Summary

It is requested that the County Board approve the attached resolutions stating that Goodhue County is willing to serve as the sponsor for township projects utilizing Local Road Improvement Project (LRIP) funds.

Background

There was an article in a newsletter from the Minnesota Association of Townships (MAT) stating that townships can apply for funding through MnDOT's LRIP. Nine townships have called Public Works seeking additional information concerning this program.

Background: The LRIP has three categories that local agencies can apply for funding: Trunk Highway Corridor Account, Routes of Regional Significance, and the Rural Road Safety Account.

Townships are eligible to apply for projects under the LRIP's Routes of Regional Significance category. The LRIP funding is available for the cost to construct, reconstruct or reconditioning a roadway meeting the following criteria of Regional Significance:

- classified as a minor collector or higher,
- identified in a regional plan as a farm-market artery,
- part of a 10-ton system,
- part of an economic development plan,
- serves as a regional tourist destination,
- provides capacity or congestion relief to a parallel trunk highway or county road, or,
- is a connection to the regional system, trunk highway, or a county road.

Responsibility of the Townships: The townships are responsible to complete and submit the application for their project by 03 Mar 21. If their project is selected, they will need to cover all engineering costs (design, construction management, and inspection, etc.), purchase any needed right of way, and cover any project costs not covered in the grant.

County Sponsor: All township projects will need the County to be the project sponsor. As with a township bridge project, the County will need to be the fiscal agent for MnDOT on behalf of the township, coordinate project delivery with MnDOT, ensure the construction documents meet State Standards, submit the documents for State approval, advertise, award, let and ensure the construction project is adequately supervised and inspected, close out the project with the State, and other project related tasks.

The following requests for County sponsorship were received as of 10 Feb 21:

- **Welch** Township for a paving project on Prairie Island Boulevard from CSAH 18 to CSAH 18 and a second paving project on 130th Ave. from TH 316/Th 61 roundabout to approximately 4,800 feet south.
- **Stanton** Township for the widening and paving of Oxford Mill Road from CSAH 24 to TH 19.
- **Kenyon** Township for a drainage system on 490th St. from CSAH 12 to TH 56.

It is anticipated that additional townships may request sponsorship resolutions after the Board's meeting but before the 03 Mar 21 application date. Therefore, the Board should consider authorizing the County Board Chair and County Administrator to sign sponsorship resolutions for appropriate projects that may be received before 03 Mar 21.

Attached are sponsorship resolutions for the above township projects and a blank form that could be used to authorize additional projects.

Considering that MAT's newsletter was sent to all the townships in the State, it is doubtful that more than one township from Goodhue County would be awarded a project. Therefore, Public Works staff should be able help deliver this additional project if the only responsibilities are those required of a sponsor.

- ➤ Authorize the County Board Chair and Administrator to approve additional sponsorship requests received from townships after the Board meeting on 16 Feb 21 for appropriate projects.

Minnesota statute 471.38, Subd 3a, paragraph (a) (as revised September 2017) states: "the governing body shall annually delegate the authority to make electronic funds transfers to a designated business administrator or chief financial officer or the officer's designee." An audit finding covering this requirement was included in the audited financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2017.

DISCUSSION

EFTs are used on a limited basis, primarily for payment of health insurance premiums, remittance of property taxes and distribution of county share of HSA contributions.

The Finance and Taxpayer Services Office processes all payments for Goodhue County. All payments are reviewed and approved by the Finance Director (Brian Anderson) or Finance Controller.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommend the Board formally delegate authority for processing EFT transactions for 2021 (through December 31, 2021) to the Finance Director (Brian Anderson) and the Finance Director's designees (Micki O'Keefe and Nicole Dahlstrom).

Cooperative Construction Agreement with MnDOT for the TH 52 Regrading Project,

Summary

It is requested that the County Board authorize the Chair and the County Administrator to sign the attached Cooperative Construction Agreement with MnDOT for the TH 52 Regrading Project.

Background

As discussed at the 01 Dec 20 County Board meeting, MnDOT continues to work on creating the documentation required to award a Design-Build contract for work on TH 52. This project stretches from the south junction with TH 60 to 2.2 miles south of TH 19. The design-build teams will be submitting a price proposal in late February. The winning proposal should be awarded sometime in April or May. Construction will begin this summer.

The County will be responsible for 15% of the Hader Interchange (TH 52/CSAH 8), 100% of the construction costs for the Park and Ride Lot on CSAH 8 near TH 52, and 100% of the construction costs for the realignment of CSAH 14 from its current intersection with TH 52 up to the frontage road that ties into the roundabout on CSAH 24. As a note, the County's cost for the Park and Ride Lot was combined with the county's responsibility for 15% of the Hader Interchange resulting in one sum of 17% for all the County's responsibility for the work at the Hader Interchange, including the Park and Ride Lot.

The original rough estimate (before any design work) for the County's portion of this project was \$6 million. MnDOT's preliminary estimate had the County's total project cost at under \$5 million. This agreement has the County's projected costs at \$4,305,237.64, which is significantly less than anticipated. MnDOT should bill the County for this amount within the next few weeks.

The County's final cost will be based on the actual low bid price, as adjusted to include change orders, design modifications, and the actual final quantities determined once the project is complete and the final cost is agreed upon between the design-build team and MnDOT. The County may owe more or may receive a refund at that time.

<u>Alternatives</u>

- Authorize the Chair and the County Administrator to sign the attached Cooperative Construction Agreement with MnDOT for the TH 52 Regrading Project.
- ➤ Ask MnDOT to Revise the Agreement.
- > Take no action and kill this project along with any future cooperative agreements with MnDOT.

This Agreement is between the State of Minnesota, acting through its Commissioner of Transportation ("State") and Goodhue County acting through its Board of Commissioners ("County").

Recitals

- The State will perform roadway, interchange, park and ride lot, noise wall, bridge construction and other
 associated construction upon, along, and adjacent to Trunk Highway No. 52 from the south junction of Trunk
 Highway No. 60 to 2.2 miles south of Trunk Highway No. 19 according to State-prepared plans,
 specifications, and special provisions designated by the County and the State as State Aid Project
 No. 025-608-014 and No. 025-614-016, and by the State as State Project No. 2506-83 (T.H. 52=020)
 ("Project"); and
- 2. County cost participation is required for the Hader interchange, Bridge No. 25044 ("Bridge A"), and park and ride lot construction and the County is willing to participate in the costs of said construction, including any associated design and construction engineering delivery costs; and
- 3. The County has requested the State include in its Project County State Aid Highway (C.S.A.H.) No. 14 construction; and

4. The County wishes to participate in the costs of the County State Aid Highway No. 14 construction and associated design and construction engineering delivery costs; and

5. Minnesota Statutes § 161.20, subdivision 2 authorizes the Commissioner of Transportation to make arrangements with and cooperate with any governmental authority for the purposes of constructing, maintaining, and improving the trunk highway system.

Agreement

1. Term of Agreement; Survival of Terms; Plans; Incorporation of Exhibits

- **1.1.** *Effective Date.* This Agreement will be effective on the date the State obtains all signatures required by Minnesota Statutes § 16C.05, subdivision 2.
- 1.2. Expiration Date. This Agreement will expire when all obligations have been satisfactorily fulfilled.
- 1.3. Survival of Terms. All clauses which impose obligations continuing in their nature and which must survive in order to give effect to their meaning will survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement, including, without limitation, the following clauses: 3. Maintenance by the County; 8. Liability; Worker Compensation Claims; 11. State Audits; 12. Government Data Practices; 14. Governing Law; Jurisdiction; Venue; and 16. Force Majeure.
- **1.4.** *Exhibits.* Preliminary Schedule "I" is on file in the office of the County Engineer and attached and incorporated into this Agreement.

2. Construction by the State

2.1. Contract Award. The State will advertise for technical and price proposals and award a design-build contract to the "Best Value Proposer" for State Project No. 2506-83 (T.H. 52=020) according to the State Request for Qualifications (RFQ) and Request for Proposal (RFP) documents, which are on file in the office of the Commissioner of Transportation at St. Paul, Minnesota, and incorporated into this Agreement by reference ("Project Plans").

2.2. Direction, Supervision, and Inspection of Construction.

- A. Supervision and Inspection by the State. The State will direct and supervise all design-build activities performed under the design-build construction contract, and oversee all construction engineering and inspection functions in connection with the design-build construction. All design-build construction will be performed according to the State's Request for Proposals, the Contractor's technical proposal, and approved plans.
- **B.** *Inspection by the County.* The County participation construction covered under this Agreement will be open to inspection by the County. If the County believes the County participation construction covered under this Agreement has not been properly performed or that the construction is defective, the County will inform the State District Engineer's authorized representative in writing of those defects. Any recommendations made by the County are not binding on the State. The State will have the exclusive right to determine whether the State's contractor has satisfactorily performed the County participation construction covered under this Agreement.

2.3. Plan Changes, Additional Construction, Etc.

A. The State may request the Contractor to make changes in the design and/or design-build contract construction, which may include the County participation construction covered under this Agreement, and will enter into any necessary addenda and change orders with the State's contractor that are necessary to cause the design-build contract construction to be performed and completed in a

satisfactory manner. The State District Engineer's authorized representative will inform the appropriate County official of any proposed addenda and change orders to the design-build contract that will affect the County participation construction covered under this Agreement.

- **B.** The County may request additional work or changes to the work in the plans as part of the design-build contract. Such request will be made by an exchange of letter(s) with the State. If the State determines that the requested additional work or plan changes are necessary or desirable and can be accommodated without undue disruption to the project, the State will cause the additional work or plan changes to be made.
- **2.4.** Satisfactory Completion of Contract. The State will perform all other acts and functions necessary to cause the design-build contract to be completed in a satisfactory manner. Acceptance by the State of the completed design-build contract construction will be final, binding, and conclusive upon the County as to the satisfactory completion of the design-build contract construction.

3. Maintenance by the County

Upon completion of the Project, the County will provide the following without cost or expense to the State:

- **3.1. Additional Drainage.** No party to this Agreement will drain any additional drainage volume into the storm sewer facilities constructed under the design-build contract that was not included in the drainage for which the storm sewer facilities were designed, without first obtaining written permission to do so from the other party.
- **3.2.** *Future Responsibilities.* Upon completion of the C.S.A.H. 8 and C.S.A.H. 14 construction, including the park and ride lot construction, and any other construction associated with C.S.A.H. 8 and C.S.A.H. 14, the County will own and accept full and total responsibility and all obligations and liabilities arising out of or by reason of the use, operation, maintenance, repair, and reconstruction of C.S.A.H. 8, C.S.A.H. 14, the park and ride lot, any other construction associated with C.S.A.H. 8 and C.S.A.H. 14, and all of the facilities constructed as part of this Agreement, without cost or expense to the State.
- **3.3.** *Release and Conveyance of Roadways.* Upon completion of the C.S.A.H. 8 and C.S.A.H. 14 construction, including the park and ride lot construction and any other construction associated with C.S.A.H. 8 and C.S.A.H. 14, the State will serve upon the County a "Notice of Release" placing those roadway portions under the jurisdiction of the County; and subsequent thereto, after all required documents have been prepared and processed, the State will convey to the County all right, title and interest of the State in those roadway portions. Upon receipt of that "Notice of Release", the County will become the road authority responsible for the roadway portions so released.

4. Basis of County Cost

- **4.1. Schedule "I".** The Preliminary Schedule "I" includes all anticipated County participation construction items and the design and construction engineering delivery cost share covered under this Agreement, and is based on engineer's estimated unit prices.
- **4.2. County Participation Construction.** The County will participate in the following as indicated. The amounts shown are based on the engineer's estimate and include all design and construction engineering delivery costs associated with the County's cost participation.
 - **A.** 100 Percent will be the County's rate of cost participation in all of the C.S.A.H. 14 construction. The construction includes, but is not limited to, those construction items tabulated on Sheet No. 2 of the Preliminary Schedule "I".

B. 17 Percent will be the County's rate of cost participation in all of the Hader interchange and park and ride lot construction. The construction includes, but is not limited to, those construction items tabulated on Sheet No. 3 of the Preliminary Schedule "I". The County's cost for Hader interchange and park and ride construction will be based on estimated quantities and design-build contract unit prices.

- **C.** 17 Percent will be the County's rate of cost participation in all of the Bridge A construction. The construction includes, but is not limited to, those construction items tabulated on Sheet No. 3 of the Preliminary Schedule "I". The County's cost for Bridge A construction will be based on estimated quantities and design-build contract unit prices.
- **4.3. Design and Construction Engineering Delivery Costs.** The County will pay a design and construction engineering delivery charge equal to 23 percent of the total County participation construction covered under this Agreement.
- **4.4.** *Plan Changes, Additional Construction, Etc.* The County will share in the costs of design-build contract addenda and change orders that are necessary to complete the County participation construction covered under this Agreement, including any County requested additional work and plan changes.

The State reserves the right to invoice the County for the cost of any additional County requested work and plan changes, design-build contract addenda, change orders, and associated design and construction engineering delivery costs before the completion of the design-build contract construction. If the design and construction engineering delivery costs are not included in any change order estimates, the amount will be added to the County's estimate of costs. The computation by the State of the amount due from the County will be final, binding, and conclusive.

5. County Cost and Payment by the County

- 5.1. County Cost. \$4,305,237.64 is the County's estimated share of the costs of the design-build construction and associated design and construction engineering delivery costs as shown in the Preliminary Schedule "I". The Preliminary Schedule "I" was prepared using estimated quantities and unit prices, and may include any credits or lump sum costs. Upon award of the construction contract, the State will prepare a Revised Schedule "I" based on design-build contract bid item unit prices, which will replace and supersede the Preliminary Schedule "I" as part of this Agreement.
- **5.2.** *Conditions of Payment.* The County will pay the State the County's total estimated construction and design and construction engineering delivery charge, as shown in the Revised Schedule "I", after the following conditions have been met:
 - **A.** Execution of this Agreement and transmittal to the County, including a copy of the Revised Schedule "I".
 - **B.** The County's receipt of a written request from the State for the advancement of funds.
- **5.3.** Acceptance of the County's Cost and Completed Construction. The computation by the State of the amount due from the County will be final, binding, and conclusive. Acceptance by the State of the completed design-build contract construction will be final, binding, and conclusive upon the County as to the satisfactory completion of the contract construction.
- **5.4.** *Final Payment by the County.* Upon completion of all design-build contract construction and upon computation of the final amount due the State's contractor, the State will prepare a Final Schedule "I" and submit a copy to the County. The Final Schedule "I" will be based on final quantities, and include all County participation construction items and the design and construction engineering delivery cost share covered under this Agreement. If the final cost of the County participation construction exceeds the amount of

funds advanced by the County, the County will pay the difference to the State without interest. If the final cost of the County participation construction is less than the amount of funds advanced by the County, the State will refund the difference to the County without interest.

The State and the County waive claims for any payments or refunds less than \$5.00 according to Minnesota Statutes § 15.415.

6. Authorized Representatives

Each party's Authorized Representative is responsible for administering this Agreement and is authorized to give and receive any notice or demand required or permitted by this Agreement.

7. Assignment; Amendments; Waiver; Contract Complete

- **7.1. Assignment.** No party may assign or transfer any rights or obligations under this Agreement without the prior consent of the other party and a written assignment agreement, executed and approved by the same parties who executed and approved this Agreement, or their successors in office.
- **7.2.** Amendments. Any amendment to this Agreement must be in writing and will not be effective until it has been executed and approved by the same parties who executed and approved the original Agreement, or their successors in office.
- **7.3.** *Waiver.* If a party fails to enforce any provision of this Agreement, that failure does not waive the provision or the party's right to subsequently enforce it.
- **7.4. Contract Complete.** This Agreement contains all prior negotiations and agreements between the State and the County. No other understanding regarding this Agreement, whether written or oral, may be used to bind either party.

8. Liability; Worker Compensation Claims

- **8.1.** Each party is responsible for its own acts, omissions, and the results thereof to the extent authorized by law and will not be responsible for the acts, omissions of others, and the results thereof. Minnesota Statutes § 3.736 and other applicable law govern liability of the State. Minnesota Statutes Chapter 466 and other applicable law govern liability of the County.
- **8.2.** Each party is responsible for its own employees for any claims arising under the Workers Compensation Act.

9. Nondiscrimination

Provisions of Minnesota Statutes § 181.59 and of any applicable law relating to civil rights and discrimination are considered part of this Agreement.

10. Title VI/Non-discrimination Assurances

The County agrees to comply with all applicable US DOT Standard Title VI/Non-Discrimination Assurances contained in DOT Order No. 1050.2A, and in particular Appendices A and E, which can be found at: https://edocs-public.dot.state.mn.us/edocs-public/DMResultSet/download?docId=11149035. The County will ensure the appendices and solicitation language within the assurances are inserted into contracts as required. The State may conduct a review of the County's compliance with this provision. The County must cooperate with the State throughout the review process by supplying all requested information and documentation to the State, making County staff and officials available for meetings as requested, and correcting any areas of noncompliance as determined by the State.

11. State Audits

Under Minnesota Statutes § 16C.05, subdivision 5, the County's books, records, documents, accounting procedures, and practices relevant to this Agreement are subject to examination by the State and the State Auditor or Legislative Auditor, as appropriate, for a minimum of six years from the end of this Agreement.

12. Government Data Practices

The County and State must comply with the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act, Minnesota Statutes Chapter 13, as it applies to all data provided under this Agreement, and as it applies to all data created, collected, received, stored, used, maintained, or disseminated by the County under this Agreement. The civil remedies of Minnesota Statutes §13.08 apply to the release of the data referred to in this clause by either the County or the State.

13. Telecommunications Certification

By signing this agreement, the County certifies that, consistent with Section 889 of the John S. McCain National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2019, Pub. L. 115-232 (Aug. 13, 2018), the County does not and will not use any equipment, system, or service that uses "covered telecommunications equipment or services" (as that term is defined in Section 889 of the Act) as a substantial or essential component of any system or as critical technology as part of any system. The County will include this certification as a flow down clause in any contract related to this agreement.

14. Governing Law; Jurisdiction; Venue

Minnesota law governs the validity, interpretation, and enforcement of this Agreement. Venue for all legal proceedings arising out of this Agreement, or its breach, must be in the appropriate state or federal court with competent jurisdiction in Ramsey County, Minnesota.

15. Termination; Suspension

- 15.1. By Mutual Agreement. This Agreement may be terminated by mutual agreement of the parties.
- **15.2.** *Termination for Insufficient Funding.* The State may immediately terminate this Agreement if it does not obtain funding from the Minnesota Legislature, or other funding source; or if funding cannot be continued at a level sufficient to allow for the performance of design-build contract construction under the Project. Termination must be by written or fax notice to the County.
- **15.3.** *Suspension.* In the event of a total or partial government shutdown, the State may suspend this Agreement and all work, activities, and performance of work authorized through this Agreement.

16. Force Majeure

No party will be responsible to the other for a failure to perform under this Agreement (or a delay in performance), if such failure or delay is due to a force majeure event. A force majeure event is an event beyond a party's reasonable control, including but not limited to, unusually severe weather, fire, floods, other acts of God, labor disputes, acts of war or terrorism, or public health emergencies.

Nielsen Memorial Preserve Master Plan Revisions & Regional Designation

Summary

It is requested that the County Board approve the revised Nielsen Memorial Preserve (NMP) Master Plan and authorize staff to submit the NMP Master Plan and an application for regional designation to the Greater MN Regional Parks & Trails Commission (GMRPTC).

Background

The original NMP Master Plan was prepared by Hoisington Koegler Group, Inc. (HKGi) and approved by the County Board on December 7th, 2017. Goodhue County then applied to GMRPTC for regional designation as a **natural resource based** park. A ranking of high regional significance would allow NMP to become part of the regional parks and trails system, and allow Goodhue County to apply for Legacy grant funds to help build the projects that were identified in the Master Plan. Unfortunately, there is quite a bit of competition in this category, and our park was only able to achieve a medium regional significance rating given its small size.

The GMRPTC review committee suggested that we reapply as a **special feature** park, focusing on **outdoor education**. They also asked us to better outline (in the Master Plan and in our regional designation application) how we intend the park to become a truly regional destination (not just a local destination) while still maintaining the high quality of natural resources at the park, given the park's small acreage.

While the park's vision statement remains the same, HKGi has made several changes to the Master Plan that they believe will strengthen our chances of achieving a high regional significance rating. Attached is a summary of the changes, and the revised Master Plan can be viewed on the County website at: https://co.goodhue.mn.us/DocumentCenter/View/21562/DRAFT-Nielsen-Memorial-Preserve-Master-Plan-Update-2021 A resolution to accompany the regional designation application is also attached.

- ➤ Approve submission of the Master Plan and a regional designation application to GMRPTC.
- ➤ Request changes to the Master Plan before submission to GMRPTC.
- > Take no action and halt the process of regional designation for Nielsen Memorial Preserve.

Recommendations

➤ It is the recommendation of staff that the County Board approve submission of the revised Master Plan to the Greater MN Regional Parks & Trails Commission, and authorize staff to submit an application for regional designation as a **special feature** park.

SUMMARY OF CHANGES TO THE NIELSEN MEMORIAL PRESERVE MASTER PLAN

Following direction from the GMRPTC regarding the June 2019 version, we have updated the Nielsen Memorial Preserve Master Plan in order to emphasize its "Special Recreational Feature" designation, underscore its regional significance, demonstrate a commitment to preserving its natural resources in a high-quality state, and strengthen its focus on outdoor education. The November 2020 update includes the following changes, which we hope will better position the Preserve to receive funding:

- The update reinforces the park's "Special Recreation Feature" designation in two primary ways:
 - The plan adds information on the Mima mounds present within the park, showing that they
 present an opportunity to learn about unique and significant natural features not commonly
 known in Minnesota.
 - "Nielsen Memorial Preserve is home to more than two-dozen unique landforms known as Mima mounds. The source of these topographical phenomena is part of a robust scientific debate; and their presence on publicly-owned land provides a valuable opportunity to researchers, especially if there is a facility onsite where they can catalogue and showcase their work. The Mima mounds at Nielsen Memorial Preserve are part of the Schmidt Moundfield- the greatest concentration of Mima Mounds remaining anywhere in the Upper Midwest. Mima mounds are a fascinating part of Minnesota's natural history that has unfortunately been forgotten or ignored for a variety of reasons. Highlighting them here at Nielsen Memorial Preserve could provide an attraction for visitors and a focus for programming." (page 3)
 - Expanded text on the map on page 10 highlights how the presence of Mima mounds sets
 Nielsen Memorial Preserve apart from other destinations in the region
 - A new full page of information on the significance of Mima mounds on page 15

- Updates to the "cultural resources" paragraph on page 16: "During Edward Schmidt's research into the more than 2,700 mounds in the area, he never discovered any evidence of cultural artifacts, which lends credence to the Mima Mounds hypothesis."
- Expansion of "Key Considerations" on page 21 to suggest reaching out to academics
 interested in studying the park's Mima mounds, and developing interpretation and education
 programming related to them.
- New text in the "Unique and Compelling Features" section on page 26 adds, "As an outdoor education-focused park where visitors can roam old growth Big Woods forest and see unique natural features like Mima mounds, Nielsen Memorial Preserve will introduce visitors to new facets of Minnesota's natural history" and, "The Preserve's Mima mounds are valuable remnant of Minnesota's early landscape, and their mysterious origins offer visitors a compelling topic to contemplate as they explore."
- Addition of mound locations to the master plan map on page 29, along with minor trail adjustments
- 2. The plan positions the Preserve as a place for outdoor, nature-based education (recommended by the GMRPTC) through an enhanced "outdoor learning laboratory" that provides flexible space for partners like local schools and universities, River Bend Nature Center, Kenyon-Wanamingo Community Ed, and others, to offer programming, teach classes, and conduct research.
 - Addition of text on the master plan concept describing how facilities and amenities will "allow visitors and academics to observe, learn from, and preserve Minnesota's Big Woods ecosystem and the Mima mounds of the Schmidt Moundfield" and that the Learning Lab building "can be outfitted for research and has classroom seating and a firepit to support group education." (page 29)
 - Page 30 expands on the programming of the outdoor learning laboratory, saying it "could be reserved for use by researchers or academics studying features in the park."
 - Addition of an Interpretive Plan (page 34) that lays out options for providing educational opportunities at Nielsen Memorial Preserve that could include:
 - "signage panels, topical exploration prompts, and app-based learning in order to help interpretive messages engage a larger variety of visitors. Signage and interpretive media on a variety of topics will be developed as trails and programming are implemented. Subjects like the Mima mounds, spring ephemerals, big woods habitat, and guarding against invasive species will be essential to explore. Features that assist with interpretation, such as overlooks, can be designed to integrate interpretive

elements. Exploration backpacks with gear and educational prompts could be checked out from the Learning Lab to guide visitors interested in specific topics. And even before formal infrastructure investments are made in the park, Nielsen Memorial Preserve-specific projects can be created in iNaturalist or other smart phone apps in order to help to guide exploration and learning on site."

- The Long-term Improvements implementation table on page 39 has been adjusted to include \$1,250,000 for the Outdoor Learning Laboratory (up from \$400,000), and \$50,000 for a well.
- The update illustrates a commitment to preserving the quality of natural resources within the park through the following:
 - Adding text indicating that a Natural Resource Inventory was initiated in 2020 and is ongoing (page 17), which demonstrates progress and investment following the initial GMRPTC submission, and will help to identify ecologically-sensitive areas prior to any development.
 - Mentioning the potential to hire an additional natural resource staff person in the "Key Considerations" section on page 21, in the "Ecological and Land Resources Plan" on page 35, and in the "Operations and Management" section on page 40, which would demonstrate the County's commitment to maintaining the Preserve's natural resources in their high-quality state.
- Other changes in the November 2020 version include updates to the park boundary and acreage based on acquisitions.
 - Acreage update in the chart on page 13
 - Addition to "History of park development" text and map on page 14

As the Drainage Authority, the County Board is setting a Public Hearing date for the Redetermination of Benefits for Goodhue County Ditch 1.

Background:

The County has received the Engineer's Report and the Viewer's Report for the County Ditch 1 project. Viewer's packets outlining benefits and damages were mailed to each individual land owner within the County Ditch drainage area. Individuals were directed to contact the Viewer's with any questions contained in the report.

Staff and consultants held an Informational Meeting with the land owners on February 4, 2021 to discuss the reports. The Engineers Report did not include the estimates for the Repairs to the Five Branch Lines. We needed to have an understanding if Branch B would be requesting an Improvement, and if Branches C and D were actually being used and needed to be included in the Repair or terminated.

Staff and consultants held another meeting with the four land owners affected by Branch B on February 9, 2021. It appears that they are going to request an Improvement for that tile and will start the legal process for that portion of the Ditch.

Recommendation:

Staff and counsel recommend the following actions from the County Board:

- 1) Request Chris Otterness, Houston Engineering, Inc., prepare a cost estimate for the Repairs to Branches A, C,D,E,F to be added as an addendum to the Engineers Report; and
- 2) Approve the attached ORDER in the Matter of the Redetermination of Benefits for Goodhue County Ditch 1.

Findings:

- 1. The Goodhue County Board of Commissioners ("Board") is the public drainage authority under Minnesota Statutes, chapter 103E for Goodhue County Ditch 1 ("CD 1"). CD 1 is located in Township 109 North, Range 18 West, Sections 28, 29, 32, and 33.
- 2. At a duly noticed and held public meeting on September 1, 2020, the Board adopted Findings and Order Initiating the Redetermination of Benefits for CD 1.
- 3. At a duly noticed and held public meeting on October 6, 2020 the Board adopted Findings and Order Appointing Viewers for the redetermination of benefits. The Board appointed Bryan Murphy, Larry Murphy, Shantel Hecht, Robert Conely, and Ken DeGier of H2Over Viewers, LLC as viewers and directed the viewers to, with or without the Board's CD 1 repair engineer, Houston Engineering, Inc., to determine benefits and damages to all property affected by CD 1 and make a viewers' report in conformance with Minnesota Statutes, chapter 103E and Minnesota law.
- 4. On December 17, 2020, the viewers filed their viewers' report and a benefits and damages statement with Goodhue County LUM Director/County Surveyor/County Recorder/Assistant Administrator, Lisa Hanni. The report was shared concurrently with Goodhue County Administrator Scott Arneson and the Goodhue County Finance Director, Brian Anderson.

- 5. Minnesota Statutes, section 103E.351, subdivision 2(b) requires the county finance director to prepare a property owners' report from the viewers' report and mail a copy of the property owners' report to each owner of property affected by the drainage system. Subdivision 2(c) of this section requires the drainage authority to hold a final hearing on the report and confirm the benefits and damages and the benefited and damages areas under the proceedings found in Statutes, sections 103E.325, 103E.335, and 103E.341.
- 6. Minnesota Statutes, section 103E.325, subdivision 1 requires the drainage authority, after consulting with the county administrator, to set a time and location for the final hearing on the viewers' report 25 to 50 days after the date of the final hearing notice. Subdivision 3 of this section requires the county administrator to notify the drainage authority and all interested persons of the time and location of the final hearing by publication, posting, and mail.

Order:

Based on the foregoing Findings and the entire record of proceedings before the Board, the Board, acting as the drainage authority for CD 1, hereby orders as follows:

- A. A hearing on the viewers' report regarding the redetermination of benefits and damages shall be held on March 24, 2021 at 9:00 a.m, or shortly thereafter as the agenda allows, at the County Board Room located on the 3rd Floor of the Goodhue County Government Center, 509 W 5th Street, Red Wing, Minnesota 55066; however, based on the State Emergency Declaration related to the COVID-19 pandemic, it is neither feasible nor prudent to hold in-person meetings during the emergency. Therefore, the hearing shall be conducted by alternative means (teleconference or video conference) from remote locations under the conditions contained in Minnesota Statutes, section 13D.021.
- B. In coordination with the viewers, the Goodhue County Administrator shall ensure copies of each property owner's report are mailed to each owner of property affected by CD 1.
- C. The Goodhue County Administrator shall notify the drainage authority and all interested persons of the time and location of the final hearing by publication, posting, and mail. A printed copy of the final hearing notice shall be posted at least three weeks before the date of the final hearing at the front door of the Goodhue County courthouse. The final hearing notice shall be published once per week for three successive weeks in a legal newspaper in general circulation for Goodhue County. Within one week after the first publication of the notice, the Goodhue County Administrator shall give notice by mail of the time and location of the final hearing to all property owners and others affected by the proposed drainage project and listed in the viewers' report.

Background:

In March 2012, Jason Fitzgerald (Owner, Fitzgerald Excavating and Trucking) received Interim Use Permit (IUP 11-co13) approval to establish a "Commercial/Industrial business primarily intended to Serve the Agricultural Community" in section 10 of Goodhue Township. The business provides a variety of excavating and trucking services to commercial, governmental, and agricultural clients throughout southeastern Minnesota.

Mr. Fitzgerald recently contacted Land Use Management (LUM) staff to discuss constructing a new shed on the property to provide additional covered storage for business-related equipment and materials. Upon reviewing the existing IUP documentation, LUM staff became aware that a condition mandating a 5-year Planning Commission review specified by the County Board had not yet been satisfied. LUM staff also determined that the Applicant's proposed storage expansion was beyond the scope and scale of the Applicant's IUP approval and an amendment would be needed to allow the proposed construction.

The required 5-year review was completed on February 8, 2021. No action was required for the IUP review and the Planning Commission did not recommend any changes based on the review. The Planning Commission also considered the Applicant's request to amend the existing IUP to allow additional storage buildings to be constructed and modify conditions related to driveway access.

County Board action is required to consider the Applicant's IUP amendment request to allow the proposed storage expansion and modifications to the existing IUP conditions.

Goodhue County Zoning Ordinance: Article 4 Conditional/Interim Uses

No CUP/IUP shall be recommended by the County Planning Commission unless said Commission specifies facts in their findings for each case which establish the proposed CUP/IUP will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted, will not substantially diminish and impair property values within the immediate vicinity, will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding vacant property for uses predominant to the area, that adequate measures have been, or will be, taken to provide utilities, access roads, drainage, and other necessary facilities, to provide sufficient off-street parking and loading space, to control offensive odor, fumes, dust, noise, and vibration so that none of these will constitute a nuisance, and to control lighted signs and other lights in such a manner that no disturbance to neighboring properties will result.

Project Summary:

Property Information:

- The subject parcel comprises 34.9 acres. The business is primarily located on the northern half of the property and the Applicant's residence occupies the southern half.
- Existing buildings for the business include a 104-foot x 60-foot repair shop (including a 16-foot x 104-foot lean-to) with a 60-foot x 40-foot attached office space and an approximately 120-foot x 50-foot cold storage building.
- The property and all adjacent lands are zoned A-1 (Agriculture Protection).
- Adjacent land uses include primarily row-crop and animal agriculture (feedlots) to the east, south, and west and medium-density residential uses to the north. The nearest residences are located approximately 500 feet north of the operation (Ronald Fredrickson, David Roschen, Dennis Gadient).
 - Existing stands of mature woods on the Applicant's property and adjacent parcels provide effective screening of the operation from adjacent residential uses.
- Primary business access is located off of 350TH ST (crushed aggregate surface) on the north end of the property. 350TH ST connects to State HWY 58 approximately 400 feet west of the main entrance.

The Applicant applies annual chloride treatment along 350TH ST from property entrance west to ST HWY 58 in the springtime to provide dust control as required by IUP condition #7.

Existing Operations:

- The business is operated by the Applicant with the assistance of approximately 10 year-round employees which expands to 25 or more total employees during the peak of construction season. Typically, only 1-2 employees are on-site during the day. Most employees report directly to a job site and only visit the shop to obtain materials and equipment as needed.
- Daily hours of operation are 6 AM to 9 PM, with occasional extended hours to accommodate emergencies.
- The Applicant has obtained all required Building approvals as required by the IUP.
- Goodhue County Sanitarian Ben Hoyt reviewed the Applicant's operation. He noted that the Applicant needs to complete an Operating Permit form for the existing holding tank servicing the office building.
- The business has not operated without issue since IUP approval in 2012. The Applicant has cooperated with staff to address issues primarily related to the storage of demolition materials and rubbish on the site on separate occasions.
 - The Applicant has been responsive to issues as they have arisen and has promptly made corrections where violations have been identified.
- A review of the Applicant's file found no recent record of complaints from the general public regarding the operation.
- Existing IUP condition #10 states "Primary road access to and from the property shall be on 350th Street to Highway 58. The road access on 215th shall be closed by April 1, 2012." This condition was added by the County Board of Commissioners during the IUP approval process,

but, was not a requirement specified by Goodhue Township or the Planning Advisory Commission.

Though the Applicant did initially install barriers to restrict access off of 215^{TH} AVE as mandated, those barriers are no longer present and the driveway is occasionally used to access the 120-foot x 50-foot cold storage building.

The Applicant desires to establish the 215TH AVE driveway as a permanent access to improve onsite traffic circulation and safety. LUM Staff has discussed the 215TH AVE access issue with Goodhue Township on several occasions and they have expressed they are not opposed to the Applicant's use of the existing access to support his operation.

Goodhue Township has provided a written statement indicating their support of removing the condition restricting 215TH AVE access.

Staff conducted a site visit on January 28, 2021. No zoning violations were observed and the
operation appears to be in conformance with the conditions of the IUP with the exception of the
secondary driveway access to 215TH AVE.

Proposed Amendments:

- The Applicant is proposing to construct a 120-foot x 40-foot x 16-foot 3-sided "loafing" shed. The shed would be primarily used to provide dry storage for miscellaneous equipment and landscaping materials (straw etc.). These materials are currently stored outside or in the existing 120-foot x 50-foot cold storage building which the Applicant intends to use for vehicle and equipment storage.
 - The shed is proposed to be setback a minimum of 60-feet from the edge of the 350TH ST and 215TH AVE Right-of-Ways as required by Ordinance.
- The Applicant is also requesting consideration to construct a second approximately 120-foot x 40-foot cold storage building (exact dimensions to be determined) in the future if the need arises. He anticipates the structure would be sited west of the existing 120-foot x 50-foot cold storage.
 - No exterior lighting, plumbing, or signage is proposed for either building.
- No changes are proposed to the scale or intensity of the existing operation. The amendment request would not expand the current employment figures for the business.

IUP Conditions:

- The existing IUP is subject to 10 conditions. Conditions #1, #2, and #6 have been satisfied by the Applicant and are no longer applicable. LUM Staff proposes removing these conditions from the IUP.
- LUM Staff is also proposing to modify existing condition #7 regarding calcium chloride treatment of the Township road and to remove existing conditions #9 and #10.
 - Removing condition #9 eliminates a Bi-annual inspection by LUM staff of the Applicant's business. This is not a standard practice and has not been regularly completed as conditioned. Typically, the LUM department responds to Ordinance violations when complaints are received from the public or local officials.
- LUM Staff is proposing to add condition #11 regarding Building Permit and Environmental Health approvals for the Applicant's proposed storage buildings.

Goodhue Township:

- Goodhue Township received the application materials from the applicant and signed the IUP Application acknowledgment on 1/13/21 without comment.
- Goodhue Township has also approved the Township Zoning Approval permit for the proposed 120-foot x 40-foot x 16-foot "loafing" shed.
- Goodhue Township provided a written statement noting the Township is not opposed to Mr. Fitzgerald's request to utilitze the 215TH AVE access drive.

Existing Findings of Fact:

Below are the existing Findings of Fact supporting the approval of IUP 11-co13. The PAC did not recommend any amendments to the existing Findings of Fact.

- A. The proposed structure and parking/circulation/storage areas are sufficiently screened from surrounding land uses by vegetation, berms or natural topography so as to limit negative visual impacts.
- B. Site grading has included berms and extensive planting of pine trees to screen and beautify the site.
- C. The proposed business site has convenient indirect access to State Highway 58 requiring limited use of Township Road for access/egress.
- D. Former use of the site for mining of clay has left significantly disturbed soils, leaving the site of limited value for agricultural use.
- E. Noise generated from Trucks and Heavy Equipment will be mitigated by the use of berms and planting of trees.
- F. Goodhue Township has signed the applicant's CUP/ IUP Application to the County and offered no comments regarding the proposed use of the property.
- G. Applicant performs a considerable amount of work for the agricultural community.

PAC Recommendation:



IT IS RECOMMENDED to the Goodhue County Board of Commissioners that the INTERIM USE PERMIT for Fitzgerald Trucking and Excavating (Jason Fitzgerald) be APPROVED to allow construction and operation of the Fitzgerald Trucking and Excavating business on parcel 33.010.0602, within A-1 Zone District of Goodhue Township, with the following conditions;

- 1. Completion of the building project to expand the existing 6240 sq. ft. building may not proceed prior to issuance of a building permit from Goodhue County; and
- 2. Use of the Structure for business purposes shall be subject to issuance of a Certificate of Occupancy by the Goodhue County Building Official; and
- 3. Dumping, disposal, or storage of scrap iron, metal, glass, unused

appliances or machinery, junk, garbage, rubbish, or any other refuse, or of ashes, slag, or other industrial wastes or by-products shall be expressly prohibited on site; and

- 4. Dumping, disposal, or storage of demolition debris shall be prohibited on the site; and

- 6. Following spring thaw (approximately April 1, 2012) the applicant shall schedule an inspection by the County Planner/Zoning Administrator and the Goodhue SWCD, District Engineer to review site grading to address any erosion and sediment control concerns.
- 7. Applicant shall chloride roads fronting property to Highway 58 annually. time) shall be paid to the County by Fitzgerald Trucking Excavation.)
- 8. Regular shop hours shall not exceed 6am to 9pm with provisions made for emergency use. Any non-emergency situations that will exceed the 6am to 9pm restriction must be approved by the LUM department and submitted in writing to the LUM department expressing the reasons for the requested exception.
- 9. Bi-annual inspection of Interim Use Permit Site to ensure compliance with Interim Use Permit conditions and any applicable County regulations or permit requirements. Costs associated with the bi-annual inspections, not to exceed \$250.00, shall be paid to the County by Fitzgerald Trucking and Excavation.
- 10. Primary road access to and from the property shall be on 350th Street to Highway 58. The road access on 215th shall be closed by April 1, 2012.

IT IS ORDERED that the 5 year mandatory review INTERIM USE PERMIT for Fitzgerald Trucking and Excavating (Jason Fitzgerald) to allow construction and operation of the Fitzgerald Trucking and Excavating business on parcel 33.010.0602, within A-1 Zone District of Goodhue Township be APPROVED given on January 3, 2012 by the County Board of Commissioners, with the following conditions;

Moved by C/Rechtzigel, seconded by C/Allen, and carried to approve an Interim Use Permit for a term of five (5) years to allow construction and operation of the Fitzgerald Excavating and Trucking Business on Parcel #33.010.0201 located in Twp-111N Range-015W, Part of E ¼, NW ¼, Section 10—Goodhue Township subject to the following conditions:

- 8. Completion of the building project to expand the existing 6240 sq. ft. building may not proceed prior to issuance of a building permit from Goodhue County; and
- 9. Use of the Structure for business purposes shall be subject to issuance of a Certificate of Occupancy by the Goodhue County Building Official; and
- 10. Dumping, disposal, or storage of scrap iron, metal, glass, unused appliances or machinery, junk, garbage, rubbish, or any other refuse, or of ashes, slag, or other industrial wastes or by-products shall be expressly prohibited on site; and

- 14. Applicant shall chloride roads fronting property to Highway 58 annually. time) shall be paid to the County by Fitzgerald Trucking Excavation.)
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- 9. Bi-annual inspection of Interim Use Permit Site to ensure compliance with Interim Use Permit conditions and any applicable County regulations or permit requirements. Costs associated with the bi-annual inspections, not to exceed \$250.00, shall be paid to the County by Fitzgerald Trucking and Excavation.

10. Primary road access to and from the property shall be on 350th Street to Highway 58. The road access on 215th shall be closed by April 1, 2012.

The Interim Use Permit shall be subject to a mandatory review by the Planning Advisory Commission within five years of the date of approval by the County Board at which time a recommendation will be made to the County Board to assess whether the Interim Use Permit should be renewed. This mandatory review by the PAC does not preclude review at an early date if concerns regarding compliance arise.

Action by the County Board should recognize the background information included in this Staff Report (dated December 22, 2011) including the following Findings of Fact:

Findings of Fact to support approval of the Fitzgerald Trucking and Excavation Interim Use Permit:

- A. The proposed structure and parking/circulation/storage areas are sufficiently screened from surrounding land uses by vegetation, berms or natural topography so as to limit negative visual impacts.
- B. Site grading has included berms and extensive planting of pine trees screen and beautify the site.
- C. The proposed business site has convenient indirect access to State Highway 58 required limited use of Township Road for access/egress.
- D. Former use of the site for mining of clay has left significantly disturbed soils, leaving the site of limited value for agricultural use.
- E. Noise generated from Trucks and Heavy Equipment will be mitigated by the use of berms and planting of trees.
- F. Goodhue Township has signed the applicant's CUP/ IUP Application to the County and offered no comments regarding the proposed use of the property.
- G. Applicant performs a considerable amount of work for the agricultural community.

Background:

On December 15th the MN Legislature passed S.F. No. 31, a \$216.8 million economic relief package which was signed into law on December 16th. Goodhue County Board received and approved **\$891,695.92** to be allocated towards business grants and administration.

Discussion:

As of February 8th, CEDA was successful in issuing a total of 94 grants totaling \$869,345.92 to businesses primarily in the amount of \$10,000 apiece. The remaining \$22,350 was allocated by the State for administration of the grant program and to help cover reviewing the grants and distributing the grant dollars in accordance with the grant law.

As outlined in the attached Final Report, from the total applications 186 applications were received in total, 27 applications were ineligible, and 65 applications are placed on a potential future waiting list. Staff and CEDA feel confident that these grants went towards businesses that the State had intended for the funds to be distributed. The types and locations of businesses that received these grants are as follows:

RE: Final Report - State Business & Nonprofit Relief Grant Program

Background:

Goodhue County engaged CEDA to create and implement a business and nonprofit relief grant program utilizing funds the county received through special legislation from the State of Minnesota. Eligible businesses could apply for up to \$10,000. The eligibility criteria was as follows:

- 1. They were located in Goodhue County.
- 2. Had no current tax liens on record with the Secretary of State as of the time of their application.
- 3. They were impacted by an executive order related to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- 4. They did not receive a direct pandemic relief payment from the State of Minnesota.
- 5. They had experienced a reduction of at least 25% net revenue from April 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020.
- 6. They were not listed as an "ineligible business type" including farming (animal and crop production) and passive/rental income.

CEDA was asked to manage, review, and award these grants.

CEDA marketed the program via press releases to local media, created a program handout, distributed program information to each local city and chamber of commerce within the county, conducted social media outreach, went door to door to businesses, and implemented other individual outreach efforts.

The program opened to the public January 5, 2021 and closed on January 25, 2021. However, funding was awarded on a first come first served basis and funding was exhausted on January 19, 2021. Ninety-four applications were awarded. Once the funding was exhausted, a waiting list was kept in case additional funding was made available.

CEDA reviewed each application, confirmed any questions that appeared, and helped applicants with any questions that arose.

In addition to the funds allocated to CEDA to award on the county's behalf, the county awarded \$25,000 to the Red Wing YMCA directly.

Program Summary:

Attached is a detailed report of all of the grants awarded by CEDA. In summary:

- 94 grants totaling \$869,345.92 were awarded.
- 76 grants totaling \$706,437 were awarded to businesses.
- 18 grants totaling \$162,908.92 were awarded to nonprofits.

In addition:

- 186 applications were received in total.
- 27 applications were ineligible.

- 65 applications are on the waiting list to be reviewed should additional funding become available. Some of these may be ineligible upon review.

Background:

Given the economic hardship that COVID and the Governors executive orders have had on local establishments, the County Board asked staff to come up with some options to consider liquor license reimbursement for 2021.

Discussion:

Goodhue County has the following:

- 1. 8 Businesses with liquor license, two with two licenses
- 2. Issues a total of 10 licenses totaling \$17,900
 - o 8 On-sale & Sunday licenses x \$2,000 = **\$16,000**
 - Off-sale licenses x \$500 = \$1,000
 - o In addition, there is a \$100 seller/server fee (review and processing) for each license location (9) or **\$900**.
- 3. The license holder pays for the license in November for the upcoming, so the 2021 licenses were paid for in November of 2020.

Options for Goodhue County:

- 1. Do a full reimbursement for 2021 at the cost of \$17,900 or \$17,000.
- 2. Only do the On-sale licenses at the amount of \$16,000. Being the restaurants are reopening, vaccinations are being issued, and summer is not yet here, do a partial on-sale reimbursement at \$8,000.
- 3. Staff would be hesitant to reimburse for Off-sale being they were never forced to close and many residents had to go there to purchase their alcohol.

Funding Sources for reimbursement:

- 1. Carryover from CARES which has an approximate balance of \$264,867.
- General Fund Balance.

Recommendation:

Staff would recommend to reimburse the On-Sale Liquor Licenses for half their amount or \$1,000 apiece for a total of \$8,000. Then staff and the County Board can revisit this topic again in October and discuss whether the Board would want to go back and reimburse the rest of 2021 and possibly 2022 (or a portion thereof). Again, not sure how the economy will be this summer or how the Governor's executive orders will impact businesses. The funds to reimburse for the On-Sale Liquor Licenses could come from the residual of the CARES Funds.


It's become more challenging to find attractive CDs in the market these days, but that is still what's paying the highest yield within our investment options. Although a five year is only paying 0.5%, I have been able to pick up CDs throughout MN at more than double that rate through active investing which will yield an additional \$80k throughout the portfolio. In addition, I've established a new money market with a local bank that pays 0.5% higher than Wells Fargo or MAGIC. This could yield an additional \$65,000 this year, which will help us achieve our interest earnings goal.


As outline in the graph below, our Fixed Income Weighted Yield is still strong at 2.243% (red line) while out overall Portfolio Weighted Yield (maroon line) is more volatile and reflects more of the market trends being we have more funds invested in money markets throughout the year due to tax settlement dollars. However, we have managed to keep both lines above the market average!
