ADJOURN

The Goodhue County Board of Commissioners met on Tuesday, June 20, 2023, at 9:00 a.m. in the County Board Room, Government Center, Red Wing, with Commissioner Majerus, Flanders, Betcher, and Greseth all present. C/Anderson appeared via teams from Ireland. All votes would be done by roll call.

C/Flanders asked for disclosures of interest. There were none.

HUMAN RESOURCE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Personnel Committee Report. The Personnel Committee met on Tuesday, June 20, prior to the board meeting with the following items on the agenda:

Additional Public Safety Telecommunicators Request. The Personnel Committee recommended approval to hire two additional public safety telecommunicators. One option for funding the positions could be the new public safety aid Goodhue County will be receiving from the State of Minnesota. It is a one-time aid.

C/Majerus suggested looking at a regional dispatch for efficiencies. C/Anderson agreed with back filling one position due to a resignation, however, was also in favor of looking at a regional approach to the dispatch system.

C/Betcher commented that she was not opposed, however, suggested looking at adding the employees through the budgeting process.

⁴ Moved by C/Greseth, seconded by C/Flanders, and motion failed (2-3-0) with C/Anderson, C/Betcher, C/Majerus dissenting to approve to hire two additional Public Safety Telecommunicators to begin in January.

The board gave consensus to the Sheriff to work through the additional two positions during the budget process.

Land Use Management Staff Replacement. The Personnel Committee recommended hiring a well and septic inspector instead of replacing the administrative assistant.

C/Majerus commented that he would like to see the duties moved to the private sector eventually.

⁵ Moved by C/Betcher, seconded by C/Anderson, and carried to approve to hire a well and septic inspector position instead of replacing the vacant administrative assistant position.

County Pay Study. Dr. Tessia Melvin summarized the direction and conclusion the board has discussed at numerous Committee of the Whole meetings regarding the county employee pay study. The proposed pay grid would bring all employees, including Health and Human Services employees and employees in grades 87-91 on to one pay grid. The implementation date would be July 8, 2023.

C/Betcher noted the cost of moving staff to the new pay study would be approximately a 5.58% increase in the levy, however, she felt it was the intent of the board to use some of the additional funds received from the state and other places to offset.

FACILITIES MAINTENANCE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Government Center Roof Top Units. At the March 6, 2023 Board meeting, the County Board approved to proceed with seeking bids for the Government Center Roof Top Units Replacement & Make Up Air Modifications. ARPA funds of \$292,415 were designated and approved as the funding source. Six bids were received on June 14, 2022 with the lowest bid being from Kraft Mechanical for \$350,200. KFI Engineers and staff have reviewed the proposal and confirmed their bid is valid and meets the scope of work. Staff recommended the County Board approve the contract with Kraft Mechanical for \$350,200 with the use of \$95,785 from the Building Contingencies Assigned Fund Balance.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT

Private Dock Leases. The Board directed staff to work towards a dock agreement for three landowners along the Byllesby Park trail at the April 18, 2023 County Board meeting. It was later determined that an easement was not an option, but the County could enter into a license agreement.

Staff recommended the County Board approve the Private Dock Licenses, and direct staff to prepare the documents for signatures and establish a yearly Private Dock License fee of \$300/year, for a five-year term, to include not more than two full-size boat lifts.

PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Early 2024 Equipment Order. County staff has been contacting equipment suppliers to obtain cost estimates for budgeting for 2024. One item in the 2024 Capital Plan for the Recycling Center is a new forklift. The supplier that staff contacted notified them of a lead time of approximately 50 weeks. Staff recommended authorization to follow the same process as past years and place an order for a forklift (\$27,000) that is both budgeted for and should be delivered in 2024.

Government Center Phase 1 Implementation. At the May 16, 2023 Committee of the Whole, Von Peterson from TSP and Goodhue County staff reviewed the Government Center Master Plan and the details of each of the phases. During that Committee of the Whole, staff received consensus and direction to obtain cost estimates to implement phase one. Staff recommended approval to proceed with the implementation which moves that are outlined below in phase one with the cost of approximately \$195,000 - \$280,000 to be paid using building contingency dollars.

- Facilities Maintenance and Information Technology moves to the first floor
- Land Use Management moves to 104 and reconfiguration takes place in 105/106

Summary

It is requested that the County Board approve and authorize the County Board Chair and County Administrator to sign the attached agreement.

Background

Arvig Enterprises is a company out of Perham, MN that provides communication services such as phone, internet, and fiber optics. The County entered into a lease agreement with Arvig in May of 2013 for a 10 foot by 10-foot space at our Kenyon Shop yard to install an equipment cabinet to house switching, control, and re-amplification equipment.

Arvig is requesting that we lease them space to install a 12 foot by 18-foot equipment building to replace the equipment cabinet. This agreement is an update to the original agreement approved by the County Board in 2013 for the equipment cabinet.

We met with staff from Arvig, the Sherriff's office, and MnDot to select a location for this building that will not interfere with the State's 800 MHz tower located on the Kenyon site.

Arvig will be paying the County \$3,800 a year with a 5% annual increase to rent space for this utility building. The County can terminate this agreement in the future if so desired.

It is the recommendation of staff that the County Board approve and authorize the County Board Chair and County Administrator to sign the attached agreement.

SITE LEASE AGREEMENT

This Site Lease Agreement ("Agreement") is made as of July 12th, 2023 by and between Goodhue County, a Minnesota municipal corporation ("County"), whose address is 509 West 5th Street, Red Wing, MN 55379, and Arvig Enterprises, Inc. a Minnesota Corporation ("Tenant"), whose address is 150 Second Street SW, Perham, MN 56573 for the leasing of certain County-owned property pursuant to the following terms:

1. PROPERTY. The County owns the property ("Property") described in Exhibit A, located at 1005 Hwy 60, Kenyon MN. Tenant desires to lease a 12' x 18' feet portion of the Property ("Leased Premises") to place the communications equipment shelter and slab described and depicted in Exhibit A-1 and A-2, to house remote switching, control and re-amplification equipment ("Communications Facilities"). The exact location of the communications shelter on the Leased Premises is subject to the County's reasonable approval.

2. TERM. The initial term of this Agreement shall begin on July 1st, 2023 ("Commencement Date on July 1st, 2023 ("Initial Term"). Tenant is allowed to enter the Property beginning May 1st, 2023 for purposes of commencing site preparation, placement of the cabinet, and installation of the Communications Facilities.

3. RENT.

A. <u>Rent Amount</u>. As consideration for this Agreement, Tenant shall pay to the County an annual rent in the amount of \$3800.00 for each year of the Initial Term plus any applicable sales tax. The annual rent for each year of the Initial Term and for each year of an Option Term is due and payable on May 1st of each year.

B. <u>**Taxes.**</u> Tenant will pay all property taxes (if any) assessed against the Property or the Leased Premises.

4. OPTION TERMS. Subject to the terms and conditions contained in this Agreement, this Agreement shall automatically renew for up to 4 additional and successive renewal terms of 5 years each (each, an "Option Term") unless Tenant gives the County written notice of Tenant's intention not to extend at least thirty 30 days before the expiration of the then-current term. The annual rent for the first Option Term shall be 5% higher than the annual rent for the Initial Term and the annual rent for each of the succeeding Option Terms shall be 5% higher than the annual rent for the immediately preceding Option Term.

5. USE.

A. <u>General.</u> Tenant shall use the Leased Premises solely for the purpose of placing, maintaining and operating a communications shelter to house remote switching, control and re-amplification equipment.

B. <u>Access to Leased Premises.</u> The County shall provide Tenant with access to the Leased Premises 24 hours per day, 7 days per week, except that County may require Tenant to make advance arrangements for access with a County-designated security official, which official will be available twenty-four (24) hours per day, seven (7) days per week. Tenant shall be fully liable for any and all loss, damage or claim associated with its use of the Leased Premises and access to the County's Property.

6. CONDITIONS

- **A.** The contractor that will be placing the communications shelter must complete a building permit application with the County's Building Inspections Division and a building permit must be issued if warranted by County building code before construction can begin. An electrical permit must also be obtained prior to commencement of construction.
- **B.** No advertising shall be displayed on or affixed to the building.
- C. Tenant is responsible for the maintenance and upkeep of the building.
- **D.** The exterior materials and colors of the building shall be similar to the exterior building depicted on Exhibit A-1.

7. UTILITIES. Payment for electric service, telephone or other utility services to the Leased Premises shall be Tenant's responsibility.

8. INSURANCE.

A. <u>Indemnity.</u> Tenant shall indemnify County and hold County harmless from and against any and all claims and demands relating to the negligence or misconduct of Tenant, its agents and employees, including the payment of reasonable attorneys' fees and costs for damages to property and injury or death to persons, including any payments made under any workers' compensation law or any plan for employees' disability and death benefits, which may arise out of or be caused by the installation, maintenance, presence, use or removal of Tenant's use of the Leased Premises, except as said claim or demand may arise out of or in any way result from the willful misconduct of County, its employees, agents or invitees.

B. <u>Workers Compensation.</u> Tenant must maintain Workers' Compensation insurance in compliance with all applicable statutes. The policy shall also provide Employer's Liability coverage with limits of \$500,000 bodily injury each accident, \$500,000 bodily injury by disease, policy limit, and \$500,000 bodily injury by disease, each employee.

C. <u>General Liability.</u> Tenant must maintain an occurrence form Commercial General Liability Coverage, including coverage for mobile equipment. Such coverage shall provide for third party bodily injury and property damage arising out of the use, maintenance, or operation of the Leased Premises. Tenant must maintain aforementioned Commercial General Liability Coverage with limits of liability of \$1,000,000 each occurrence; \$1,000,000 personal and advertising injury; \$5,000,000 general aggregate, and \$5,000,000 products and completed operations aggregate. These limits may be satisfied by the Commercial General Liability Coverage or in combination with an Umbrella or Excess Liability Policy, provided coverage afforded by the Umbrella or Excess Policy is no less than the underlying commercial General Liability Coverage.

D. <u>Automobile Liability.</u> Tenant must carry Commercial Automobile Liability Coverage. Coverage shall afford total combined single limits in the amount of \$1,000,000 per accident. The liability limits may be afforded under the Commercial Automobile Liability Policy, or in combination with an Umbrella or Excess Liability Policy provided coverage afforded by the Umbrella or Excess Policy is no less than the underlying Commercial Automobile Liability coverage. Coverage shall be provided for third party bodily injury and property damage arising out of the ownership, use maintenance or operation of all owned, non-owned, and hired automobiles. The Commercial Automobile Policy shall include at least statutory personal injury protection, uninsured motorists and underinsured motorists Coverages.

F. <u>Additional Insured - Certificate of Insurance.</u> Tenant shall provide, prior to tenancy, evidence of the required insurance in the form of a Certificate of Insurance issued by a company reasonably acceptable to County (rated A or better by A.M. Best), licensed to do business in the state of Minnesota, which includes all coverages required in this Paragraph. Tenant will name County as an Additional Insured on the Commercial General Liability and Commercial Automobile Liability Policies. The Certificate(s) shall provide that the coverage may not be canceled except in accordance with the terms of such policies.</u>

G. <u>Casualty</u>. Neither party shall be liable to the other (or to the other's Successors or assigns) for any loss or damage caused by fire or other casualty which could be insured against under the terms of standard fire and extended coverage (all risk) insurance policies, regardless of cause or origin, including fault or negligence of the other party or anyone for whom such party may be responsible.

9. TERMINATION.

A. <u>Termination Events.</u> Except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, this Agreement may be terminated, without any penalty or further liability, on 60 days' notice as follows:

- 1. by either party upon default of any covenant or term by the other party which default is not cured within sixty (60) days of receipt of written notice of default (without, however, limiting any other rights available to the parties pursuant to any other provisions in this Agreement); or
- 2. by Tenant if it is unable to obtain or maintain any license, permit or other governmental approval necessary to the construction or operation of the Communications Facilities.
- 3. by County, upon one (1) year's prior written notice to Tenant, if its County Board decides, for any reason, to re-use or redevelop the Property in a manner inconsistent with the continued use of the Leased Premises by Tenant.

B. <u>Site Restoration.</u> Upon expiration of this Agreement or if this Agreement is terminated or not renewed, Tenant shall have 90 days from the termination or expiration date to remove all of its facilities and equipment, including but not limited to the communication shelter and concrete pad. If those facilities are not removed to the reasonable satisfaction of the County, the County shall remove them and Tenant is responsible for all costs incurred by the County in doing so.

10. MAINTENANCE AND OPERATION PROPERTY.

A. <u>County Right to Operate.</u> County shall have the right to operate its facilities on the Property in such manner as will best enable it to fulfill its own service requirements. County shall not be liable to Tenant for any interruption of the service of Tenant or for interference with the operation of Tenant's use of the Leased Premises, unless due solely to the negligence or willful misconduct of County, its employees, agents, or invitees.

B. <u>Limitations of County's Liability.</u> If County negligently causes interruption of the business of Tenant or for any other County breach of this Agreement, County's liability for damages to Tenant shall be limited to the actual and direct costs of equipment removal, relocation or repair and shall specifically exclude any recovery for value of the business of Tenant as a going concern, future expectation of profits, loss of business or profit or related damages to Tenant.

11. HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES. Tenant represents and warrants that hazardous substances will not be generated, stored, disposed of or transported to, on, under, or around County's Property by Tenant. Tenant shall hold County harmless from and indemnify County against any damage, loss, expense, response costs, or liability, including consultant fees and attorneys' fees resulting from hazardous substances generated, stored, disposed of, or transported to, on, under, or around County's Property by Tenant or its employees, agents or contractors.

12. CASUALTY. If any portion of the Property is damaged by any casualty and such damage adversely affects Tenant's use of the Leased Premises, this Agreement shall terminate as of the date of the casualty if Tenant gives written notice of the same within thirty (30) days after Tenant receives notice of such casualty.

13. CONDEMNATION. If a condemning authority takes any portion of County's Property and such taking adversely affects Tenant's use of the Leased Premises in Tenant's sole determination, this Agreement shall terminate as of the date of the taking and County will be entitled to all the proceeds from such condemnation. Sale of all or part of the Property to a purchaser with the power of eminent domain in the face of the exercise of such power shall be treated as a taking by condemnation.

14. QUIET ENJOYMENT. Tenant, upon performance of its obligations under this Agreement, shall peaceably and quietly have, hold and enjoy the Leased Premises subject to primary use by the County for its maintenance facility.

15. MISCELLANEOUS.

A. <u>Authority: Title.</u> County represents and warrants that County has full authority to enter into this Agreement and that any person or entity executing in a representative capacity for County has full authority to do so. County represents that it will have good and marketable title to the Property and Leased Premises on the Commencement Date.

B. <u>Integration Amendment.</u> This Agreement supersedes all prior discussions and negotiations and contains all agreements and understandings between County and Tenant. This Agreement may only be amended in writing signed by all parties. All Exhibits are incorporated into this Agreement by reference. No provision of this Agreement will be deemed waived unless expressly waived in writing by the waiving party. No waiver shall be implied by delay or other act or omission of either party. No waiver by either party of any provisions of this Agreement shall be deemed a waiver of such provision with respect to any subsequent matter relating to such provision.

C. <u>Counterparts.</u> This Agreement may be signed in counterparts by the parties.

D. <u>No Assignment.</u> Tenant may not assign or transfer this Agreement at any time or sublease a portion of the Leased Premises without County's prior written consent, which will not be unreasonably withheld, conditioned or delayed; provided however, that Tenant may assign its interest to any affiliate, contract affiliate or entity commonly-owned by Tenant's parent company or to any successor-in-interest acquiring fifty-one percent (51 %) or more of its stock or assets.

G. <u>Notice.</u> Notices shall be in writing and sent by United States Mail, postage prepaid, certified or registered with return receipt requested or by courier service to the address set forth beneath the signature of each party below.

H. <u>Governing Law.</u> This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws of Minnesota.

I. <u>No Broker.</u> Tenant represents that they have not been represented by a real estate broker or other listing agent in connection with this Agreement in this transaction for purposes of commission, fee or other-payment to such broker or any other leasing agent claiming to have represented Tenant.

J. <u>Document Execution.</u> The parties shall cooperate with one another regarding any reasonable requests made subsequent to execution of this Agreement to correct any clerical errors contained in the Agreement and to provide any and all additional documentation deemed necessary to effectuate the transaction contemplated by this Agreement.

K. <u>Severability.</u> If any term of this Agreement is found to be void or invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the remaining terms of this Agreement, which shall continue in full force and effect.

L. <u>Headings.</u> Headings set forth in this Agreement are for convenience, only, and are not to be construed against the content of any paragraphs.

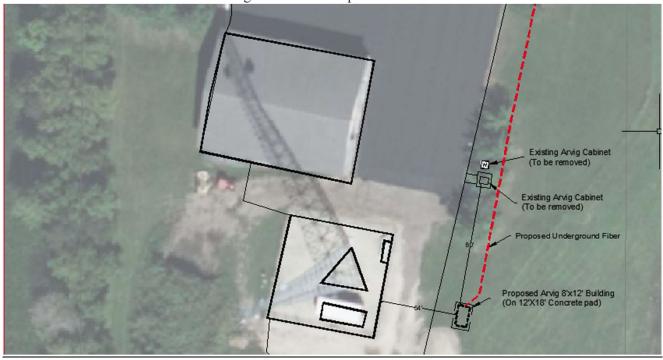

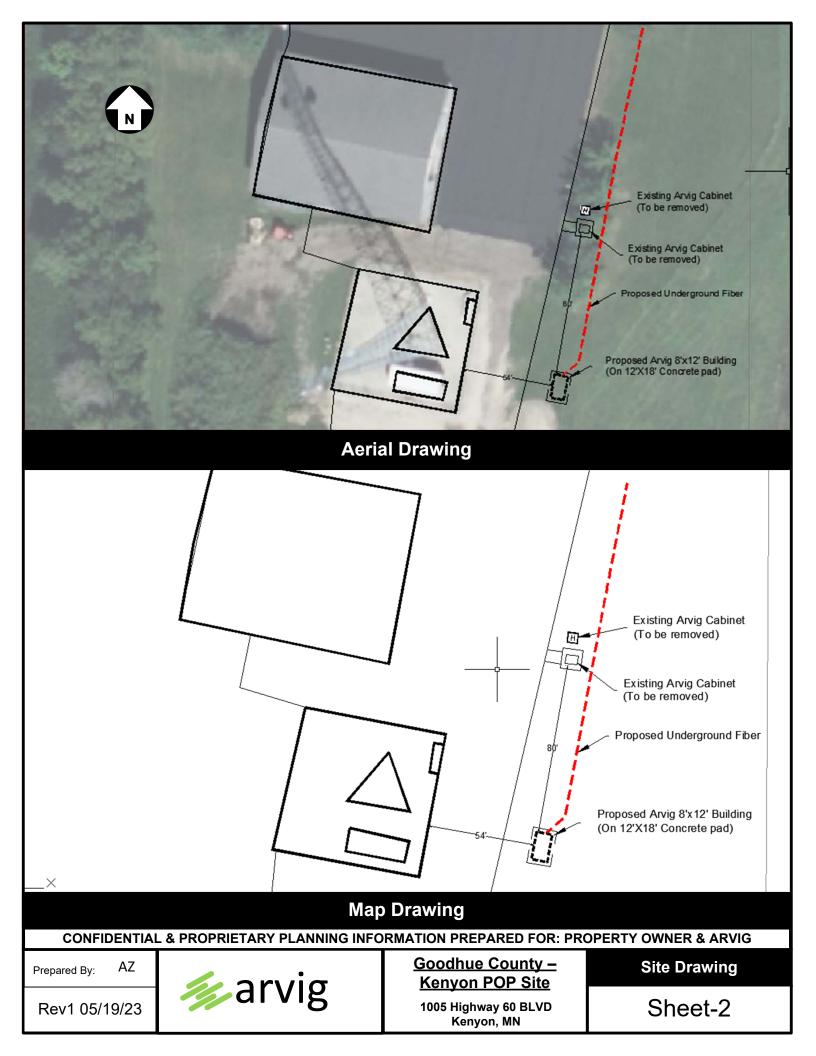
EXHIBIT A-1 Picture Depicting Tenant's Building Shelter is 8'x12'

Receiving close to roughly 400,000 visits a year, our website is the county's most publicly used communications tool. As the digital age has developed, the County has seen the public increase their reliance and usage of our website as much of our business with the public is conducted through our website. The website, truly, is a critical tool for the public, stakeholders, potential businesses, and even our employees.

The County website suffers from multiple faults, some of which County staff can control while others require additional resources to address. The front end of our website is limited in its accessibility to many users. Outside of this accessibility issue, the formatting of our current software provider is burdensome to the reader. This is even more profound of an issue when considering the non-adaptive nature of our website to personal devices. Additionally, staff have expressed frustration and a lack of ability to efficiently navigate and change our website due to the confusion of the backend processes.

With the rebranding of our County coming to a head, the decision of what steps to take with our website has become apparent. There are three options of which staff have identified:

Option #1: Utilize our current provider for a website refresh

- Written into our contract with our current software provider is the ability for a website refresh every four years. This refresh would update our website to reflect our branding and any other front-end stylistic changes we preferred.

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Option #2: Allocate Broadband ARPA funds for an RFP process for a new website software provider

- Allocating funds towards an RFP process would allow for the Communications Committee to explore alternative website software providers and potentially select an alternative to our current provider which better suits our needs and addresses our concerns.

Option #3: Stay the current course.

Recommendation

It is the recommendation of staff to approve of option #2. This would approve of a \$60,000 allocation of Broadband ARPA funded moneys for the purpose of establishing an RFP for the potential to contract with a new website software provider. This allocation will actually save the County roughly \$26,247 over the next four years. Our rational is as follows:

- It is money well allocated.
 - Most of this allocation will replace current and expected payments over the next five years, meaning the County is expected to save roughly \$16,527 over the next four years when considering the County will inevitably need to include an accessibility feature onto our website to become ADA compliant.

- Given the nature of the budgeting year, it is especially crucial to indicate that this money will not affect the levy nor any additional budgeting considerations needing decision by the board.
- Broadband funding is well covered by the County, State, and Federal government.
 - Goodhue County's ARPA funded Broadband Grant program, even after this request and the Broadband grant request in front of the board on the same day, will still be funded at \$441,533.
 - Broadband funding will still be plentiful and an allocation of \$60,000 from this segment of ARPA funds will not impact the mission and goals of both Goodhue County and local internet providers in expanding Broadband infrastructure.
- Staff will be able to focus on increasing savings with more friendly interfacing.

- As website software providers base their pricing around document uploads and page totals, staff are taking steps now to better manage content and website uploads alongside this allocation
- With this allocation staff will be able to take advantage of a more staff friendly user back end experience. Staff can then dedicate time to form a webmaster subcommittee of the Communications Committee to create posting website posting guidelines to decrease faulty information, take down dated and irrelevant pages/documents, and subsequently increase user experience and County savings. Meaning, our yearly subscription costs could go down – saving the County even more per year.
- With these guidelines and dedicated group of web content managers, the County will be able to cancel its subscription to SiteImprove Inc. which currently creates monthly reports on our broken links, misspellings, and page totals. Over the next four years this will save the County roughly \$9,200.
- Additionally, with a new communications plan in place the County will no longer rely upon its subscription to Dlvr.It which would automatically post job postings and news flashes from our website onto our social media accounts. This will save us \$520 over the next four years.

Background:

In 2021 the Goodhue County Board had earmarked \$1,600,000 for the expansion of Broadband service to unserved or underserved communities within Goodhue County. The funds initially came from the Federal program American Rescue Plan Act and Goodhue County established this Broadband program to be used by established companies through the use of qualifying grants. At this time four grants have been approved for a total amount of \$986,329, leaving \$613,671 remaining to be distributed.

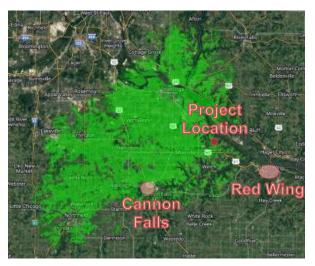
Through the County's second round of opening up the grant process, Southeast MN Wifi LLC has submitted a proposal for a project to take place in Welch Township. The project would serve 18 unserved passings and they are requesting **\$112,138** from the County or 48% of the total project which is \$236,080.

Discussion:

Southeast MN WiFi has been building high speed broadband networks since 2017 and serves hundreds of households and businesses. This proposed project would serve Ravenna Trail, 225th St., 155th Ave, and 230th St. for a total of 18 homes, farms and businesses in all. This equates to \$6,230 per passing which is slightly higher than our recent average but these appear to be unserved properties on numerous roads which creates more challenges.

Recommendation:

Staff is recommending approval of the Broadband Agreement Between Goodhue County and Southeast MN Wifi LLC in the amount of \$112,138.

GOODHUE COUNTY BROADBAND DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT BETWEEN GOODHUE COUNTY AND SOUTHEAST MN WIFI

THIS AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") is made and entered into this ______ day of ______, 2023 (the "Effective Date") by and between the County of Goodhue, (the "County"), 509 W Fifth St. Red Wing, Minnesota 55066 and Southeast MN Wifi, LLC, ("Southeast MN Wifi, LLC"), 314 Vermillion St., Suite 105, Hastings, MN 55033.

WHEREAS, the County has pledged \$112,138 (One-hundred twelve thousand one-hundred thirtyeight dollars) towards the construction of a fiber network to deliver broadband services in a portion of Welch Township (the "Project").

WHEREAS, the County has determined that Southeast MN Wifi, LLC is qualified and able to ensure timely and successful competition of the Project;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and understandings contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

1. **Project Scope.** Southeast MN Wifi, LLC shall perform all services and provide all staffing, equipment and materials, funding and other resources necessary to design, permit, make purchases for, construct and/or install the Project as set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u>. Southeast MN Wifi, LLC shall pay for all costs and expenses necessary to complete the Project, subject to partial reimbursement from the County provided in this Agreement. In accordance with the US Treasury's Interim Final Rule, Southeast MN Wifi, LLC ensures that the Project is designed to, upon completion:

- (i) Reliably meet or exceed symmetrical 100 Mbps download speed and upload speeds; or
- (ii) In cases where it is not practicable, because of the excessive cost of the project or geography or topography of the area to be served by the Project:
 - a. Reliably met or exceed 100 Mbps download speed and between at least 20 Mbps and 100 Mbps upload speed; and
 - b. Be scalable to a minimum of 100 Mbps download speed and 100 Mbps upload speed.

2. **Project Timing.** Southeast MN Wifi, LLC shall obtain all approvals for, and shall execute the Project, so that within 18 months after the Effective Date, the Project shall be completed; provided, however, that said timeframe may be extended by mutual written agreement of the parties.

3. Fee Schedule. County shall reimburse Southeast MN Wifi, LLC as follows:

3.1 <u>Contingencies</u>. Southeast MN Wifi, LLC shall resolve all project contingencies prior to invoicing for any reimbursements.

3.2 <u>Written Requests</u>. Southeast MN Wifi, LLC shall submit to the County written requests for reimbursement pursuant to this Agreement. Reimbursement may be requested when facility construction is completed.

3.3 <u>Reimbursement Timing</u>. The County shall issue full reimbursement to Southeast MN Wifi, LLC within thirty (30) days of receiving reimbursement request and completing the Broadband Compliance and Reimbursement Form.

3.4 <u>Withholding Requirements</u>. The County may withhold all or any portion of a reimbursement payment if they determine, in their reasonable discretion, that: (i) Southeast MN Wifi, LLC has not complied with applicable federal, state or local laws, ordinances or regulations in connection with its activities under this Agreement, (ii) Southeast MN Wifi, LLC has failed to obtain or maintain a necessary license or permit in connection with its activities under this Agreement, or (iii) Southeast MN Wifi, LLC has otherwise failed to comply with a material term or condition of this Agreement.

4. **Project Ownership.** The County are a partial funding source only, and have no right, title, obligation or interest in the Project, nor any control over the design, permitting, purchases, construction and/or installation, operation or maintenance of the Project. Southeast MN Wifi, LLC shall be solely responsible for the proper execution of and ongoing operation and maintenance of the Project, and will use that degree of care, knowledge and skill ordinarily exercised by other reputable professionals in the field under like circumstances within the State of Minnesota.

5. **Project Maintenance.** Southeast MN Wifi, LLC shall pay all costs and expenses associated with maintenance and operation of the Project and shall keep the Project and all portions thereof in a good, safe and useable condition.

6. **Project Use.** The Project to be funded pursuant to this Agreement shall remain property of Southeast MN Wifi, LLC.

7. **Licenses.** Throughout the term of this Agreement, Southeast MN Wifi, LLC shall possess or secure all licenses, permits, qualifications and approvals legally required to design, make purchases for, construct and/or install the Project and shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, ordinances and regulations. Prior to commencement of construction, Southeast MN Wifi, LLC shall obtain any and all land use and building entitlements necessary to complete the Project, including without limitation all zoning, development and site plan approvals, rights of entry, and appropriate building, environmental health or other permits.

8. **Relationship Between the Parties.** Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as creating the relationship of co-partners, joint ventures, or an association, nor shall Southeast MN Wifi, LLC, be considered an employee, agent or representative of the County.

9. **Insurance and Indemnification.**

9.1 <u>Indemnification by Southeast MN Wifi, LLC</u>. Southeast MN Wifi, LLC agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the County and their officers, officials, agents, volunteers and employees from any liability, claims, losses, damages, costs, judgments, or expenses, including reasonable attorneys' and other professional fees, resulting directly or indirectly from any negligent, tortious or illegal act or omission, including without limitation, professional errors or omissions by Southeast MN Wifi, LLC arising from the performance of its services pursuant to this Agreement, and against all loss by reason of the failure of Southeast MN Wifi, LLC to fully to perform all obligations under this Agreement.

9.2 <u>Indemnification by County.</u> County agree to indemnify and hold harmless Southeast MN Wifi, LLC from any liability, claims, losses, damages, costs, judgments, or expenses, including reasonable attorneys' and other professional fees, resulting directly or indirectly from any negligent, tortious or illegal act or omission by the County (including their officers, employees, agents and subcontractors) arising from the terms of this Agreement, and against all loss by reason

of the failure of the County, their agents, employees or subcontractors fully to perform all obligations under this Agreement.

10. Audit. Southeast MN Wifi, LLC shall maintain complete and accurate records with respect to costs incurred and services performed under this Agreement for a period of at least 7 (seven) years after the termination of this Agreement. Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 16C.05, Subd. 5, Southeast MN Wifi, LLC shall allow the County or other persons or agencies authorized by the County, including the Legislative or State Auditor, access to the records of Southeast MN Wifi, LLC at reasonable hours, including all books, records, documents, and accounting procedures and practices of Southeast MN Wifi, LLC relevant to the subject matter of the Agreement, for purposes of audit.

11. **Notice.** Any notices required or permitted to be given under this Agreement: (i) shall be in writing signed by or on behalf of the party making the same; (ii) shall be deemed given or delivered (a) if delivered personally, when received, (b) if sent from within the United States by registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested, on the third business day after mailing, or (c) if sent by messenger or reputable overnight courier service, on the next business day after mailing; and (iii) shall be addressed to each party at its address set forth in this Agreement, or at such other address as the parties shall designate in writing by personal delivery, certified mail, or overnight courier service.

12. **Termination and Suspension.** If either party materially breaches any of the terms and conditions of this Agreement and fails to cure such breach within thirty (30) days' written notice, the non-breaching party may terminate or suspend this Agreement. In the event either party exercises its right to suspend or terminate this Agreement, the non-breaching party shall submit written notice to the breaching party specifying the extent of the suspension or termination and the reasons therefore, and the date upon which suspension or termination becomes effective.

13. **Survival.** The provisions of this Agreement which, by their terms, impose obligations that are continuing in nature, and which must survive in order to give effect to their meaning will survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement, including, without limitation, the following clauses: Sections 7 (Licenses); 9 (Insurance and Indemnification); 10 (Audit); 14.3 (Governing Law; Jurisdiction; Venue).

14. **General Provisions.**

14.1 <u>Entire Agreement; Amendments; Conflicts</u>. This Agreement (including the exhibits attached hereto) constitutes the entire agreement and understanding of the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all prior and contemporaneous agreements, documents and proposals, oral or written, between the parties with respect thereto. Any amendment or modification to this Agreement shall not be valid unless such amendment or modification (i) is in writing and signed by authorized representatives of both parties and (ii) references this Agreement. The terms and conditions of the exhibits are integral parts of this Agreement and are fully incorporated herein by this reference.

14.2 <u>Compliance with Applicable Law</u>. Southeast MN Wifi, LLC agrees to comply with applicable federal, state and local laws or ordinances, and applicable rules, regulations, and standards established by any agency of such governmental units, which are now or hereafter promulgated insofar as they relate to Southeast MN Wifi, LLC's performance of the provisions of this Agreement.

14.3 <u>Governing Law; Jurisdiction; Venue</u>. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Minnesota, without regard to its conflict of laws rules. For the purpose of resolving conflicts related to or arising out of this Agreement, the parties expressly agree that venue shall be

exclusively in the State of Minnesota, County of Goodhue. The parties hereby expressly consent to the exclusive personal jurisdiction of the federal and state courts located in the State of Minnesota, regardless of the citizenship or residency of either party at the time of the commencement of any legal proceeding.

14.4 <u>Assignment</u>. Neither party shall assign its rights or delegate its duties under this Agreement without receiving the prior written consent of the other party.

14.5 <u>Successors in Interest</u>. The provisions of this Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties and their permitted successors and assigns.

14.6 <u>Severability</u>. In the event that any portion of this Agreement shall be held to be invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this Agreement.

14.7 <u>Execution</u>. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original and to constitute one and the same instrument. Electronic copies of this Agreement, including without limitation, those transmitted by facsimile or scanned to an image file, shall be considered originals.

Executive Summary Narrative

This middle mile project will serve 18 unserved households, farms and businesses in the Welch Township area of Minnesota. In a funding partnership with Goodhue County and Welch Township, the applicant will greatly improve unserved/underserved levels to at least 100 megabits per second download and 20 megabits per second upload, exceeding Minnesota's 2026 state speed goal. After completion customers will have access to 1000mbps down and 1000mbps up service. Building a Fiber to the Premise network that provides high speed broadband to households, businesses and farms in the proposed grant area improves access to critical school e-learning applications while also making agricultural operations more efficient and enhancing crop production through enabled precision agriculture tools. The broadband network will improve access to rural healthcare resources and will stimulate the local economy.

This project will bring high-speed broadband to Ravenna Trail, 225th St., 155th Ave., and 230th St.. All of these areas suffer from extremely limited and unreliable broadband access and are very desperate. 18 homes, farms and businesses will support this project, as demonstrated by our extensive list of support letters. Furthermore, many other homes in the area will have the opportunity to request this service after the middle mile is complete, and Southeast MN Wifi will work with those clients to build those sections of the network one by one.

Background:

The County Board has previously discussed and approved the ARPA Program and Budget knowing that it would require additional discussion and amendments. At this time, staff would like to bring the ARPA Budget back for further discussion and direction.

Discussion:

The result of the updates to the ARPA Budget are a net decrease to the Contingency/Other Government Services line by \$219,648. This decreases the total remaining balance to \$331,087. See the attached ARPA Budget for line item details.

Increases to the Contingency/Other Government Services line were caused by certain projects being completed under budget. This freed up \$156,137 as outlined below:

- 1. Board Meeting Minutes Scanning Project of \$80,307.
- 2. Parcel Split Information Scanning Project of \$50,972.
- 3. Personnel File Scanning Project of \$2,423.
- 4. Poll Pads Election Equipment of \$20,532.
- 5. Soil & Water Conservation District Equipment of \$1,903.

On June 20, 2023 the Board approved two separate items to be paid for out of Building Contingency Funds. These were \$95,785 of increased costs of Roof Top HVAC Units and up to \$280,000 related to the Government Center Master Plan Phase I Implementation. These items could be paid for utilizing ARPA funds rather than using reserve balances. The potential decrease to the Contingency/Other Government Services line would be \$375,785, if approved.

There are two other items being discussed at the Board Meeting today in which ARPA money will be requested. Both of those items would use funds previously allocated to the Broadband Infrastructure category and therefore will not impact the Contingency line item.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends the Board approve the changes to the ARPA Budget as presented.

Summary:

The Ordinance Subcommittee met twice in early 2023 to discuss amendments to the Zoning Ordinance for various definitions and replacing "Non-Agricultural Uses Associated with Agricultural Tourism" with "Rural Tourism". Staff brought these proposals and various background information to the Planning Commission in April and May for discussion and review before hosting a public hearing.

Article 10:

- Remove definition for <u>Agricultural Land</u> outdated
- Amend definition of <u>Agricultural Operation</u> to add *property primarily used for...* and agricultural processing provision clarification. An Agricultural Operation would be a property where the agricultural product is being raised or produced, not a facility primarily engaged in processing agricultural products.
- Add <u>Agricultural Processing</u> definition clarifies provision in Agricultural Operation definition.
- Remove <u>Non-Agricultural Related Products</u>
- Amend definition of <u>Agricultural Tourism</u> to reflect changes in the definition of <u>Farm</u> and <u>Agricultural Operation</u>
- Amend definition of <u>Farm</u> to modernize.
- Remove <u>Non-Agricultural Uses/Activities Associated with Agri-Tourism</u>. This will be replaced with <u>Rural Tourism</u>.
- Add definition for <u>Rural Tourism.</u>

Table of uses:

- Remove <u>Non-Agricultural Uses/Activities Associated with Agri-Tourism</u>
- Remove <u>Educational Farm Retreat</u>
- Add <u>Rural Tourism</u>

Table of Uses – Business & Industrial Districts:

- Add Bed and Breakfast Inn as a Conditional/Interim Use in Business Districts
- Add Rural Tourism as a Conditional/Interim Use in Business Districts.

Article 11:

- Section 13. Bed and Breakfast Inns remove language that is required for all Rural Tourism operations
- Remove Section 14. Educational Farm Retreat. The concept is like an AirBnB or VRBO which County Zoning does not regulate
- Section 24. Preservation of Farming Practices update definition for Agricultural Operation.
- Section 25. Retreat Centers remove language that is required for all Rural Tourism operations because Retreat Centers will be classified as Rural Tourism operations subject to all Rural Tourism performance standards and B&B performance standards.
- Section 30. Non-Agricultural Uses Associated with Agricultural Tourism will be replaced with Rural Tourism. Requirements for an application and most performance standards remain the same. B&Bs and Retreat Centers are called out specifically because they both have separate performance standards apart from the Rural Tourism standards they must also comply with. Amended some standards so they are only applicable to operations with 50+ guests because Retreat Centers may have a maximum of 50 guests and B&Bs are capped at 15 guests.

PAC Recommendation:

The Planning Advisory Commission recommends the County Board

- Adopt the staff report into the record;
- Accept the testimony, exhibits, and other evidence presented into the record; and

APPROVE the amendments to Articles 10 (Definitions), 11 (Performance Standards), and 20 (Table of Uses).

Commissioner Stenerson stated this doesn't change anything, as far as the number of houses allowed in the section or anything like that, correct?

Pierret stated that is correct.

Commissioner Miller said it just makes it one unit.

Vice-Chair Nystuen Opened the Public Hearing

No one spoke for or against the request.

⁷After Vice-Chair Nystuen called three times for comments it was moved by Commissioner Fox and seconded by Commissioner Miller to close the Public Hearing.

Motion carried 5:0 (Commissioner Huneke abstained)

⁸It was moved by Commissioner Gale and seconded by Commissioner Miller for the Planning Advisory Commission to:

- adopt the staff report into the record;
- accept the application, testimony, exhibits, and other evidence presented into the record; and

Recommend that the County Board of Commissioners **APPROVE** the request submitted by Ryan and Christyn Tipcke for the Preliminary and Final Plat of the proposed "Kolshorn Ridge Second" Plat comprising approximately 21,36 acres.

Motion carried 5:0 (Commissioner Huneke abstained)

Commissioner Huneke returned to the board.

PUBLIC HEARING: Consider Goodhue County Zoning Ordinance Updates

Proposed amendments to Article 10 (Definitions), Article 11 (Performance Standards), and Article 20 (Table of Uses) to amend definitions for Farm and Agricultural Operation, add a definition for Rural Tourism, remove Non-Agricultural Uses Associated with Agri-Tourism and replace with Rural Tourism, amend performance standards and the Table of Uses to correlate with the addition of Rural Tourism.

Pierret presented some background on these updates. The ordinance subcommittee has met twice this year to discuss this. Staff has also brought this proposal to the full Planning Commission twice. This request is to have the public hearing to replace Non-Agricultural Uses Associated with Agricultural Tourism with Rural Tourism. Non-Agricultural Uses Associated with Agricultural Tourism is how we have been permitting our Wedding Event Centers and things like that. This hasn't been working so we decided to go with Rural Tourism. Some definitions were also amended for Agricultural Operations to add "a property primarily used for" and for Agricultural Processing. The Table of Uses was also updated with Rural Tourism and with the removal of Educational Farm Retreat because it is very much like an Air B&B and the county does not regulate these. Also, clarifies some of the different uses of the Performance Standards for Rural Tourism such as Bed & Breakfast and Retreat Centers. The biggest point

of discussion that they will need clarification on is whether to allow Rural Tourism as a Conditional Use or Interim Use in the A-1 district or not. This is also a time when they can discuss anything else that goes with this.

Commissioner Stenerson said that in one spot in the language, under Rural Tourism, it includes A-1. Then in the table, we have not permitted Retreat Centers. Is that because Rural Tourism and Retreat Centers are not the same?

Pierret stated she left everything as it currently is in the Table of Uses. Retreat Centers are currently not permitted in the A-1 District. Non-Agricultural Uses Associated with Agricultural Tourism are currently conditional uses in A-1.

Commissioner Stenerson stated that a Retreat Center involves somebody staying overnight where a venue is different, it is entertainment.

Hanni said she believes that at Retreat Centers you can stay there for up to a week.

Commissioner Miller said he had one item he would like to discuss. Since they are talking about Wedding Venues, he thinks they should only be an IUP rather than a CUP. This would allow the County and the Township to review it in the event it changes hands.

Commissioner Stenerson agreed with Commissioner Miller on the IUP. However, he recalled an issue where they had to change their permitting policy because nobody could get financing to build a building with an IUP. He thinks the IUP gives them a lot more control but is concerned about running into a financing problem if they use an IUP on these.

Commissioner Miller said that is not the Board's problem.

Hanni stated that was for a solar project.

Vice-Chair Nystuen Opened the Public Hearing

Michelle Schroeder, 12100 Wild Turkey Road, Welch stated she is concerned about Rural Tourism where she lives. They were recently notified that someone purchased a neighbor's farm for the sole purpose of a business opportunity and do not plan on living there. She is concerned that something like this would be allowed in her neighborhood. With Rural Tourism, does that mean a neighbor can get a bird sanctuary and have cars from the cities come by and run around the lawn every day past all of the neighbors? The road is a dirt road. She did not move there to a quiet neighborhood, with no neighbors around, to have traffic come in.

Commissioner Stenerson asked Ms. Schroeder if she knows what zone she lives in.

Ms. Schroeder stated she is in A-1.

Commissioner Stenerson said Ms. Schroeder mentioned traffic. Other than traffic, is there anything more she could add as far as how she feels it is going to affect her? Where does she see the harm?

Ms. Schroeder stated that they have a very small gravel road with blind entrances. There are spots on the road where you cannot have two cars pass each other at the same time. There is always a lot

of farm equipment on the road. It has been private for generations and there is more and more traffic every day. What is happening up the road from them now is going to grow they fear.

Jim Derosier, 13075 Wild Turkey Road, Welch. He is concerned about Agricultural Tourism. He lives next door to this facility and they plan to have 75 to 110 students a week at a Folk School they will be constructing. Real estate agents have told him he would lose 30% of his market value. His insurance company told him he needs to increase his umbrella policy from 1.5 million dollars to 5 million dollars because of the risks. He wants to know how these definitions will affect Agricultural Tourism. The township board clerk, Jim Hedeen, recommended they come to talk to this board tonight. It's a concern in the neighborhood. There is a petition going around the neighborhood and right now 42 out of 45 people are against it. Traffic on the roads, maintenance of the roads, and overall safety are concerns.

Chuck Zervas, 29551 130th Avenue, Welch stated he has a concern with the changes to the language. Especially with the situation they are facing with the new property owners. This public hearing just came to their attention on Tuesday. He wanted to know if they would have an opportunity to review the proposed changes as he would like more time to review what the changes are. There are environmental concerns. They are talking about building housing facilities, which would require greater water use and septic systems. Safety and security will be affected because they will be bringing in people from all over the place. Even though this is agricultural property, it is still their neighborhood. It's where they live. He does not think it is right that any taxpayer can come in and change the livelihood of many of the residents. Tourism is great, but not in their neighborhood. They didn't move to this area to have strangers coming in and affecting their safety and security.

Tom Baumgart, 29431 130th Avenue, Welch, stated he is very concerned about what they have been told about this project. A meeting was held where they invited some of the neighbors, but not all of the neighbors. They plan on having a dormitory with a commercial kitchen, a greenhouse, day classes, and week-long classes, enhanced by camping and/or vehicle camping with a youth-type setting. The increased traffic and dust pollution is a concern, but also the security on the road of people driving by and posting it on Facebook and showing other people. As Facebook followers grow, they are looking more and more at the area and the people in the area. He has not been able to find a description of a Folk Home, and there is nothing on the county list indicating a Folk Home. That is why they are concerned. How many people can they have, what can they do and when can they do it? Until this is straightened out, they would like to put a restriction and a formal request in to put a cap that the owners are there an hour before an event, there during the entire time of the event, and there an hour afterward, or until the last person leaves. We all object to a business being put in our neighborhood. They are asking the county to put a hold on this. They asked Vasa Township and whatever direction they are given today they will follow up on.

Commissioner Stenerson stated that he wanted to make sure that people understand that the board is not here to change an ordinance one way or the other for something we have not even seen as a request. We don't even know what you are talking about. He is glad the group is there as the board talks about the general concepts of ordinances and how it affects people. He is glad they are sharing this information with the board but wanted to make sure that everyone understands that they are not there tonight to act on a certain proposal, they are just designing ordinances. He said he is curious if anyone who came to the meeting tonight to discuss this is in an A-1 zone and their primary

occupation is Agriculture. If anyone is a full-time Agriculture producer, he would appreciate hearing from them as well.

Mr. Baumgart stated that they were told by Vasa Township to come to this meeting to discuss. They were told that Goodhue County is sponsoring an Agricultural Artistic Sponsorship and that the people who own this land are working with the Red Wing Farmers Market and the Red Wing Arts for subsidizing. It is their understanding they have been planning this for a while and they want to know if they have an event scheduled.

Hanni stated the Red Wing Arts Council would not be the County. Red Wing Arts Council does different things around the area. They have had some issues where they have promoted some things and not had the proper permits.

Mr. Baumgart stated that is what they are concerned about. They told us there would be no alcohol being served, but they are bringing alcohol to a different venue. They are not doing it directly, they are having other people serve it. They would like some direction on how they should proceed to get this to the commissioners in whatever format they need because they are concerned that the changes that are being discussed will make it easier for them to have this Folk School.

Commissioner Fox stated that right now with Non-Agricultural Tourism in place, someone could apply for something and it would be easier than it would be if they made the proposed changes to the ordinance. Everyone is spending a lot of time voicing opinions but the Planning Advisory Commission is trying to tighten up the language so there is better control with an Interim Use Permit. If people tell them they don't want the Planning Advisory Commission to move forward, the applicant would have an easier time getting the Folk School approved without these changes. Right now, with Non-Agricultural Tourism, someone could come in with almost anything. If they have a better definition, they can say they want an Interim Use Permit, or they can say they can't figure out how this is going to fit.

Commissioner Miller said they are trying to tighten up the ordinances and revise the language. He also indicated that he does not think there is anything they could do about this issue at present.

Commissioner Fox said that right now they know nothing about this because nobody has brought anything to this group.

Mr. Baumgart asked if they come forward to request a Conditional Use Permit or an Interim Use Permit, who do they go to to ask for that?

Hanni stated that would be this group and then it would go to a public hearing.

Commissioner Fox said they can't comment on something that they haven't even brought forward.

Mr. Baumgart stated he is glad they are asking. They were told by Vasa to come here first because they just got the notice of the public hearing and said to go to this meeting.

Commissioner Stenerson said he is glad they are here, but they also need to understand that this board has no authority on that one issue. It is important that Vasa is directing them here because they are making decisions on whether to tighten the ordinance or not. And it is very helpful for them

to hear their concerns. Even though the Board cannot fix their particular problem, it gives the Board knowledge about how it is affecting people when they design ordinances. He would direct them to take concerns about something they have heard to Staff so something doesn't happen without permits. That's a whole separate issue, staff can assist in enforcing the ordinance but this board cannot because a permit has not been applied for. The information provided helps them determine if they should be tightening up the ordinances.

Chuck Zervas said the point is they had no idea why these changes were being made until it was just mentioned. They do not want this in their neighborhood. They are just wanting to make sure these changes are not going to make things easier for the applicant. It is clear that it is not going to make it easier. He would like to take some time to read it and see if he can understand it.

Michelle Schroeder asked what should a homeowner do if this business venture just keeps doing things. Can the homeowners come and request a meeting or have a hearing to ask what they should do about it?

Vice-Chair Nystuen said that those questions should be directed to the County Staff. They address issues if there is something that is non-conforming or if someone is not following the rules.

Ms. Schroeder asked what about the Arts Board.

Hanni stated staff would contact Red Wing Arts to ensure future arts events have the proper permits.

Ms. Schroeder stated that they can only have two permitted events a year.

Hanni stated that is what they are talking about now. They are trying to clarify the language so there is less interpretation and it's a little bit clearer and events that happen more than twice per year come through the Conditional Use Permit process.

Ms. Schroeder said they could do an event every month and call it something different.

Hanni stated at this point she would caution against any more discussion on something that the board has not seen.

Commissioner Huneke indicated that Staff can't actively search the County for non-conforming properties or uses. Most of the board members here had no idea what all is going on there. That's when you would call Staff, tell them what is happening and ask if they have the proper permits. That will draw Staff's attention to it and they can investigate further. If there is something that you don't think is right, that would be where you would start.

Vice-Chair Nystuen stated they are trying to address at this public hearing about changing the ordinance, not specific issues. They do appreciate everyone bringing it up, but the board doesn't know anything about it.

Hanni stated Folk Schools are not defined in the County Ordinance. As they get into the discussion of what Rural Tourism is, they try not to pin down specifics because it changes so much. There is some interpretation of that.

⁹After Vice-Chair Nystuen called three times for comments it was moved by Commissioner Huneke and seconded by Commissioner Miller to close the Public Hearing.

Motion carried 6:0

Commissioner Stenerson said he would like to come back to the argument he had on the first issue. When it comes to zoning, especially A-1, when they have a zone that they restrict to four residences, he has a problem anytime they just approve any form of request that is going to bring in large numbers of people, whether it's a venue or retreat center or something else. He doesn't think they are wrong for being in the county, he just feels there is a right place for them. He is not okay with using the highly protected A-1 zone. In A-2, probably in some places but not in others. He is okay with a Conditional Use Permit in an A-2. He is not in support of having venues in an A-1 Zone. If it is not directly related to Agriculture, it should not be in an A-1.

Commissioner Miller said he would not have a problem with that. But they would have to eliminate everything that is under "Institutional" in the Table of Uses from A-1. That includes community buildings, churches, cemeteries, memorial gardens, public schools, private schools, nursery schools, and funeral homes.

Commissioner Stenerson said he doesn't know about cemeteries, but anything that brings in large groups of people regularly probably doesn't belong in the A-1.

Commissioner Miller said he does not have a problem restricting it, but then you need to restrict everything from it, not be selective.

Hanni said to just keep in mind that if they don't allow Rural Tourism in A-1, they are making several existing businesses non-conforming. That means they won't be able to expand or do anything beyond their current operations. They have the Conditional Use and Interim Use process, which some were denied tonight and some were approved tonight. This is where they get into the details about whether it fits in the area. That is why there are public hearings, to get feedback. As far as the County is concerned, they like to be able to give landowners opportunities to do things. It is up to the board, the neighbors, and the public to say "Does this fit?", why does it or why doesn't it? She is relying on the Board having a public hearing and making some strong decisions one way or the other.

Commissioner Huneke agreed. It's a big County with different landscapes from one end to the other. He does not think they can blanket deny or blanket accept anything. It comes to this Board for a decision and the recommendation is passed on to the County Commissioners. He would not be in favor of canceling everything in A-1. Going more with Interim Uses so it can't just start changing hands all of a sudden may be the better option.

Commissioner Stenerson asked about the businesses that are already operating. They have changed policies in the past as the needs have changed. Yes, it has made people non-conforming or they cannot expand but maybe sometimes it should cease or they would have to come in with a variance request to explain why they should be the exception. He is concerned with just depending on the Conditional Use Permit process instead of absolute standards. If there were absolute standards, it makes it easier for anyone who wants to open a business to come in and ask if it is allowed or not. If

the ordinance states that they accept this type of operation but want it restricted or funneled to certain areas, the investors will have to look into those areas. There is some advantage to just saying no to certain things. The goal is to protect the ability to continue to make this a major agricultural production community.

¹⁰It was moved by Commissioner Miller and seconded by Commissioner Fox for the Planning Advisory Commission to:

adopt the staff report into the record, and recommend the County Board of Commissioners **APPROVE** the amendments to Articles 10 (Definitions), 11 (Performance Standards), and 20 (Table of Uses). With one change to update the Conditional Use Permit for all Wedding Venues, under Rural Tourism, to an Interim Use Permit, in all zones.

Hanni said they currently have it as CUP/IUP. In the past, depending on what the request was, the Board has given Staff direction that they don't want it as a CUP and recommended approval as an IUP. That gives the board a little flexibility too, because some of the requests might be a better fit as a CUP.

Commissioner Miller stated he is fine with changing it to CUP/IUP.

Commissioner Stenerson said that one of the things they tend to use with venues is an Operational Plan. That means they have assessed the individual and how they are planning on doing their plan. If a CUP is used on any of the requests, that means the next person that comes can continue the business. If an IUP is used, once a property is sold, it gives the Board the power to review and make sure the new owners have the same standards as the previous owners. We might want to consider strictly the IUP for that reason.

Commissioner Miller indicated that he believes that staff needs the flexibility of the CUP in there also. In case something is being developed that an IUP would not be appropriate for. He indicated that when Wedding Venues come up in particular, IUP is the direction he will want to go.

Commissioner Fox said he would reiterate that because Staff does a good job but they also have to remember to work with the Board. As far as seconding what Commissioner Miller moved, he would be willing to amend the motion to give the option for a CUP/IUP. Then the Board always has the option to use whichever one they think fits best for the particular request.

Motion carried 5:1 (Commissioner Stenerson opposed)

Other Discussion

Pierret stated that there will be another Public Hearing on the ordinance amendments on July 18th with the County Board. Notices will be sent out and will be posted on the County website.

ARTICLE 10 WORD USAGE AND DEFINITIONS

SECTION 1. WORD USAGE

For purposes of this Ordinance, certain terms or words used herein shall be interpreted as follows:

- Subd 1. The word "person" includes a firm, association, organization, partnership, trust, company or corporation as well as individual.
- Subd 2. The word "shall" is mandatory, and not discretionary, the word "may" is permissive.
- Subd 3. Words used in the present tense shall include the future; words used in the singular shall include the plural, and the plural the singular.
- Subd 4. The words "used for" shall include the phrases "arranged for", "designed for", "intended for", "maintained for", and "occupied for".
- Subd 5. All stated and measured distances shall be taken to the nearest integral foot. If a fraction is one-half (1/2) foot or less, the integral foot next below shall be taken.

SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS

When used in this ordinance, the following terms shall have the meanings herein assigned to them. Words used in this ordinance, but not defined therein, shall carry the meanings as defined in Webster's Unabridged Third International Dictionary or its successor volumes.

ABANDONED HOMESTEAD. A formerly established homestead that has since been abandoned.

ACCESSORY BUILDING. A subordinate building or structure on the same lot, or part of the main building, occupied by or devoted exclusively to an accessory use.

ACCESSORY DWELLING UNIT (ADU). Dwelling units that are accessory to a primary dwelling unit and are on the same tax parcel of land as the primary dwelling unit.

AGGREGATED PROJECT. See Article 18 (WECS)

AGRICULTURAL LAND. Land that was planted with annually seeded crops, was in a crop rotation seeding of pasture grasses or legumes, or was set aside to receive price support or other payments under United States Code, Title 7, Sections 1421 to 1469, six of the last ten years prior to January 1, 1991.

AGRICULTURAL OPERATION. A facility consisting of real or personal property primarily used for the production of crops including fruit and vegetable production, tree farming, livestock, poultry, dairy products, or poultry products, and associated processing of agricultural products produced by the operation. but not a facility primarily engaged in processing agricultural products. Agricultural processing for commercial use or sale shall not be the primary use of property at an Agricultural Operation. Agricultural operation shall also include certain farm activities and uses as follows: chemical and fertilizer spraying, farm machinery noise, extended hours of operation, manure collection, disposal, spreading or storing, open storage of machinery, feedlots, odors produced from farm animals, crops or products used in farming.

AGRICULTURAL PROCESSING. The practice of enhancing or improving the overall value of an agricultural product. The enhancement or improvement includes, but is not limited to, marketing, transforming, or packaging.

AGRICULTURAL PRODUCT. Includes, but is not limited to, crops (corn, wheat, hay, potatoes, soybeans); fruit (apples, peaches, grapes, cherries, berries, etc.); cider; vegetables (sweet corn, pumpkins, tomatoes, etc.); floriculture; herbs; forestry; husbandry; livestock and livestock products (cattle, sheep, hogs, horses, poultry, ostriches, emus, farmed deer, farmed buffalo, milk, eggs, and fur, etc.); aquaculture products (fish, fish products, water plants and shellfish); horticultural specialties (nursery stock, ornamental shrubs, flowers and Christmas trees); maple sap, honey, etc.

AGRICULTURAL PRODUCT, VALUE-ADDED. This means the enhancement or improvement of the overall value of an agricultural commodity or of an animal or plant product to a higher value. The enhancement or improvement includes, but is not limited to marketing, agricultural processing, transforming, or packaging, education presentation, activities, and tours.

AGRICULTURAL RELATED PRODUCTS. Means items sold at a farm market to attract customers and promote the sale of agricultural products. Such items include, but are not limited to all agricultural and horticultural products, animal feed, baked goods, ice cream and ice cream based desserts and beverages, jams, honey, gift items, foodstuffs, clothing and other items promoting the farms and agriculture in Goodhue County and value-added agricultural products and production on site.

NON-AGRICULTURAL RELATED PRODUCTS. Means those items not connected to farming or the farm operation, such as novelty t shirts or other clothing, erafts, and knick-knacks imported from other states or countries, etc.

AGRICULTURAL TOURISM. "Ag-tourism" and/or "Agri-tourism" means the practice of visiting an agribusiness, horticultural, farm—or agricultural operation, including, but not limited to, ana farm, orchard, vineyard, winery, greenhouse, hunting preserve, a companion animal or livestock show, for the purpose of recreation, education, or active involvement in the operation, or participation in an agricultural related use other than as a contractor or employee of the operation.

AGRICULTURAL USE. The use of land for agricultural purposes, including farming, dairying, pasturage agricultural, forestry horticulture, viticulture, and animal and poultry husbandry and the necessary accessory uses for packing, treating and storing the produce; provided, however, that the operation of any such accessory uses shall be secondary to that of the normal agricultural activities.

AGRICULTURAL RELATED USE. Means activities that are accessory to the principal use of the property for permissible agriculture use that predominantly use agricultural products, buildings or equipment including activities, events or uses that represent "agricultural tourism" in Goodhue County as defined in this section, including but not limited to:

- A. Bakeries selling baked goods containing produce grown primarily on site
- B. Barn dances
- C. Corn mazes or straw bale mazes
- D. Educational events including but not limited to: activities associated with the promotion of wine usage, viticulture or viniculture classes, historical agricultural exhibits, and farming and food preserving classes.
- E. Gift shops for the sale of agricultural products and agriculturally related products.
- F. Petting farms, animal display, and pony rides

dwelling shall be allowed to become permanent, nor shall it give rise to a right to create a separate building site.

DWELLING, REPLACEMENT SITE. A site currently occupied by a legally established existing dwelling, whether habitable or uninhabitable, that may be continued as a dwelling site, regardless of the maximum density standard of the applicable zoning district.

EDUCATIONAL FARM RETREAT. An educational farm retreat shall be construed to mean any dwelling occupied in such a manner that certain rooms in excess of those used by members of the family, as herein provided, and occupied as a home or family unit, are rented with cooking facilities, to the public for compensation and catering primarily to the traveling public. The purpose of the Educational Farm Retreat is to provide a lodging experience that provides an opportunity for guests to learn about the operations of a working farm.

EDUCATIONAL FARM RETREAT UNIT. Educational farm retreat room in a grouping to include not more than two bedrooms, kitchen or kitchenette, and bathroom.

EQUAL DEGREE OF ENCROACHMENT. A method of determining the location of floodway boundaries so that floodplain lands on both sides of a stream are capable of conveying a proportionate share of flood flows.

EMPLOYEE, NON-RESIDENT. Persons employed by a home business not residing within the principal dwelling.

ESSENTIAL SERVICES. These uses include poles, towers, telephone booths, wires, cables, conduits, vaults, pipes, mains, pipelines, laterals, stations, substations or other associated or similar transmitting distributing or regulating facilities of a public utility.

EXCAVATION. See Article 14 (Mineral Extraction)

EXTRACTIVE USE. The use of land for surface or sub-subsurface removal of sand, gravel, rock, industrial minerals, other non-metallic minerals, and peat not regulated under Minnesota Statutes, Sections 93.44 to 93.51.

FAA. See Article 17 (WCF)

FALL ZONE. See Article 18 (WECS)

FCC. See Article 17 (WCF)

FAMILY. A family is any number of persons living together in a room or rooms comprising of single housekeeping unit and related by blood, marriage, adoption, or any unrelated person who resides therein as though a member of the family including the domestic employees thereof. Any group of persons not so related but inhabiting a single house, shall for the purpose of this Ordinance, be considered to constitute one family for each five (5) persons, exclusive of domestic employees, contained in each such group.

FARM. A tract of land principally used for agriculture activities including, but not limited to, the production of cash crops, livestock, or poultry farming. Farms may include dwellings and accessory buildings necessary to the operation of a farm.Real estate consisting of at least forty (40) acres with a minimum of at least twenty (20) acres eropland. Smaller acreage shall qualify as a farm if at least fifty (50) percent of the total net family income of the owner is derived from agricultural production in the preceding two tax years.

A. A tree farm would qualify if registered with the State of Minnesota and has forty (40) acres of tree coverage.

FARM MARKET/ON-FARM MARKET/ROADSIDE STAND. Means the sale of agricultural products or value-added agricultural products directly to the consumer from a site on a working farm or any agricultural, horticultural or agribusiness operation or agricultural land.

FARMYARD. The area of a farm immediately around the farm residence where accessory buildings are located and are being used exclusively for agricultural operations.

FARM WINERY. See Article 11 (Farm Wineries)

FEEDER LINE. See Article 18 (WECS)

FEEDLOT. Lot or building or combination of lots and buildings intended for the confined feeding, breeding, raising or holding of animals and specifically designed as a confinement area in which manure may accumulate, or where the concentration of animals is such that a vegetative cover cannot be maintained within the enclosure. For purposes of this Ordinance, open lots used for the feeding and rearing of poultry (poultry ranges) shall be considered to be animal feedlots. Pastures shall not be considered animal feedlots under these rules. Other definitions relating to feedlots are found in Minnesota Pollution Control Agency's Rules 7020 For The Control of Pollution From Animal Feedlots. These rules are adopted by reference in this Ordinance.

FLOOD. See Article 32 (Floodplain District)

FLOOD FREQUENCY. See Article 32 (Floodplain District)

FLOOD FRINGE. See Article 32 (Floodplain District)

FLOODPLAIN. See Article 32 (Floodplain District)

FLOOD-PROOFING. See Article 32 (Floodplain District)

FLOODWAY. See Article 32 (Floodplain District)

FLOOR AREA, GROUND. See Article 32 (Floodplain District)

FOREST LAND CONVERSION. The removal of forested lands to prepare for a new land use other than reestablishment of a subsequent forest stand.

FORESTRY. The use and management, including logging, of a forest, woodland or plantation and related research and educational activities.

GARAGE, PRIVATE. An accessory building designed or used for the storage of not more than three (3) motor driven vehicles owned and used by the occupants of the building to which it is accessory.

GASOLINE SERVICE STATION. A building or structure designed or used for the retail sale or supply of fuels, lubricants, air, water and other operating commodities for motor vehicles, and including the customary space and facilities for the installation of such commodities on or in such vehicles, but not including special facilities for the painting, repair, or similar servicing thereof.

GENERATOR NAMEPLATE CAPACITY. See Article 18 (WECS)

HIGH POWER TRANSMISSION LINE. See Article 17 (WCF)

HOME BUSINESS. A business, profession, occupation or trade for gain or support conducted by an owner-occupant on the same parcel as the principal dwelling, which is incidental and secondary to the principal use of the premises.

LOT WIDTH. The horizontal distance between the side lot lines, measured at the two points where the building line, or setback, intersects the side lot lines.

LOT LINES. The lines bounding a lot as defined in this Ordinance.

LOWEST FLOOR. See Article 32 (Floodplain District)

MANUFACTURED HOME. See Article 32 (Floodplain District)

MANUFACTURED HOUSING. A manufactured building or portion of a building designed for long-term residential use.

MAXIMUM DENSITY. A density standard establishing the maximum number of dwellings allowed in a Section, ¹/₄ ¹/₄ Section, District, or Subdivision. In order to maintain a balance of compatible uses, when the maximum density has been reached, the only opportunity to increase the density is through a change of zone process that would allow additional housing. Reestablished abandoned homestead sites are not included in the density count until they have been approved and permitted.

MIGRATORY LABOR CAMP. Temporary facilities provided by the employer on his own land for the housing of workers who for seasonal purposes are employed in the planting, harvesting, or processing of crops.

MINERAL EXTRACTION, ACCESSORY USE. See Article 14 (Mineral Extraction)

MINERAL EXTRACTION, PRINCIPAL USE. See Article 14 (Mineral Extraction)

MINERAL EXTRACTION. See Article 14 (Mineral Extraction)

MINERAL EXTRACTION FACILITY. See Article 14 (Mineral Extraction)

MINERAL EXTRACTION PERMIT. See Article 14 (Mineral Extraction)

MINERAL RESOURCE. See Article 14 (Mineral Extraction)

MINING TECHNICAL EVALUATION PANEL. See Article 14 (Mineral Extraction)

MINING/EXCAVATION OPERATION. The removal of stone, sand, and gravel, coal, salt, iron, copper, nickel, petroleum or other material from the land for commercial, industrial, or governmental purposes.

MOBILE HOME. Manufactured housing built on a chassis.

MOBILE/MANUFACTURED HOME PARK. This term applies to any lot or tract of land upon which two (2) or more occupied trailer coaches or mobile homes are harbored either with or without charge and including any building or enclosure intended for use as a part of the equipment of such park.

NACELLE. See Article 18 (WECS)

NON-AGRICULTURAL USES/ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATED WITH AN AGRI-TOURISM USE. This means activities that are part of an agri-tourism operation's total offerings but not tied to farming or the farm's buildings, equipment, fields, etc. Such non-agriculturally related uses include but are not limited to:

- A. Temporary Amusement rides associated with an event
- B. Art or cultural related festivals
- C. Gift shops for the sale of non-agricultural products
- D. Benefit events

- E. Kitchen facilities, processing/cooking items for sale (subject to State of Minnesota, Department of Public Health standards) including eating establishments such as restaurants or eafés.
- F. Temporary camping (subject to State of Minnesota Department of Public Health Standards for Recreation Camping)
- G. Wedding ceremonies or receptions
- H. Wine and eatered food events
- I. Reunions
- J. Concerts
- K. Social gatherings or similar types of events.

NON-CONFORMING LOT OF RECORD. Any legal lot of record that at the time it was recorded fully complied with all applicable laws and ordinances but which does not fully comply with the lot requirements of this Zoning Ordinance concerning minimum area or minimum lot width.

NON-CONFORMING STRUCTURE. A structure the size, dimensions or location of which was lawful prior to the adoption of this Zoning Ordinance, but which fails by reason of such adoption, or subsequent revisions or amendment, to conform to the present requirements of the zoning district.

NON-PREVAILING WIND. See Article 18 (WECS)

NORMAL WATER LEVEL. The level evidenced by the long-term presence of surface water as indicated directly by hydrophytic plants or hydric soils or indirectly determined via hydrological models or analysis.

OBSTRUCTION. Any dam, wall, wharf, embankment, levee, dike, pile, abutment, projection, excavation, channel, modification, culvert, building, wire, fence, stockpile, refuse, fill, structure, matter in, along, across, or projecting into any channel, watercourse, or regulatory floodplain which may impede, retard or change the direction of the flow of water, either in itself or by catching or collecting debris carried by such water.

ODOR. The odor of growing vegetation, domestic fertilizers, animal manures, insecticides, and other agricultural odors shall not be considered objectionable.

OPEN SPACE. Land that is permanently protected from future dwelling development. Land that is designated as Open Space may be used for such purposes as agricultural, forest, recreational uses, or demonstrate the use is protecting natural resources, maintaining or enhancing air or water quality, or preserving the historical, architectural, archaeological, or cultural aspects of the real property.

OPERATOR. See Article 14 (Mineral Extraction)

ORDINARY HIGH WATER LEVEL. The boundary of public waters and wetlands and shall be an elevation delineating the highest water level which has been maintained for a sufficient period of time to leave evidence upon the landscape, commonly that point where the natural vegetation changes from predominantly aquatic to predominantly terrestrial. For watercourses, the ordinary high water level is the elevation of the top of the bank of the channel. For reservoirs and flowages, the ordinary high water level is the operating elevation of the normal summer pool.

OWNER. Any individual, firm, association, syndicate, partnership, corporation, trust or any other legal entity having a proprietary interest in the land.

any increase in flood heights contributable to encroachment on the floodplain. It is the elevation to which uses regulated by this Ordinance are required to be elevated or flood-proofed.

RETREAT CENTER. A private facility or facilities oriented to using the natural features and outdoor character of the area to offer professional, educational, recreational or religious meetings, seminars, workshops, or gatherings which may provide meals, temporary lodging, and passive recreation for visitors and may include multiple related uses managed as one operation.

RIGHT-OF-WAY. A strip of land acquired by reservation, dedication, forced dedication, prescription or condemnation and intended to be occupied or occupied by a road, crosswalk, railroad, electric transmission lines, oil or gas pipeline, and other similar uses.

RIGHT-OF-WAY LINES. The lines that form the boundaries of a right-of-way.

ROTOR. See Article 18 (WECS)

ROTOR BLADES. See Article 18 (WECS)

ROTOR DIAMETER. See Article 18 (WECS)

RURAL TOURISM. Business which attracts visitors to rural areas of Goodhue County using the rural outdoor environment for attractions that include, but are not limited to, retreats, weddings, receptions, bed and breakfasts, educational events, and holiday celebrations.

SCREENED. When a structure is built or placed on a lot or vegetation is planted such that when the structure is built, it is visually inconspicuous as viewed from the river during the summer months. Visually inconspicuous means difficult to see or not readily noticeable in summer months as viewed from the river.

SELF-SERVICE STORAGE FACILITY. Real property designed and used for the purpose of renting or leasing secure outdoor storage space and/or self-contained indoor individual storage spaces to customers who have access for the purpose of storing and removing personal property.

SENSITIVE AREAS. Shoreland, Floodplains, wetlands, bluff impact zones, bluff protection areas, and the Cannon River Recreational and Scenic Districts.

SETBACK. The minimum horizontal distance between a structure or sewage treatment system and the ordinary high water level or between a structure or sewage treatment system, toe or top of a bluff, bluffline, road, highway or property line.

SES (SOLAR ENERGY SYSTEM). See Article 19 (SES)

SES, GRID-INERTIE. See Article 19 (SES)

SES, GROUND MOUNTED. See Article 19 (SES)

SES, COMMERCIAL. See Article 19 (SES)

SES, OFF-GRID. See Article 19 (SES)

SES, RESIDENTIAL. See Article 19 (SES)

SES, UTILITY SCALE. See Article 19 (SES)

SES, UTILITY-SCALED. See Article 19 (SES)

SEWAGE TREATMENT SYSTEM. A septic tank and soil absorption system or other individual or cluster type sewage treatment system as described and regulated in Section 5.8 of this Ordinance.

Commissioners have been met as determined by the Planner/Zoning Administrator. In the instance of renewal due to property ownership transfer; if the home business will continue under the same circumstances presented at the time of approval, an administrative approval may be permitted.

- G. If the permit is expired more than 30 days and the permit has not been renewed, the permit is null and void and a new interim use permit must be granted for the use to continue.
- H. Any subdivision of land separating the business buildings and/or operations from the principal dwelling shall result in revocation of the IUP.
- I. The home business shall be proximate to the associated principal dwelling.
- J. No more than two home businesses shall be permitted on a single parcel. The total space allowed for two home businesses combined shall not exceed the maximum allowed for a single home business.
- K. Such other conditions as specified by the Planning Advisory Commission pursuant to Article 4.

Subd. 4. **PERMITTED USES AND INTERIM PERMITTED USES:** Home Businesses shall be allowed as shown in the table below.

SECTION 13. BED & BREAKFAST INNS

Subd. 1. The following standards shall apply to all Bed & Breakfast Inns:

- A. The parcel shall meet the minimum size standards for the applicable zone.
- B. Breakfast may be served to overnight guests only.
- C. Maps identifying property limits shall be provided to guests.
- D. Maximum occupancy shall not exceed 15 guests.
- E. A maximum of 6 designated guest rooms is allowed.
- F. No cooking facilities shall be allowed in guest rooms.
- G. All guest rooms shall be contained within the principal or accessory dwelling.
- H. Proof of a compliant septic system shall be required as part of the application.

I. The property shall provide adequate off-street parking.

J.<u>H.</u> Any existing buildings in which the public may have access shall obtain all applicable Building Code approvals prior to being utilized as part of a Bed & Breakfast facility.

SECTION 14. EDUCATIONAL FARM RETREAT

Conditionally permitted in A-1, A-2, and A-3. The following standards shall apply to all Educational Farm Retreat:

- Subd. 1. They must be part of an owner occupied single family dwelling.
- Subd. 2. Maximum length of stay for guests shall be limited to two weeks.
- Subd. 3. No more than two Educational Farm Retreat units shall be permitted per property.
- Subd. 4. That Educational Farm Retreat units may not be converted into permanent dwelling units.
- Subd. 5. Owner must show proof of liability insurance.
- Subd. 6. An annual inspection by the Fire Marshall and Public Health Services must be performed.
- Subd. 7. The property must have adequate parking.
- Subd. 8. The farm owner/operator must provide an educational and interpretive program to educate guests on the farm operations.

SECTION 15. OFF-STREET LOADING AND UNLOADING REQUIREMENTS

On the premises with every building, structure or part thereof, erected and occupied for manufacturing, storage, shopping center, laundry or other uses similarly involving receipt or distribution of vehicles or materials or merchandise, there shall be provided and maintained on the site adequate space for the required number of ten (10) foot by twenty-five (25) foot berths.

- Subd. 1. For Educational and Religious Uses. One (1) berth for each building containing ten thousand (10,000) square feet of gross floor area to two hundred thousand (200,000) square feet of gross floor area, plus one/each additional two hundred thousand (200,000) square feet of gross floor area.
- Subd. 2. For Health and Medical Institutions. One (1) berth for each building containing ten thousand (10,000) square feet to one hundred thousand (100,000) square feet plus one/each additional one hundred thousand (100,000) square feet.
- Subd. 3. Commercial. One (1) berth for each building containing forty thousand (40,000) square feet.
- Subd. 4. Industrial. One (1) berth for each building containing forty thousand (40,000) square feet. Two (2) berths each building containing forty thousand (40,000) square feet to one hundred thousand (100,000) square feet.

SECTION 16. OFF-STREET PARKING REQUIREMENTS

In all zoning districts, off-street parking facilities for the storage of self-propelled motor vehicles for the use of occupants, employees, and patrons of the buildings or structures hereafter erected, altered or extended after the effective date of this Ordinance shall be provided and maintained as herein prescribed.

Subd. 1. In the case of a use not specifically mentioned, the requirements for off-street parking facilities for a use which is so mentioned and which said use is similar, shall apply.

- B. Is the action likely to have disruptive effects such as generating traffic and noise?
- C. Are there public questions or controversy concerning the environmental effects of the proposed actions?
- Subd. 5. Enforcement and Penalty.
 - A. No permit shall be issued for a project for which environmental documents are required until the entire environmental review procedures established by this Ordinance are completed.
 - B. Any person who violates any provision of this Ordinance is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding seven hundred (700) dollars or imprisonment for ninety (90) days or both. Each day that the violation is permitted to exist constitutes a separate offense.
 - C. No work shall commence and any work in progress on any project for which environmental documents are required shall cease until the environmental review procedures established by this Ordinance are fully complied with.

SECTION 24. PRESERVATION OF FARMING PRACTICES

It is the declared policy of this County to enhance and encourage agricultural operations within the County.

Where non-agricultural land uses extend into agricultural areas or exist side by side, agricultural operations may be the subject of private nuisance complaints that would result in the cessation or curtailment of operations. Such actions discourage investments in farm improvements to the detriment of adjacent agricultural uses and the economic viability of the County's agricultural industry as a whole.

It is the purpose and intent of this section to reduce the loss to the County of its agricultural resources by limiting the circumstances under which agricultural operations may be considered a nuisance.

Agricultural production that complied with all Goodhue County Ordinances, shall not be considered by this County as constituting a nuisance.

This Ordinance is not to be construed as in any way modifying or abridging the State law, rather, it is only to be utilized in the interpretation and enforcement of the provisions of this code and County regulations.

Subd. 1. AGRICULTURAL OPERATION. A facility consisting of real or personal property primarily used for the production of crops including fruit and vegetable production, tree farming, livestock, poultry, dairy products, or poultry products, and associated processing of agricultural products primarily produced by the operation. but not a facility primarily engaged in processing agricultural products. Agricultural operation shall also include certain farm activities and uses as follows: chemical and fertilizer spraying, farm machinery noise, extended hours of operation, manure collection, disposal, spreading or storing, open storage of machinery, feedlots, odors produced from farm animals, crops or products used in farming.

- Subd. 2. **ESTABLISHED DATE OF OPERATION.** For the purposes of this section, the established date of operation shall be the date on which the agricultural operation commenced.
- Subd. 3. **AGRICULTURAL OPERATION NOT A NUISANCE.** An agricultural operation which continues without interruption or change shall not become a private nuisance if the operation was not a nuisance at its established date of operation. The provisions of this subdivision do not apply:
 - A. To a condition or injury which results from the negligent or improper operation of an agricultural operation or from operations contrary to commonly accepted agricultural practices.
 - B. To applicable State or local laws, ordinances, rules or permits.
 - C. When an agricultural operation causes injury or direct threat or injury to the health or safety of any person.
 - D. To the pollution of, or change in the condition of, waters of the State or the water flow of waters on the lands of any person;
 - E. To an animal feedlot facility of one thousand (1,000) or more animal units.

SECTION 25. RETREAT CENTERS

- Subd. 1. The following standards shall apply to all Retreat Centers:
 - A. A proposed schedule of events and any proposed special events, which consist of any events not part of the normal operating schedule.
 - B. Contact information for caretaker(s) on duty and on site and the times they are present.
 - C. Provide a general floor plan indicating the units to be used for the retreat center (in which the public may have access).
 - D. Maps identifying property limits shall be provided to guests.
 - E. The PAC may require installation of property boundary indicator signs along property boundary lines in accordance with Goodhue County Ordinance Sign regulations.
 - F. Retreat units shall not be converted into permanent dwelling units, unless an application is approved showing that the units meet the requirements of the Zoning Ordinance, Building Code, and Environmental Health regulations.
 - G. The maximum stay of the occupants shall not exceed two weeks, unless otherwise established by the IUP/CUP.
 - H. Allow periodic inspections by the Land Use Management Department, Environmental Health Department, and Fire Marshall.
 - I. Any existing buildings in which the public may have access shall obtain all applicable Building Code approvals prior to being utilized as part of a Retreat Center.
 - J. Proof of liability insurance for the structures, property, occupants, visitors, and events shall be maintained.

K. Adequate off-street parking shall be provided.

<u>L.K.</u> Maximum capacity shall not exceed 50 guests.

M. Proof of a compliant septic system shall be required as part of the application.

SECTION 26. KENNELS

- Subd. 1. Application and standards. In addition to the other requirements, the application for conditional use permit shall be accompanied by 25 copies of the plans, which indicate or address the following:
 - A. The stated purpose for the kennel;
 - B. The species and maximum number of animals that will be at the site (include all animals over the age of 28 weeks on the property);
 - C. All animals at the property must have current vaccinations. Records need to be kept on-site, or at an identified veterinarian office, and produced immediately upon request;
 - D. Location and size of all existing and proposed physical improvements such as buildings, landscaping, parking areas, etc.;
 - E. Location of existing or proposed indoor/outdoor runs;
 - F. Plans for sanitary sewage disposal, water systems (natural or manmade), and utilities servicing the site;
 - G. Show the existing and proposed surface drainage;
 - H. Existing or proposed location for overhead lighting;
 - I. Location and width of all streets abutting the site;
 - J. The kennel facility must have proper heating, cooling, ventilation and lighting:
 - 1. Confinement areas must be maintained at a temperature suitable for the animal involved.
 - 2. An indoor confinement area must be ventilated. Drafts, odors, and moisture condensation must be minimized. Auxiliary ventilation, such as exhaust fans, vents, and air conditioning, must be used when the ambient temperature rises to a level that may endanger the health of the animal.
 - 3. An indoor confinement area must have at least eight hours of illumination sufficient to permit routine inspection and cleaning.
 - K. The kennel construction material must be impervious to water and odor and easily cleanable;
 - L. A manure management plan describing manure pick up and disposal;
 - M. All structures shall require a building permit;
 - N. Existing buildings used as any part of the kennel (in which the public may have access) must pass building code inspections prior to it being utilized by the kennel;
 - O. Any licenses or permits required by Environmental Health including but not limited to: water supply and septic systems.

SECTION 30. <u>RURAL TOURISM</u> NON-AGRICULTURAL USES ASSOCIATED WITH AGRICULTURAL TOURISM

- Subd. 1. Non-agriculturally related uses that are associated with Agricultural Tourism as defined in Article 10 (Definitions) <u>Rural Tourism events</u> may be permitted in the A-1, A-2, or A-3 Zone Districts <u>with an approved zoning permit at the discretion of the subject to approval</u> <u>subject to approval of a zoning permit by the Zoning Administrator for up to two (2)</u> events/activities per calendar year. The right to utilize property for more than two events/activities per calendar year is subject to approval of a conditional use permit or an interim use permit by the Board of County Commissioners. The following information must be provided with a zoning permit, interim use or conditional use permit. In addition to submittal requirements set forth Article 4 (Conditional and Interim Uses), the following information must be provided with a conditional use permit or interim use permit application.
 - A. Plan drawn to an appropriate scale for effective interpretation.
 - B. Property boundaries, onsite parking areas and access roads.
 - C. Existing uses on adjacent properties and distance of dwellings within 500 feet of the property boundary.
 - D. Existing and proposed structures with maximum capacity of each building where guests have access as required to comply with building code and applicable fire safety requirements.
 - E. Location of temporary toilet facilities, which may be required.
 - F. Location of any existing or proposed wells or Subsurface Wastewater Treatments Systems (SSTS).
 - G. A written description of the planned activities providing including maximum number of guests/visitors.
 - H. Frequency and number of activities proposed in a calendar year.
 - I. Hours of Operation/Activity including set-up/clean-up for activities and events.
 - J. Maximum number of guests for any activity.
 - K.J. Proposed site lighting or landscaping.
 - <u>L.K.</u> Anticipated maximum number of vehicle trips per day.
- Subd. 2 Performance Standards.

In addition to all other applicable zoning ordinance requirements including but not limited to the review criteria (findings) included in Article 4, Section 5, the following items shall be considered by the Planning Advisory Commission and County Board when reviewing a Conditional Use Permit or Interim Use Permit Application for various <u>Rural Tourism uses</u>. Bed and Breakfasts and Retreat Centers shall also meet the standards found in Article 11 Section 13 and Article 11 Section 25 respectively. Non Agricultural Uses associated with Agricultural Tourism.

- A. The size of the function and the number of expected guests on the property at one time shall be determined at the sole discretion of the County based on parcel size, proximity to adjacent neighbors and the ability of the applicant to demonstrate that there will be no unreasonable adverse impact on the neighbors from the noise, traffic, trespass, light or other impacts deemed relevant by the County.
- B. There is adequate provision for parking of vehicles so that there is no parking on public roads and adequate setbacks from adjacent properties are maintained. Temporary parking areas may be approved at the sole discretion of the County. Parking areas for facilities with greater than 50 guest capacity must be a minimum of forty (40) feet from all property lines, and appropriately screened from neighboring property. Light sources shall be directed downwards and shielded to prevent light being directed off the premises.
- C. The County may require a planted buffer between adjacent properties and parking or building if it is determined that such a buffer is necessary to avoid adverse impacts on adjacent properties.
- D. All State of Minnesota and Goodhue County requirements related to Water and Subsurface Wastewater Treatment Systems must be met.
- E. Outside activities shall be completed during daylight hours. Inside activities <u>for</u> <u>facilities with greater than 50 guest capacity</u> shall be completed by 10:00 PM unless approved through the CUP/<u>IUP</u> process to conclude no later than 12:00 AM (midnight).
- F. Any on-site preparation and handling of food or beverages must comply with all applicable Federal, State or Local Standards.
- G. The owner/operator will maintain a log of the activities occurring at the included activity/event dates, group identity, times and number of guests.
- **H.** The site plan with the above written descriptions along with any condition added during Planning Advisory Commission and/or County Board review will become a part of any approved conditional use permit or interim use permit.
- I. The main event area for facilities with greater than 50 guest capacity shall be at least 500 feet from neighboring dwellings.
- H.J. Rural Tourism uses for facilities with greater than 50 guest capacity shall be located on a parcel at least 3 acres in size.

Section 31. ACCESSORY DWELLING UNITS (ADUS)

- Subd. 1. Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs) are dwelling units that are accessory to a primary dwelling unit and are on the same tax parcel of land as the primary dwelling unit.
 - A. An ADU can be either:
 - 1. Attached to, or within the primary dwelling unit; or
 - 2. Located within 100 feet of the primary dwelling unit on the same tax parcel as the primary dwelling unit.
 - B. ADU's must have separate kitchen and bathroom facilities

Overview:

The Applicant (Connie Bodeker, Owner) has submitted a "change of zone" request involving a 46.89acre parcel of property in Cannon Falls Township to rezone the property from A2 (General Agriculture District) to R1 (Suburban Residence District) to allow the potential to establish up to three dwelling sites.

The current A-2 zoning classification does not allow dwelling establishment on the property due to the A2 section density maximum of 12 dwellings, one per original ¼ ¼ section. Section 31 of Cannon Falls Township currently has 19 dwellings. Section 31 is 0.4 miles wider than a typical Township section meaning section 31 is approximately 256 acres larger than a typical section. Almost all sections surrounding Section 31 in Cannon Falls and Leon Township are zoned A-2 and have more than 12 dwellings.

Project Summary:

Property Information:

- The subject property consists of a single parcel comprising 46.89 acres. Most of the parcel consists of undeveloped/vacant woodland with some steeper slopes. There is an existing accessory building with fenced-in paddocks located on the east side of the parcel near 338th Street Way.
- Adjacent properties on all sides are zoned A2. A contiguous parcel to the south (37.006.0701, owned by Krista Paige) is zoned R1. This parcel was rezoned in 2022 from A2 for up to three dwelling sites.
- The subject property is surrounded by medium-density residential development and steeper sloped woodlands. Highway 52 comprises part of the property's western border.

- The parcel is located less than 2 miles from the City of Cannon Falls.
- The property is not located within a Historic Preservation District. It is not anticipated that any
 historic amenities will be negatively impacted as a result of the proposed rezone. Some portions
 of the property are considered blufflands however staff will review all proposed
 grading/excavating and building permits to ensure these sensitive features are not negatively
 impacted.
- No portions of the property are designated Shoreland or Floodplain.

Proposed Uses:

- The Applicant has proposed a maximum of three residential lots to be created from this parcel. The proposed parcels would be accessed via 338th Street Way. If the Change of Zone is approved only one dwelling may be constructed until the land is formally platted to create additional dwelling sites. During the platting process, the Applicant will need to show that access routes to all lots will meet County standards, that there is space for appropriate well and septic systems and replacement systems if needed on each lot, and there is space so any structures can meet all setbacks.
- It should be noted that the R-1 District limits the number of farm animals (horses, goats, chickens, etc.) to one animal unit per acre with an Interim Use Permit. If the parcel is rezoned, the existing structure could not be used for farm animals without an Interim Use Permit.

Accessibility:

The Right-of-Way authority for 338th Street Way is Cannon Falls Township. Township Clerk Sue Safe indicated to staff via email that the road would need some attention to construct dwellings on this parcel. The Applicant will need to work with Cannon Falls Township to address these matters during a building permit or platting phase at the Township's discretion. Staff conducted a site visit on May 31, 2023, and noted that 338th Street Way is quite narrow in some areas.

Planning Information:

- The R1 District is intended to provide a district that defines and protects areas suitable for low to medium-density residential development as the principal use of the land and to allow related facilities desirable for a residential environment. It is also intended that the district allows varying densities of development in accordance with the ability to provide water and sewer facilities.
- The property is mostly undeveloped woodlands with varying topography. There is one existing accessory building with fenced-in areas existing on the east side of the property. Section 31 does not contain any registered feedlots.

Cannon Falls Township:

Cannon Falls Township Clerk Sue Safe provided staff with comments via email on May 11, 2023. She stated that: "*CF Township held their regular monthly meeting last night [May 10th] and met with Connie Bodeker (owner of parcel) and Bob Stahlberger (realtor). They discussed the rezoning of Parcel #28.031.1201 from Ag to R-1. Their hope is to sell the parcel as R-1 with a possibility of 1-3 subdivisions. They do not want more dwellings than that on that parcel. If that would happen, the road would definitely need some attention. The board approved the rezone."*

PAC Discussion:

The Planning Advisory Commission considered this request at their Thursday, June 15, 2023 meeting. During the public hearing, one neighboring property owner voiced concern about adding density to the area and that additional dwellings would negatively impact his ability to hunt. The PAC was concerned that any additional density in the area would negatively impact surrounding properties and property owners by adding septic systems to the area, adding density in a section that is already overbuilt, the desire to avoid "spot zoning", and the request appeared to be made solely for financial benefit.

Below, staff has included the PAC recommendation to deny the rezoning request and staff's original recommendation to approve the request.

PAC Recommendation:

The Planning Advisory Commission recommends the County Board of Commissioners

- adopt the staff report into the record;
- accept the application, testimony, exhibits, and other evidence presented into the record; and

DENY the map amendment request from Connie Bodeker (Owner) to rezone 46.89 acres from A2 (General Agriculture District) to R1 (Suburban Residence District).

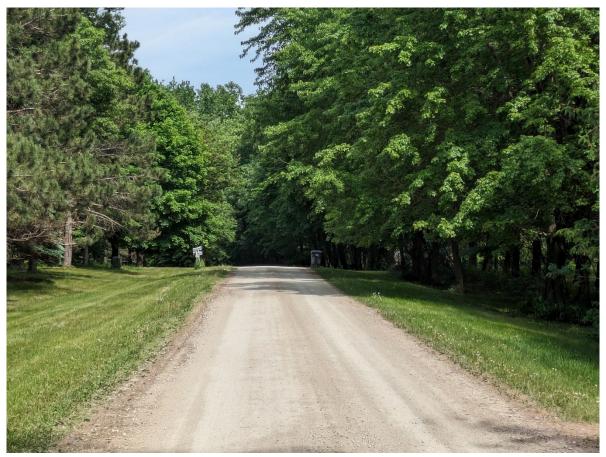

The meeting of the Goodhue County Planning Advisory Commission was called to order at 6:00 PM by Vice-Chair Richard Nystuen at the Goodhue County Government Center in Red Wing.

4. Public Hearings

PUBLIC HEARING: Request for Map Amendment (Rezone)

Request, submitted by Connie Bodeker (Owner) to rezone 46.89 acres from A-2 (General Agriculture District) to R-1 (Suburban Residence District). Parcel 28.031.1201. TBD 338th Street Way Cannon Falls, MN 55009. Part of the SW ¹/₄ of the SE ¹/₄ of Section 31 TWP 112 Range 17 in Cannon Falls Township.

Pierret presented the staff report and attachments.

Commissioner Stenerson asked for clarification on the number of additional houses that might be built.

Pierret stated they have proposed up to three additional building sites, bringing the total to 22 houses in the section.

Bob Stalberger, Realtor representing Ms. Bodeker stated they are hoping to rezone the property to make the best use of the property. Their idea was one to three houses but would be perfectly fine with one. Right now the land is not being utilized and it would be more tax base for the County and Township to have a dwelling on the land.

Vice-Chair Nystuen Opened the Public Hearing

Stanley Bryczek, 6825 338th Street Way, Cannon Falls, stated he is totally against this request. They bought their property as agricultural, where they would be able to hunt and not be close to neighbors. He feels it is wrong to put more houses in the area. When he bought his land, there were only supposed to be so many houses in the section, and that was it. Now they want to add more. Someone in the next section over just got approved for three more houses. Pretty soon it will be all houses, just like a city. Roads will be widened and things put in that will cost the residents more.

Dave Sucher, 11460 367th Street, Cannon Falls, asked if the board would answer the questions raised as to why more houses have been put in these townships.

Vice-Chair Nystuen stated that this board is the level before the Board of Commissioners. The Board of Commissioners will make the final decision. This board gives the Board of Commissioners a recommendation. This board listens to each request and then each member gets to vote on the request.

³After Vice-Chair Nystuen called three times for comments it was moved by Commissioner Miller and seconded by Commissioner Huneke to close the Public Hearing.

Motion carried 6:0

Bob Stalberger (Applicant's Representative) stated that there is already an accessory building on the property. Based on the way the property is laid out, this won't change Mr. Bryczek's ability to hunt on his property because there is still a good distance from where they could build a house from his property line.

Commissioner Stenerson said there is always potential, once you add more dwellings, for neighbor issues or conflicts. The A-1, A-2, and A-3 zones were established many years ago with each zone being assigned a certain number of houses that could be built in each zone. Every time we make an exception, we are changing density.

Hanni reminded the Board that this section has about a half-mile of extra width. It's bigger than a normal section.

Commissioner Stenerson said he could see if there were one or two more houses, but there are 10 more houses than allowed in this section already. The reason for this request appears to be for financial benefit and they are not supposed to use that as criteria to approve a request.

Hanni stated that the Board needs to look at the individual area. She doesn't know that they could get three dwellings on the property with accessibility requirements. They also need to look at the individual parcels to see the pros and cons and what could happen there.

Commissioner Fox stated that in looking at all the different things, he has no way he could support this. He would make a motion to deny this request.

Commissioner Stenerson seconded the denial. The reason for the denial is that this would make the section ten dwellings over the acceptable density.

Commissioner Gale said he had to buy 40 acres to be allowed to build. He feels that everyone should stay as close to that as possible.

Bob Stalberger (Applicant's Representative) stated that looking at the map and the required setbacks he is unsure three houses could fit here. Forty-acre lot sizes were mentioned, this property is 46 acres. They also talked about going over density when the section is already well over the maximum density. Things have changed since the rule of 12 houses went into place. COVID has happened and more people want to be out in the country and there is limited ability to build and live out in the country. Aside from profitability, there is a strong demand for people who want to live in the country and there isn't that ability in Goodhue County because of the rules that are in place. The only spot to build on would be at the dead-end road where it comes into the property. It is the best use of this property to have a dwelling on it versus it sitting there empty.

Commissioner Miller stated that he thinks this is something that will come up more and more as they go forward. Some properties are not generating tax income for the Township and some people want to live on that property. It is over 40 acres. You need 35 acres in A-3 to do build a dwelling. In his view, people have a right to use their property as they see fit. It seems to him that if a dwelling was placed on this site that already has an accessory building, it would not destroy the neighborhood.

Commissioner Stenerson asked Commissioner Fox if he would be willing to add some findings of facts to their motion. Based on a couple of things, one is a concern over the increased number of septic systems in the area. The second would be density well over the established maximum. The volume of development we are seeing in that section would be better served in a metropolitan or city area where there are city or public services available. Third, a longterm policy has been established on this board to avoid spot zoning. And number four, the Board cannot approve a request simply because it will be more financially beneficial for the owner.

Commissioner Fox agreed with Commissioner Stenerson on adding these findings of fact to their decision.

Pierret presented the staff report and attachments.

Hanni stated that these lots are Outlots and are not buildable lots. The land could be split one parcel at a time but they would need to wait 6 months between each split. The best way, especially when you get some of these complicated splits, is to plat it. This is a good process to clean up legal descriptions.

Commissioner Stenerson asked if this started as cleaning up survey information and if the land was broken into identifiable sections for future planning.

Hanni stated that is correct. She said if you look at the air photos, the Outlots follow what is being farmed and split off bluffland and woods.

Commissioner Stenerson asked what the reason was for bringing plats before the board rather than just approving it as a correction to the surveying.

Hanni stated there are two reasons for this coming before the board. The applicant wants to create one lot that goes across a section line. And two, anytime we are going to dedicate something to the public such as a road, it should go through a public meeting.

Commissioner Stenerson asked if the Applicant was giving some land to the Township as road right-of-way.

Hanni stated that he is dedicating some right-of-way to the Township on Old Church Road.

Vice-Chair Nystuen Opened the Public Hearing

Nancy Taylor, 25090 Old Church Road, Red Wing wanted to know if all of this land is platted could a house be built here in the future?

Pierret stated that the lots will be platted as Outlots, and Outlots are not buildable. To be able to build on this land, someone would have to come back to this Board and request the land be re-platted and rezoned due to density restrictions in the section.

H. A statement of how the requested change is compatible with the Goodhue County Comprehensive Plan including but not limited to the following:

- 1. The environmental impacts of the proposed use of land on the:
 - a. Groundwater
 - b. Natural plant and animal communities
 - c. Existing trees and vegetation
 - d. Bluffland stability

e. Shoreland stability

There are some areas of Bluffland on the property. These sensitive features can be avoided and maintained in their natural state while developing up to three dwellings due to the size of the parcel. It is anticipated existing trees would need to be removed to accommodate the development of structures, utilities, and access drives.

2. The compatibility with surrounding land uses

Surrounding land uses include medium-density residential. Residential housing located within the Serendipity Addition is located approximately ¹/₄ mile southeast of the property. Mediumdensity residential uses are also located to the east along 338th ST Way and there is an existing R1 zoned parcel directly to the south in Leon Township. Existing dwellings are separated from the property by woodlands and areas of steep slopes. Four dwelling sites border the property, one on each side (north, south, east, and west). All dwellings are surrounded by wooded areas with varying topography.

3. The physical and visual impacts on any scenic or historic amenities within or surrounding the proposed parcel.

It is not anticipated that any historic amenities will be negatively impacted as a result of the proposed rezone. Existing blufflands can be avoided during development. Zoning staff and the Goodhue SWCD will review all proposed site plans for structures, grading, and access drives.

Subd. 6 The housing density of the affected Section

Section 31 is an A2-zoned section. A2 Districts allow a maximum of 12 dwellings per section, one per original ¹/₄ ¹/₄ section. There are currently 19 dwellings within the section therefore no dwelling site eligibility exists. If rezoned to R1, any dwellings constructed on R1 zoned parcels would not count towards the Section's overall density.

Section 31 is 0.4 miles wider than typical Township sections. This additional width adds approximately 256 acres to Section 31.

Subd. 7 The impact on any surrounding agricultural uses

The property is not currently used for agricultural purposes. Almost none of the acreage is considered Prime Farmland. There are no existing feedlots in Section 31. If rezoned to R1, animal agriculture would not be a permitted use. An Interim Use Permit is required for any "farm" animals up to 1 animal unit per acre in the R1 District. No new Feedlots may be established in an R1 District.

Subd. 8 The impact on the existing transportation infrastructure **The Applicant's property is accessed off of 338th St Way (aggregate surface). Cannon Falls Township (Right-of-Way authority) has indicated improvements** will be needed to develop additional dwellings off of 338th St Way. The Applicant will need to work with the Township to address these matters during the platting or building permit phase at the Township's discretion.

Subd. 9 The impact on surrounding zoning districts **The property and most surrounding properties are zoned A2. One parcel to the south (37.006.0701) is zoned R1. This parcel was rezoned to R1 from A2 in 2022.**

Subd. 10 A statement concerning the cumulative effect and compatibility of the requested zoning change on the affected Township and any cities located within 2 miles of the proposed parcel.

Rezoning the subject parcel to R1 does not appear to have negative cumulative effects on the immediate surrounding area or the City of Cannon Falls. The surrounding area is used primarily for medium-density residential among woodlands and steep slopes.

Subd. 11. Additional information as may be requested by the Planning Commission or zoning staff.

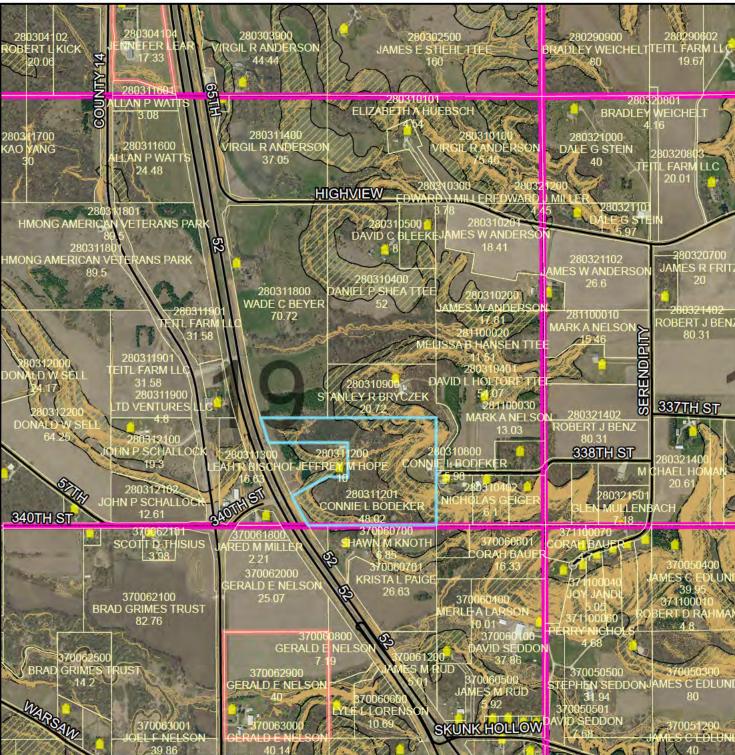

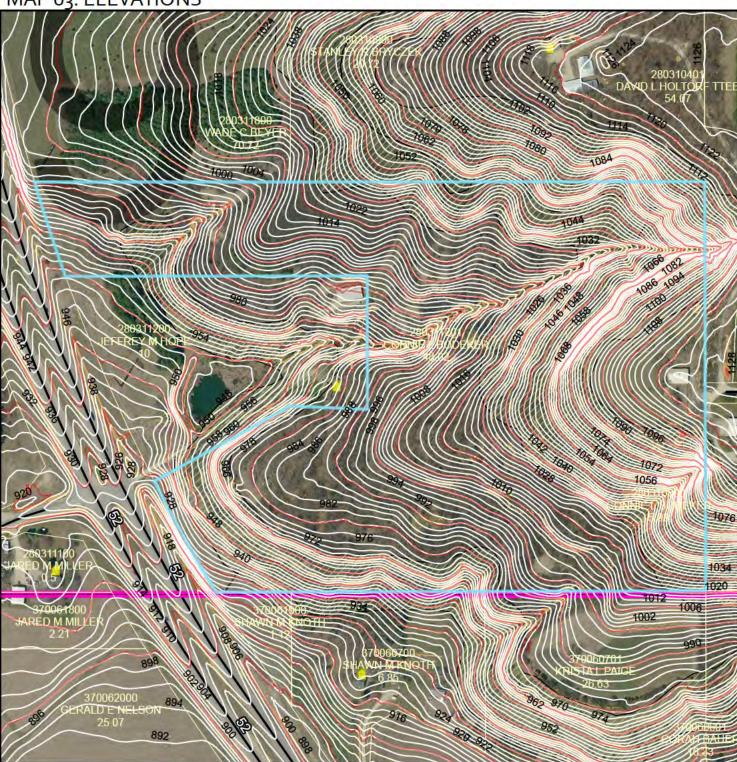

<u>Summary</u>

It is requested that the County Board authorize Staff to proceed with auctioning a tandem plow truck, unit #0601.

Background

Delays in the manufacturing of tandem trucks has been a carryover effect of the Covid pandemic and has caused the delivery of the 2022 tandem 'super truck' to be delayed well into 2023. It is anticipated that this truck will be available mid fall to early winter. Unit #0601 was planned to be traded to the dealer Goodhue County contracted with for the delivery of a new truck. This company is not relying on this truck being traded and is fine if Goodhue County would like to auction it instead.

The value of this unit is diminished substantially versus a new truck and will likely not net much for value. However, staff would like the opportunity to auction this unit to evaluate trade values vs. person to person sales and determine if this would be a practice we would like to pursue moving into the future and to hopefully receive a bigger return on the vehicle.

The tandem fleet will be short another unit for several months until the new trucks arrive. Unit #0601 is the oldest truck in our fleet and was routinely out-of-service during the '22/'23 snow season due to needing repairs. Authorizing staff to auction this vehicle now provides an opportunity to evaluate the market when values for these types of vehicles is likely at their highest.

<u>Alternatives</u>

- ➤ Authorize staff to auction unit #0601.
- > Take no action at this time.

Recommendations

It is the recommendation that the Board authorize staff to trade off unit #0601 ahead of receiving its replacement.

<u>Summary</u>

It is requested that the County Board consider increasing the Wheelage Tax.

Background

All Counties in Minnesota have the authority to implement a wheelage tax which is applied to eligible vehicles when they are annually registered. Beginning in 2014, Counties were given authorization to charge a Wheelage Tax of up to \$10 per vehicle and in 2018 collection was allowed to increase to \$20 per vehicle.

Revenues collected from the Wheelage Tax stay in the County where the vehicle is registered. On a monthly basis these revenues are paid to the County by the State of Minnesota who makes the collections on the County's behalf. Several types of vehicles are exempt from the collection and they include the following: motorcycles, mopeds, trailers, semitrailers, vehicles not subject to annual registration (i.e. – collector vehicles), tax exempt, State owned vehicles, and those newly identified by recent 2023 legislation.

Wheelage Taxes collected shall be used for "highway purposes" and must be deposited in the County's road and bridge fund. The wheelage tax may be imposed up to a maximum of \$20 per vehicle per year, in any increment of a whole dollar, as specified by each county that authorizes the tax.

To impose or otherwise alter the tax rate that is being collected, a county need only notify the State Registrar of any change by the annual August 1st deadline for that change to go into effect the following year. This applies to a Wheelage Tax that is collected by the State. A county could also make collection by county officials if the Board chose to through resolution. At time of writing, there are, and have been, no Counties in Minnesota that impose a wheelage tax that make collection of the Wheelage Tax by county officials.

In 2014 Goodhue County implemented the Wheelage Tax at a rate of \$10 per vehicle per year. Revenue's collected have gone to fund mostly pavement preservation projects which was a request of the Board at the time of initial implementation. On June 6, 2023 staff made a presentation at a Committee of the Whole titled 'Public Works Funding Options'. The two options discussed were the Local Option Sales Tax and the Wheelage Tax. Goodhue County has implemented both of these options and can choose to increase the wheelage tax from \$10 to \$20 per vehicle. Several options were provided to Commissioners for use of additional collected dollars. It is not required to dedicate these monies to anything in particular just that they be used for "highway purposes".

<u>Alternatives</u>

- > Approve increasing the Wheelage Tax from \$10 per vehicle to \$20 per vehicle;
- Approve increasing the Wheelage Tax from \$10 per vehicle to another whole dollar increment up to a maximum of \$20 per vehicle;
- > Take no action at this time.

Recommendations

It is the recommendation of staff that the Board approve increasing the Wheelage Tax from \$10 per vehicle to \$20 per vehicle.

MCIT Focuses on Benefiting Members

As a risk sharing pool, Minnesota Counties Intergovernmental Trust provides specific lines of coverage and services to meet members' unique risk exposures. MCIT works to protect the stability and longevity of the program for the benefit of all members.

MCIT is not an insurance company focused on profits. Rather, MCIT is a public joint powers entity dedicated to helping members manage their risks so they can carry out their public service mission to the citizens of Minnesota.

Through MCIT, members pool resources to provide:

- Property, liability, auto, cyber and workers' compensation coverage
- Programs and services to assist members in managing risks and controlling losses

As a public entity, MCIT understands the unique challenges facing local governments and offers ways to address those risks.



Members Do Their Part

The success of MCIT is built on each member's willingness to:

- Support loss prevention and risk management strategies.
- Take reasonable steps to mitigate claims.
- Collaborate with MCIT when losses occur.
- Fulfill financial obligations to MCIT.

MCIT Mission

Providing Minnesota counties and associated members cost-effective coverage with comprehensive and quality risk management services.

Reinsurance Maintained at Acceptable Costs

Consistent with past years, reinsurance carriers remain guarded in working with public entity pools given the state of the market and risks associated with member operations. MCIT purchases reinsurance to protect the program from covering the total cost of catastrophic claims.

For 2023, the property reinsurance rate increased 8 percent, and the liability reinsurance rate rose by 24 percent.

Cyber Coverage Preserved, Enhanced for 2023

After Hartford Steam Boiler informed MCIT in mid-2022 that it would not renew MCIT's cyber-coverage program for 2023, staff worked tirelessly to find a suitable replacement before the new year. They succeeded. For 2023, the new cyber-coverage program:

- Includes increased aggregate coverage limits for members (\$500,000 for county members)
- Provides increased sublimits
- Offers retroactive coverage

The new program includes similar coverage to the HSB program, including an endorsement for misdirected payment and computer fraud incidents. The deductible for county members is \$10,000.

Cost-containment Measures

To help limit members' required contributions, MCIT looks for ways to minimize the program's costs, including:

 Pursuing recoveries: When a claim involves a third party who is legally responsible for the loss or damage in whole or in part, MCIT pursues recovery of funds on the members' behalf. In the past five years, MCIT has recovered nearly \$3 million.

 Medical bill review: For workers' compensation claims, MCIT uses a third party to review medical bills to assure coding and pricing accuracy, achieving lower overall expenses.

• Pharmacy benefit manager: This outside service helps limit the cost of filling prescriptions under workers' compensation benefits.

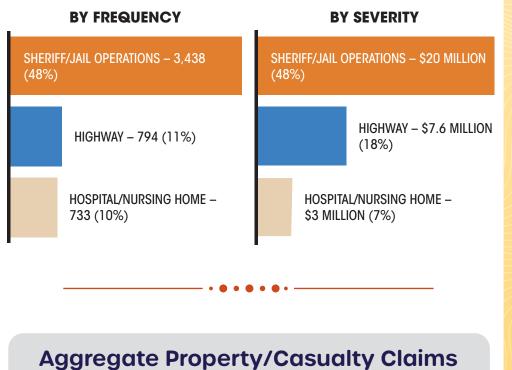

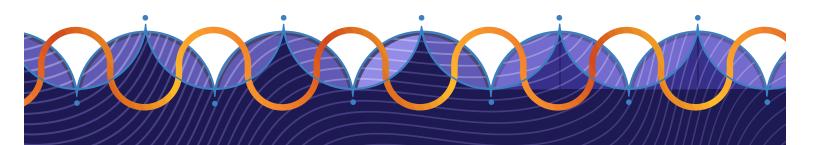

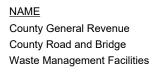
