any portion thereof, to a third party, the EDA shall pay to the County 10% of any additional funds received for the sale or sales over and above all costs incurred by the EDA for the Project, including the costs incurred by the EIC pursuant to the Cannonball Agreement and the EDA costs associated with the sale of the Property. The EDA shall not split any portion of the Property until (i) the existing building and petroleum tanks have been removed from the Property; and (ii) contaminated soils have been removed from the Property
- (b) The EDA agrees that it will not seek City re-assessment of sewer and water charges that occurred prior to the tax forfeiture of the Property.
- **Section 4.3.** Completion of Project. Subject to Unavoidable Delays, the EDA shall complete the Project and sale of the Property in accordance with the terms of this Agreement, on or before June 30, 2025. If the EDA has completed the Project, except for the sale to a third party, the EDA may request an extension of this Agreement for up to 2 years, to complete the sale, which extension shall not be unreasonably denied by the County.
- **Section 4.4. Proceeds of Sale by County.** If the County exercises its right of reverter under Section 5.3 of this Agreement, the County agrees to reimburse the EDA for the EDA's costs incurred for the Project under the terms of this Agreement upon sale by the County of the Property or any portion thereof up to the amount of the proceeds from the sale of the Property or any portion thereof, excluding County costs incurred by the County related to the sale.

ARTICLE V. Events of Default

- **Section 5.1. Events of Default Defined.** The following shall be "Events of Default" under this Agreement and the term "Event of Default" shall mean, whenever it is used in this Agreement (unless the context otherwise provides), any one or more of the following events:
 - (a) Failure by the EDA to complete the Project or portions thereof, pursuant to the terms, conditions and limitations of this Agreement.
 - (b) If any warranty or representation by the EDA in this Agreement is untrue in any material respect.
 - (c) Failure by the County to observe or perform any covenant, condition, obligation or agreement on its part to be observed or performed hereunder.
 - (d) If any warranty or representation by the County in this Agreement is untrue in any material respect.
- **Section 5.2.** County's Remedies on Default. Whenever any material Event of Default by EDA referred to in Section 5.1 of this Agreement occurs, the County may take any one or more of the following actions and unless otherwise provided such actions may be taken only after providing thirty (30) days written notice to the EDA of the Event of Default and the Event of Default has not been cured within said thirty (30) days or, if the Event of Default is by its nature incurable within

thirty (30) days, the EDA does not provide assurances to the County reasonably satisfactory to the County that the Event of Default will be cured and will be cured as soon as reasonably possible:

- (a) Suspend its performance under the Agreement until it receives assurances from the EDA, deemed adequate by the County, that the EDA will cure its default and continue its performance under the Agreement; or
- (b) Terminate this Agreement.

Section 5.3. Revesting Title in the County Upon Happening of Event Subsequent to Conveyance to the EDA. In the event that, subsequent to the execution and delivery of the Deed:

- (a) the EDA fails to complete the Project in conformity with this Agreement, and such failure is not due to Unavoidable Delays;
- (b) the EDA fails to comply with any material covenants or requirements under this Agreement;

and such action shall not be cured within thirty (30) days after written notice to do so, then the County shall have the right to immediately re-enter and take possession of the Property and to terminate (and revest in the County) the estate conveyed by the Deed to the EDA, it being the intent of this provision, together with other provisions of the Agreement, that the conveyance of the Property to the EDA shall be made upon, and that the Deed shall contain a condition subsequent to the effect that in the event of any default on the part of the EDA and failure on the part of the EDA to remedy, end, or abrogate such default within the period and in the manner stated in such subdivisions, the County at its option may declare a termination in favor of the County of the title, and all of the rights and interests in and to the property conveyed to the EDA, and that such title and all rights and interests of the EDA, and any assigns or successors in interest to and in the Property. This provision shall not apply to any portion of the Property conveyed to a third party upon issuance of Certificate of Completion and Release for the relevant portion of the Property in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.

- **Section 5.4. No Remedy Exclusive to County.** No remedy herein conferred upon or reserved to the County is intended to be exclusive of any other available remedy or remedies, but each and every such remedy shall be cumulative and shall be in addition to every other remedy given under this Agreement or now or hereafter existing at law or in equity or by statute. No delay or omission to exercise any right or power accruing upon any default shall impair any such right or power or shall be construed to be a waiver thereof, but any such right and power may be exercised from time to time and as often as may be deemed expedient.
- **Section 5.5. EDA's Remedies on Default.** Whenever any Event of Default by County referred to in Section 5.1 of this Agreement occurs, the EDA may take any one or more of the following actions and unless otherwise provided such actions may be taken only after providing thirty (30) days written notice to the County of the Event of Default and the Event of Default has not been cured within said thirty (30) days or, if the Event of Default is by its nature incurable within thirty (30) days, the County does not provide assurances to the EDA reasonably satisfactory to the EDA that the Event of Default will be cured and will be cured as soon as reasonably possible:

- (a) Up to the Closing:
 - (i) suspend its performance under the Agreement until it receives assurances from the County, deemed adequate by the EDA, that the County will cure its default and continue its performance under the Agreement, and that EDA will receive an extension of any deadlines contained in this Agreement equal to the period of suspended performance; or
 - (ii) terminate this Agreement; or
- (b) Up to and after the Closing:
 - (i) Take whatever action, including legal, equitable or administrative action, which may appear necessary or desirable to the EDA to collect any damages arising under this Agreement or to enforce performance and observance of any obligation, agreement, or covenant of the County under this Agreement.

Section 5.6. No Remedy Exclusive to EDA. No remedy herein conferred upon or reserved to the EDA is intended to be exclusive of any other available remedy or remedies, but each and every such remedy shall be cumulative and shall be in addition to every other remedy given under this Agreement or now or hereafter existing at law or in equity or by statute. No delay or omission to exercise any right or power accruing upon any default shall impair any such right or power or shall be construed to be a waiver thereof, but any such right and power may be exercised from time to time and as often as may be deemed expedient.

ARTICLE VI.

ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS

Section 6.1. Certificate of Completion and Release. Promptly after substantial completion of the Project in accordance with those provisions of this Agreement and simultaneously with the EDA conveyance of any Property to a third party for development, the County will furnish the EDA with a certificate of completion and release substantially in the form shown at Exhibit "B" (the "Certificate of Completion") for the Property or relevant portion to be conveyed. Such certification by the County shall be a conclusive determination of satisfaction and termination of the agreements and covenants in this Agreement with respect to the obligations of the EDA, and its successors and assigns, to complete the Project, and shall operate to forever waive and release the County's interest in the Property or any portion of the Property to be conveyed, including the right of reverter.

If the County shall refuse or fail to provide any certification in accordance with the provisions of this Section 6.1, the County shall, upon demand, provide the EDA with a written statement, indicating in adequate detail in what respect the EDA has failed to complete the Project in accordance with the provision of this Agreement, or is otherwise in default, and what measures or acts will be necessary, in the opinion of the County, for the EDA to take or perform in order to obtain such certification. Upon the EDA's completion of the items so described by the County, the County shall deliver a fully executed Certificate of Completion to the EDA.

- **Section 6.2. Equal Employment Opportunity.** The County agrees that during the completion of the Project provided for in this Agreement it will comply with all applicable federal, state and local equal employment and nondiscrimination laws and regulations.
- **Section 6.3. Titles of Articles and Sections.** Any titles of the several parts, Articles and Sections of this Agreement are inserted for convenience of reference only and shall be disregarded in construing or interpreting any of its provisions.
- **Section 6.4. Notices and Demands.** Except as otherwise expressly provided in this Agreement, a notice, demand or other communication under the Agreement by either party to the other shall be sufficiently given or delivered if it is dispatched by registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested or delivered personally; and
 - (a) In the case of the EDA, is addressed or delivered personally to:

- (b) In the case of the County, is addressed or delivered personally to:
- (c) Either Party may, upon written notice to the other Party, change the address to which such notices and demands are made.
- **Section 6.5.** Covenants Running with the Land. The terms and provisions of this Agreement shall be deemed to be covenants running with the Property and shall be binding upon any successors or assigns of the EDA and any future owners or encumbrancers of the Property. The representations, warranties, indemnities and covenants contained in this Agreement shall survive the Closing Date and not be merged into the Closing Documents.
- **Section 6.6.** Counterparts. This Agreement is executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall constitute one and the same instrument.
- **Section 6.7. Law Governing.** This Agreement will be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of Minnesota.

Section 6.8. Facsimile Signature. The parties hereto acknowledge and agree that in order to expedite the signing of this Agreement and the processing, and review and compliance with the terms hereof, the parties may utilize facsimile equipment to transmit and convey signatures hereto and such other information as may be necessary. With respect to any such transmission bearing a signature for any party hereto and on which the receiver is or may be reasonably expected to rely, than if such a facsimile transmission is corroborated by regular facsimile printout showing the telephone number from which transmitted together with a date and time of transmission, it shall be binding on the sending party and may be relied upon by the party receiving the same. The sending party hereby acknowledges such reliance and weighs any defenses to the use of such documents or signatures.

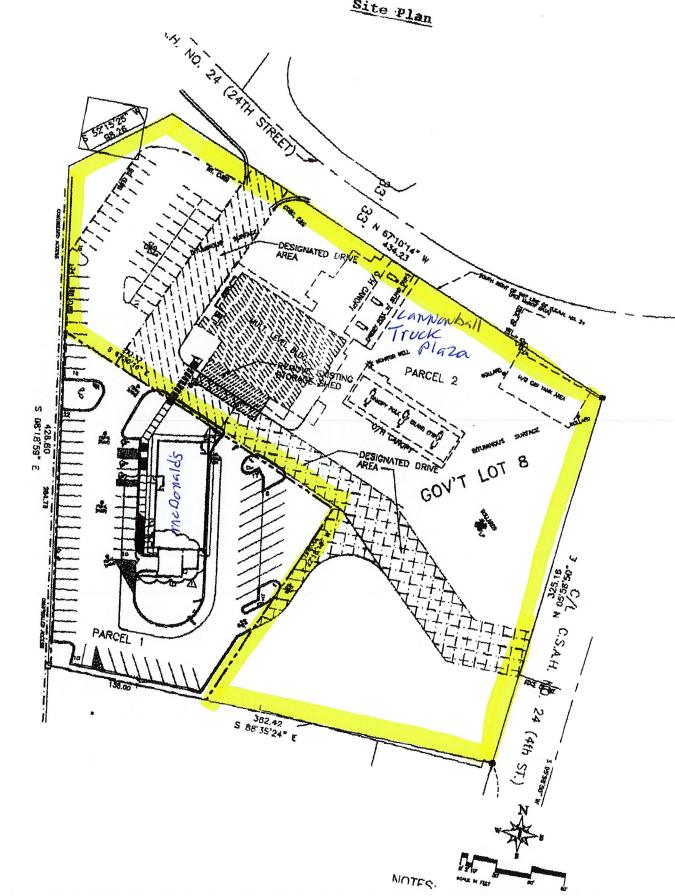

EASEMENT AGREEMENT

THIS EASEMENT AGREEMENT ("Agreement"), dated April 12, 2002, is between AMUNDSON'S AND AUNE'S CANNONBALL, INC., a Minnesota corporation ("Grantor") and SYSTEM CAPITAL REAL PROPERTY CORPORATION, a Delaware corporation ("Grantee"). The following statements are a material part of this Agreement:

- A. Grantee is, or will be at the time of recording of this document, the owner of Parcel 1 described in Exhibit A, attached.
- B. Grantor is the owner of Parcel 2 described in Exhibit B, attached.
- C. Grantor wishes to grant, and Grantee wishes to receive certain easements over, under and across Parcel 2.
- D. Grantee wishes to grant, and Grantor wishes to reserve certain easements over, under and across Parcel 1.

THEREFORE, in consideration of TEN AND NO/100THS DOLLARS (\$10.00) and other valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are acknowledged, the following grants, agreements, covenants and restrictions are made:

1. INGRESS AND EGRESS EASEMENT

Grantor grants and conveys to Grantee a perpetual, non-exclusive easement for vehicular and pedestrian ingress and egress to and from Parcel 1, appurtenant to Parcel 1, over, upon and across the designated drive areas and the exits and entrances as these areas exist presently on Parcel 2 as shown on Exhibit C, Site Plan, attached.

Grantor covenants and agrees to maintain in good condition and repair the driveways and accessways located on Parcel 2. If Grantor fails to meet its responsibilities, Grantee may maintain and repair the easement area and bill Grantor and all other users for its costs. If Grantee is not reimbursed within thirty (30) days from the date of billing for its costs, the parties failing to pay their share may, at the Grantee's discretion, have a lien for unpaid costs placed upon the title to their property by the Grantee recording a lien claim and notice.

2. SIGN EASEMENT

Grantee grants to Grantor a perpetual easement, exclusive to Grantor and appurtenant to Parcel 2, for the purpose of operating, maintaining, repairing, replacing and renewing the Grantor's existing high-rise interstate sign and related utilities over, above, along, under, in and across the portion of Parcel 1 where this sign and these related utilities are currently located on Parcel 1 as of the date of this Agreement. The location of the easement may, as to the utilities serving the sign, be modified by Grantee with the consent of Grantor, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld, provided there is no interruption of service to Grantor and provided Grantee is responsible for all related costs.

Grantor and Grantee agree that they want to convert Grantor's existing sign located on Parcel 1 for reuse by Grantor and Grantee as a shared sign in the same location on Parcel 1. Grantor shall be responsible to convert Grantor's existing sign to a shared sign. Grantor and Grantee agree that the costs to initially convert Grantor's existing sign base and sign pole located on Parcel 1 into a sign base and sign pole for a shared sign in the same location on Parcel 1 will be divided equally between Grantor and Grantee.

Grantor and Grantee agree that the costs of maintaining, repairing, replacing and renewing the sign base and sign pole for the shared sign located on Parcel 1 shall be divided equally between Grantor and Grantee; provided, however, that any costs incurred in installing, operating, maintaining, repairing, replacing and renewing any portion of the shared sign located on Parcel 1, the use of which is not shared by the Grantor and Grantee, shall be borne by the party using such portion.

3. DRAINAGE EASEMENT

Grantor grants to Grantee a perpetual, non-exclusive easement, appurtenant to Parcel 1, for the purpose of surface draining any and all surface water runoff from Parcel 1 and the improvements which may, from time to time, be constructed, altered, modified and maintained thereon, over, upon and across Parcel 2.

4. USE OF EASEMENT AREAS

Grantee will have the right of ingress and egress across Parcel 2 for any purpose granted and such ingress and egress will be exercised in a reasonable manner. Where Grantee's facilities have been installed, no trees, permanent buildings or other structures shall be placed in or allowed to encroach upon the easements, and no change of grade elevation or any excavation shall be performed without prior written approval of Grantee, which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld. However, the easement areas may be used for landscaping or other purposes that do not then or later interfere with the granted easement uses.

5. ADDITIONS TO DOMINANT TENEMENT

The easements shall also be appurtenant to any land that may hereafter come into common ownership with Parcel 1. An area physically separate from Parcel 1 but having access to it by means of public ways or private easements, rights or licenses is deemed to be contiguous to Parcel 1.

6. FUTURE SURVEY

At the request of Grantor, or Grantor's successors or assigns, including any mortgagee of Parcel 2, in order to render title to Parcel 2 marketable or insurable, Grantee will at Grantee's expense, cause Parcel 2 to be surveyed to legally describe the easements granted in this Agreement. If Grantor or Grantor's successors or assigns needs to retain legal counsel to enforce this provision of this Agreement, Grantee shall pay all reasonable attorneys' fees and expenses incurred in enforcing this provision.

7. WARRANTIES OF TITLE

Grantor warrants that Grantor has good and indefeasible fee simple title to the easement premises; that Grantor has the full right and lawful authority to grant these easements, that Grantor will defend and indemnify Grantee against all lawful claims, and that Grantee shall and may peaceably have, hold and enjoy the easements.

8. RUNNING OF BENEFITS

All provisions of this instrument, including the benefits and burdens, run with the land and are binding upon and inure to the benefit of the heirs, assigns, licensees, invitees, successors, tenants, employees and personal representatives of the parties.

9. DEFAULT

If there is a failure by either party to perform, fulfill or observe any agreement contained within this Agreement, to be performed, fulfilled or observed by it, continuing for thirty (30) days, or in situations involving potential danger to the health or safety of persons in, on or about or substantial deterioration of Parcel 1 or Parcel 2, in each case after written notice, the other party may, at its election, cure such failure or breach on behalf of the defaulting party. Any amount which the party so electing shall expend for such purpose, or which shall otherwise be due by either party to the other, shall be paid to the party to whom due on demand, without contest, upon delivery of its invoice, together with interest at the lower of (1) the rate of ten percent (10%) per annum, or (2) the maximum rate permissible from time to time under applicable law, from the date of the expenditure or the date when it shall have become due to the date of payment in full. The provisions of this paragraph shall be in all respects subject and subordinate to the lien of any mortgages or deeds of trust at any time or from time to time on the land of the defaulting party and the rights of the holder or holders of any mortgages or deeds of trust.

10. CONSTRUCTION

The rule of strict construction does not apply to this grant. This grant shall be given a reasonable construction so that the intention of the parties to convey a commercially usable right of enjoyment to Grantee is carried out.

RE: LiDAR Project

Update

At the November 5, 2019 County Board meeting, the Board approved Staff recommendation to accept the state agency funding for this project and agreed to have the vendor bill the County for the remaining costs over a two year period (ending January 2022). As stated in that report, we anticipate using the Riparian funds to cover the County portion of the Lidar costs.

We received a letter from USGS in December 2019 stating that our project is being recommended for funding.

At this point, we have established local partnerships with MnDot, NRCS, and MnGeo. We are continuing to reach out to others for financial partnerships. The current contributions from all of the partners, including USGS, amount to \$172,358.

According to the County Purchasing Policy, purchases over \$175,000 need to be approved by the County Board.

MnDot uses a pre-qualification process in order to be able to procure Professional and Technical services from consultants. This Lidar data collection is highly specialized, and has not been done at this scale before. AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

FOR

GEOSPATIAL SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT is made by and between Goodhue County, Minnesota, (OWNER) and Ayres Associates Inc, 5201 East Terrace Drive, Suite 200, Madison, Wisconsin, 53718 (CONSULTANT).

WHEREAS, the OWNER intends to retain the CONSULTANT to provide geospatial services within the project areas delineated in Attachment A.

NOW, THEREFORE, the OWNER and CONSULTANT agree to the performance of professional services by CONSULTANT and payment for those services by OWNER as set forth below:

ARTICLE 1 - SCOPE OF SERVICES

1.1 BASIC SERVICES

After written authorization to proceed, CONSULTANT shall:

- 1.1.1 Acquire aerial LiDAR (Light Detection And Ranging) in the Spring of 2020 for the project area shown on Attachment A. LiDAR will be acquired for the project area shown on Attachment A with the following specifications:
 - a) Aggregate nominal pulse density (ANPD) for the LiDAR acquisition will be ≥ 30 pulses per square meter.
 - b) LiDAR acquisition will be conducted when the ground is free of snow, and when the atmospheric conditions between the aircraft and the ground are free of clouds and fog.
 - c) LiDAR acquisition will be flown with a minimum of 60% overlap between swaths.
- 1.1.2 Calibrate the LiDAR point cloud to support the development of a bare earth surface model (DEM) to meet the following vertical accuracy requirements:
 - a) RMSEz (non-vegetated) ≤ 5 cm (Point Cloud and DEM)
 - b) NVA ≤ 9.8 cm at 95% confidence level (Point Cloud and DEM)
 - c) $VVA \le 14.7$ cm at 95th percentile level (DEM only)
- 1.1.3 Prepare LiDAR data and derivative products to conform to specifications defined in the USGS "National Geospatial Program LiDAR Base Specification Version 2.1". LiDAR data will meet the USGS definition of Quality Level 0 (QL0).
- 1.1.4 Compile hydro-flattened breaklines for ponded water that is 2 acres or greater and double lined streams with a minimum width of 30 meters. The streams will break at road crossings (culvert locations). The hydrographic features will be flattened as per the criteria outlined in "National Geospatial Program LiDAR Base Specification Version 2.1". The road fills will not be removed from the DEM, streams will not break at bridges, and

when the identification of a feature as a bridge or culvert cannot be made reliably, the feature will be regarded as a culvert. Permanent islands 1 acre or larger shall be delineated within all waterbodies. The hydro breaklines will be delivered in ESRI polylineZ feature class.

- 1.1.5 Compile bridge breaklines to enforce logical terrain surface below bridges. The bare earth surface below the bridge shall be a continuous interpolation of the terrain lateral to the bridge deck. Streams and water bodies that meet the criteria for hydro-flattening shall be monotonically continuous where bridge decks have been removed.
- 1.1.6 Process and classify the calibrated LiDAR data to support bare earth surface model generation. The point cloud format will be LAS v1.4 format. The calibrated LiDAR point cloud will be classified to the following base classification scheme:

Class 1: Processed, but unclassified

Class 2: Bare-earth ground

Class 7: Low Noise

Class 9: Water

Class 17: Bridge Decks

Class 18: High Noise

Class 20: Ignored ground (breakline proximity)

- 1.1.7 Generate a bare earth Digital Elevation Model (DEM) from classified bare earth points (Class 2) and breaklines. Water bodies and streams will be hydro-flattened within the DEM. The cell size will be 1.0 feet. The delivery format will be GeoTIFF tiles.
- 1.1.8 Prepare a Pilot Area consisting of nine contiguous tiles of classified point cloud (LAS) data, hydro breaklines, and Bare Earth DEM tiles, along with reporting of calibration control against the calibrated raw swath point cloud.
- 1.1.9 Tile the LiDAR deliverable products according to a 2,500-foot by 2,500-foot tile index across the project area. A tile schematic will be delivered in ESRI Shapefile format.
- 1.1.10 Prepare LiDAR deliverable products to full extent of the project area shown on Attachment A.
- 1.1.11 Reference the LiDAR deliverable products to Goodhue County Coordinates, NAD 83 (HARN), NAVD 88 (Geoid 12B), US Survey Feet.
- 1.1.12 Prepare a report on the assessed vertical accuracy of the bare earth surface (NVA and VVA) using the GPS survey data collected and provided by OWNER.
- 1.1.13 Calculate produced to meet horizontal accuracy and report the results in the metadata.
- 1.1.14 Prepare reports for the LiDAR acquisition and processing phases of the project. Reports will include:
 - a) Data Collection report with flight logs
 - b) Polygons representing individual swath boundaries
 - c) Survey report detailing the collection of ground control for calibration
 - d) Processing report detailing classification and breakline methodology, product generation, and QC procedures

- e) Vertical accuracy assessment of the point cloud and the DEM
- f) Boundaries of product extents
- 1.1.15 Prepare FGDC compliant metadata in .xml format
- 1.1.16 Deliver the final products on external a USB hard drive
- 1.1.17 Deliver the following products to OWNER:
 - a) Classified Point Cloud, LAS v1.4 format
 - b) Hydro flattening breaklines, ESRI shapefile, polylineZ format
 - c) Bare Earth DEM, GeoTIFF format
 - d) Pilot Area, LAS and DEM format tiles
 - e) Tile Schematic, ESRI shapefile format
 - f) LiDAR acquisition and processing reports, including:
 - 1) Data Collection report with flight logs
 - 2) Polygons representing individual swath boundaries
 - 3) Survey report with calibration control points
 - 4) Processing report for generation of products
 - 5) Vertical Accuracy Report (NVA and VVA)
 - 6) FGDC metadata, XML format
- 1.1.19 CONSULTANT may render to the OWNER advice, consultation, and expertise with respect to the development, use, and technical application of the deliverables provided under this project.

ARTICLE 2 - CHANGES IN THE SCOPE OF SERVICES

2.1 Services Requiring Changes in the Scope of Services

The OWNER or the CONSULTANT may, from time to time, request changes in the scope of services to be performed hereunder. Such changes, while not anticipated, may include an increase or decrease in the amount of CONSULTANT'S compensation. Any such changes must be mutually agreed by and between OWNER and CONSULTANT and shall be incorporated in written amendments to this agreement. Such changes may include:

- 2.1.1 Services to investigate existing conditions or facilities or to verify the accuracy of information furnished by OWNER.
- 2.1.2 Services resulting from significant changes in the general scope, extent or character of the Project.
- 2.1.3 Furnishing services of independent professional associates and consultants for other than Basic Services.
- 2.1.4 Preparing to serve or serving as a consultant or witness for OWNER in any litigation,

- arbitration or other legal or administrative proceeding involving the Project.
- 2.1.5 Additional services in connection with the Project, including services, which are to be furnished by OWNER and services not otherwise, provided for in this Agreement.

ARTICLE 3 - OWNER'S RESPONSIBILITIES

OWNER shall do the following in a timely manner so as not to delay the services of CONSULTANT:

- 3.1 Provide GPS survey of calibration points and vertical check points and associated survey documentation throughout the LiDAR project area. CONSULTANT shall provide OWNER with non-vegetated vertical accuracy (NVA) locations and vegetated vertical accuracy (VVA) locations to survey in Google Earth .kmz format. The NVA points will be collected in clear and open terrain (bare earth) and urban land cover. The VAA points will be collected in representative land cover types across the project area. OWNER shall provide field photos for each setup, including one photo in each cardinal direction, and field notes for each set up. The survey values shall be provided to CONSLUTANT in .csv format, Goodhue County coordinates, NAD83 (HARN), NAVD88 (Geoid 12B), US Survey Feet.
- 3.2 Place at CONSULTANT's disposal all reasonably available pertinent information, upon which the CONSULTANT can rely. This may include project boundaries in georeferenced vector format, existing digital terrain models, and existing ground control information.
- 3.3 Arrange for access to and make all provisions for CONSULTANT to enter upon public and private property as required for CONSULTANT to perform services under this Agreement.
- 3.4 Furnish approvals and permits from all governmental authorities having jurisdiction over the Project and such approvals and consents from others as may be necessary for completion of the Project.
- 3.5 Give prompt written notice to CONSULTANT whenever OWNER observes or otherwise becomes aware of any development that affects the scope or timing of CONSULTANT's services.

ARTICLE 4 - PERIODS OF SERVICE

- 4.1 The provisions of this Article 4 and the compensation for CONSULTANT's services have been agreed to in anticipation of the orderly and continuous progress of the Project. If completion dates are exceeded through no fault of CONSULTANT, compensation provided herein shall be subject to equitable adjustment.
- 4.2 The services called for in Article 1 will be completed and submitted by March 31, 2021. Specific tasks will be completed and delivered according to the following schedule:
 - a) LiDAR data collection: March-May 2020 (as weather and ground conditions permit)
 - b) Pilot LiDAR tiles: delivered six months after data collection is complete
 - c) Countywide LiDAR datasets: delivered ten months after data collection is complete

- d) The OWNER has 30 days after delivery of the countywide products to review the data and provide the CONSULTANT with written comments. The CONSULTANT shall make final delivery within 30 days of OWNER's review.
- 4.3 The expiration date of this Agreement is December 31, 2021.
- 4.4 CONSULTANT's services under this Agreement shall be considered complete when submissions have been accepted by the OWNER.
- 4.5 If OWNER has requested significant modifications or changes in the general scope, extent or character of the Project, as memorialized in a written change order executed by the Parties, the time of performance of CONSULTANT's services shall be adjusted equitably.
- 4.6 If CONSULTANT's services for the Project are delayed or suspended in whole or in part by OWNER for more than three months for reasons beyond CONSULTANT's control, CONSULTANT shall on written demand to OWNER (but without termination of this Agreement) be reimbursed for all charges and services rendered through the date of suspension, however such reimbursement shall not exceed the amount set forth in 5.1.1 and shall take into the consideration the costs and compensation to complete the Project.

ARTICLE 5 - PAYMENTS

5.1 Compensation for Services

- 5.1.1 OWNER shall compensate CONSULTANT on a lump sum basis for services included in Article 1 not to exceed the following amount:
 - 5.1.1.1 Total fees for LiDAR acquisition, ground control, and data processing: \$327,950.00

5.2 Times of Payments

5.2.1 CONSULTANT shall submit yearly invoices over 2020 and 2021 for Basic and Additional Services rendered. OWNER shall make prompt payments in response to CONSULTANT's invoices.

5.3 Other Provisions Concerning Payments

5.3.1 If OWNER fails to make any payment due CONSULTANT for services and expenses within sixty days after receipt of Consultant's invoice, the amounts due CONSULTANT will be subject to equitable adjustment but in no event shall it be increased by more than a rate of 1-1/2% per month (18% A.P.R.) from said sixtieth day, and in addition, CONSULTANT may, after giving seven days' written notice to OWNER, suspend services under this Agreement until CONSULTANT has been paid in full all amounts due for services and expenses. If for some reason there is a dispute concerning an invoice and the dispute extends beyond one month, the owner will not be assessed a 1.5% penalty to that invoice.

- 5.3.2 In the event of termination by OWNER for reasons other than CONSULTANT'S breach of this agreement, CONSULTANT will be reimbursed for all charges and services rendered, however, in no event shall such reimbursement exceed the compensation set forth in 5.1.1.
- 5.3.3 Records pertinent to CONSULTANT's compensation will be kept in accordance with generally accepted accounting practices.
- 5.3.4 Factors determining compensation payable to CONSULTANT will be adjusted periodically and equitably to reflect changes in various elements that comprise such factors. Any changes must be mutually agreed by and between the OWNER and the CONSULTANT and shall be incorporated in written amendments to this agreement.

ARTICLE 6 - GENERAL CONSIDERATIONS

6.1 Reuse of Documents

Any reuse of the services and documents provided under this agreement for purposes not intended, will be at the OWNER'S sole risk.

6.2 Controlling Law

This Agreement is to be governed by the law of the State of Minnesota.

6.3 Termination

The obligation to provide further services under this Agreement may be terminated by either party upon seven days' written notice in the event of substantial failure by either party to perform in accordance with the terms hereof through no fault of the terminating party.

6.4 Indemnification

The CONSULTANT hereby agrees to indemnify the OWNER for all claims arising solely from negligent acts, errors or omissions of the CONSULTANT in the performance of professional services under this agreement.

6.5 Data ownership Assignment

The CONSULTANT assigns ownership of the data to the OWNER and its project participants for all deliverable products produced under this contract. The CONSULTANT agrees that the deliverable products and documents shall not be made available to nor used to prepare additional products for any individual or organization at any time without prior written approval by the OWNER.

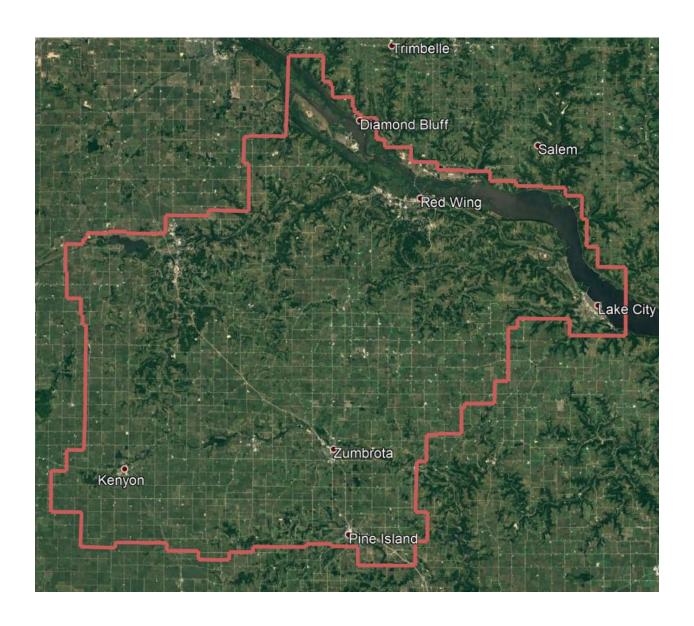

Re: Law Enforcement Center/Justice Center Elevator - Award Contract

The 2019 capital plan included the replacement of equipment and controls for two elevators in the Law Enforcement Center and for one elevator in the Justice Center. All three of these elevators were installed when the buildings were constructed over 20 years ago and are currently at the end of their service life and parts to repair are obsolete.

Goodhue County contracted with Lerch Bates to provide consulting services for all three elevators. They conducted a detailed survey to determine condition, remaining service life and potential for reuse.

Based on the survey report provided by Lerch Bates the following was determined and recommended:

- Modernization of the three (3) elevators surveyed, including controllers, pump units, selectors, fixtures and wiring.
- Alternates for the modernization should include upgrades to the cabs to provide more modern and durable materials, while including energy efficient lighting.
- Modernization of the elevator equipment will require small upgrades to existing building for code compliance within limitations of existing structure to ensure State of Minnesota acceptability of the new equipment.
- Estimated cost range for the above project for three elevators was approximately \$375,000 to \$450,000. (\$249,000 was budgeted in 2019 capital)

After a discussion with the Finance Director it was determined to put the project out to bid and get actual numbers. The project went out to bid in December 2019 with a mandatory pre-bid meeting held on January 8,

2020. Three bids were received on Thursday, February 6, 2020. Based on the numbers received it was the recommendation of the Finance Department to utilize capital plan fund balance to fund the shortfall.

Attached is the summary of the three bids that were received on Thursday, February 6th, 2020 along with the recommendation from Lerch Bates.

With a 12 week lead time on equipment and 10 weeks of planned installation, we are hopeful that this project will be completed by the end of August 2020.

Staff recommends the board approve the attached recommendation of Lerch Bates, to award the contract to the lowest bidder, Schumacher Elevator, \$347,138, to include the base bid and alternate \$#1\$ – cab interior, and to cover the shortfall for the project using capital plan fund balance.
