The Goodhue County Board of Commissioners met on Wednesday, August 9, 2023, at 7:30 p.m. in Special Session at the Cannon Falls Township Hall, 30765 Clark Valley Trail, Cannon Falls, with Commissioner Flanders, Betcher, Anderson and Greseth all present.

CSAH 14 Turnback Cannon Falls. It is requested that the County hold a public hearing to discuss revoking the section of CSAH 14 from the new alignment of CSAH 14 to TH 52 to Cannon Falls Township at this Special County Board Meeting.

Moved by C/Anderson, seconded by C/Greseth, and carried to approve to open the public hearing.

Commissioner Flanders asked three times for public comment. Ray Otto, Supervisor with Cannon Falls Township asked if the addresses would change for the two residents. Mr. Isakson stated that the address was changed some time ago and there would be no additional changes. Mr. Isakson reviewed the process for the turnback with the township board.

There were no further comments.

WHEREAS, MnDOT closed off TH 52/CSAH 14 intersection as a safety measure, and connected CSAH 14 up to the roundabout at CSAH 24 as part of their TH 52 South Bound Grading project; and

WHEREAS, there is a short section of existing CSAH 14 between the new alignment of CSAH 14 and TH 52's right-of-way that cannot be on the County State Aid Highway (CSAH) system and should not be on the County's system since it is now a dead end (see attached Plat); and

WHEREAS, the County Board may, according to Minnesota Statute 163.11, Subd. 5 revoke any such portion of highway by resolution, in which case said portion of the revoked highway reverts to the town in which the road is located; and

WHEREAS, those portions of CSAH 14 to be revoked are shown on the attached "MINNESOTA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION RIGHT OF WAY PLAT NO. 25-96" and described as follows:

Description for CSAH 14 Reversion to Cannon Falls Township

That part of Government Lot 1, Section 6, Township 111 North, Range 17 West, and that part of Government Lot 12, Section 31, Township 112 North, Range 17 West, all in Goodhue County, Minnesota, described as follows:

That part of CSAH No. 14, and Parcel 45, and that part of Parcels 47 and 47A of Minnesota Department of Transportation Right of Way Plat No. 25-96, on file and of record in the Goodhue County Recorder's Office, Goodhue County, Minnesota, lying northeasterly of a straight line drawn between boundary corners labeled B9602 and B9612 as shown on said Right of Way Plat.

Containing 1.58 acres, more or less; and

WHEREAS, the County served notice by certified mail to the Cannon Falls Township Supervisors: Deb Hendrickson, Ray Otto, Keith Mahoney, Catherine Rutter, Sue Safe; and

WHEREAS, the County Board held a public hearing as follows:

Cannon Falls Township Hall 30765 Clark Valley Trail Cannon Falls, MN 55009 August 9th, 2023

7:30pm

AND WHEREAS, the revocation will become effective when the County receives the Right of Way documents from MnDOT; and

WHEREAS, The County shall properly record this Resolution with the County Recorder when the documents are received from MnDOT; and

WHEREAS, The County shall also maintain the road segment for two years after recording the Right of Way documents; or pay the township to maintain it, subject to the discretion of the Cannon Falls Town Board.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Goodhue County Board of Commissioners does hereby revoke the County's interest in the real estate used as that part of CSAH 14 as described above, in which case said portion of revoked highway reverts to Cannon Falls Township effective after the County notifies the Township that the Right of Way documents have been received from MnDOT and have recorded the transfer to the Township

Parcel 32.200.0310. Territorial Road Lake City, MN 55041. Part of the SE ½ of the NW ¼ of Section 31 TWP 112 Range 12 in Florence Township.

Request for CUP for an Event Center and Resort Facility (Villa Maria Ventures, LLC (John Rupp, Chief Manager). The request is for a Conditional Use Permit to continue the operations of an Event Center and Resort Facility permitted via IUP. The proposal includes remodeling existing structures and constructing additions to provide spaces for lodging, cottages, on-site restaurant, and event spaces. 29847 County 2 BLVD Frontenac, MN 55026. Parcels 32.160.0040 and 32.012.0400. Blocks C, D, and E of Garrards South Extension plat and part of the SE ½ of the SW ¼ of Section 12 TWP 112 Range 13 in Florence Township. CR (Commercial Recreational District).

The Planning Commission recommended approval. Due to the Applicant's comments received after the Planning Advisory Commission meeting, staff recommended adding additional conditions to the Board's motion to ensure compliance with the Building Code.

Subject to the following conditions:
 - 1. Activities shall be conducted outdoors, within buildings that have not been structurally altered, or in the main level event space of Marian Hall as shown in Exhibit A according to submitted plans, specifications, and narrative unless modified by a condition of this CUP until a Certificate of Occupancy is issued for the remainder of Marian Hall. Any future uses or structures not specified within this CUP application shall require an amended CUP application and another public hearing should be held by the Goodhue County Planning Advisory Commission;
 - 2. All event activities shall end no later than midnight;
 - 3. On-street parking and loading/off-loading shall be prohibited;
 - 4. Events exceeding 500 people shall obtain required permits per the Goodhue County Assembly Controls Ordinance;
 - 5. Applicant shall obtain building permit approvals for proposed remodeling and additions from the Goodhue County Building Permits Department prior to beginning construction;
 - 6. Applicant shall maintain a current Goodhue County septic system operating permit including abiding by all conditions within the operating permit or obtain a State Disposal System permit with the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency.
 - 7. Compliance with Goodhue County Zoning Ordinance including Article 30 CR, Commercial Recreational District;
 - 8. Compliance with all necessary State and Federal registrations, permits, licensing, and regulations including food, beverage, and lodging licenses from the Minnesota Department of Health. Verification of these licenses shall be submitted to the Zoning Administrator prior to hosting any events and upon request from LUM staff; and
 - 9. Applicant shall submit a Land Alteration Permit and associated grading/excavation plans for all projects disturbing 10,000 square feet or more of ground area. No grading or excavation shall take place without first obtaining a Land Alteration Permit from the Zoning Administrator and any associated permits from the Goodhue Soil and Water Conservation District and Minnesota DNR. Projects disturbing one acre or more of area shall obtain an NPDES permit from the MPCA. A copy of any NPDES permits shall be submitted to the Zoning Administrator prior to beginning work.
 - 10. A building permit will not be issued until staff receives an approval letter from the State Fire Marshall for the fire suppression system.
 - 11. A Certificate of Occupancy for the Marian Hall building will not be issued until a sprinkler system is installed and passes inspection(s) or the Department of Labor and Industry has issued a formal decision on an appeal to the sprinkler requirement.

COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

Xcel Energy Letter Response. On July 12th, 2023 Goodhue County received a letter from Xcel Energy requesting consultation on the Prairie Island Nuclear Generation Plant's (PINGP) operating license renewal. In response to this request an email to Goodhue County Commissioners and Department Heads was sent out to ask for points of concern and issues they would like addressed within a response letter. What was issued by the aforementioned group is included in the letter below. Staff recommended the board approve the proposed response to Xcel Energy's request.

FINANCE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Broadband Extension with Southeast MN Wifi LLC. On July 18th, 2023 the Goodhue County Board approved a Broadband Agreement with Southeast MN Wifi. The County agreed to provide \$112,138 to Southeast MN WiFi so they could provide broadband service to 18 passings, including 12 homes, at a cost of \$6,230 per passing per County grant. At this time Southeast MN Wifi has been in contact with an additional seven residents that have expressed interest in broadband service. Therefore, Southeast MN Wifi is requesting an additional \$62,545 from Goodhue County for an extension for their recently approved project.

Staff recommended the county board approve the Broadband Extension requested by Southeast MN Wifi LLC resulting in an additional amount of \$62,545.

HUMAN RESOURCE MANAGER'S REPORT

2024 Dental Insurance. The Goodhue County Insurance Committee met on August 8, 2023, to review the group dental insurance renewals for January 1, 2024. The Blue Cross Blue Shield dental plan renewal rates will be at a 1.59% increase over the current rates. The committee recommended approval.

2024 Health Insurance & HSA. The Goodhue County Insurance Committee met on August 8, 2023, to review the health insurance renewal information for 2024. As part of the RFP process in 2021, Blue Cross Blue Shield had given Goodhue County a rate guarantee for 2024 of not more than 7.5%. In addition the deductible, out of pocket maximums and the Health Savings Account contributions would all be increasing.

2024 Voluntary Insurance Plans. The Goodhue County Insurance Committee met on August 8, 2023 to review the January 1, 2024 renewals for insurance plans. The Insurance Committee reviewed renewal proposals for the basic life insurance plan which is a County paid benefit. Additionally, the Committee reviewed proposals for voluntary (employee paid) insurance plans which include vision, supplemental life insurance as well as short- and long-term disability. The Goodhue County Insurance Committee recommended approval.

COUNTY ATTORNEY'S REPORT

Highway-Goodhue County 24 Project. The other option would be to continue with the court proceedings which would include a Commissioners' hearing and the attendant costs. This hearing order can be appealed to the District Court which would involve witness costs and further attorney fees. By agreeing to this proposal, the county would avoid further costs and expenses and time commitments by staff.

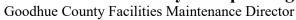

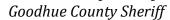

RE: Joint Powers Agreement between Dakota County and Goodhue County for Boarding Services

at the Goodhue County Adult Detention Center

SUMMARY

The Goodhue County Sheriff offered to provide boarding services for some of the Dakota County inmates when discussing the issue with the Dakota County Sheriff. The attached contract was drafted effective immediately and will end December 31, 2024. Both counties will have the opportunity to continue the contract after 2024.

BACKGROUND

Dakota County is in need of boarding services for both male and female inmates and wishes to contract with Goodhue County to board their inmates at the Goodhue County Adult Detention Center. Due to Goodhue County inmate numbers lower than usual and having the space and staffing available, we are able to take on more inmates and feel it would be a beneficial service to provide for Dakota County.

The contract states Goodhue County would like to gradually accept Dakota County inmates, so we are requesting up to 10 inmates through October 31, 2023 and will increase to 20 inmates from November 1 through December 31, 2023. Starting January 1, 2024 Goodhue County will accept a maximum of 30 inmates from Dakota County. The per diem rate stated in the contract is the going rate charged to other counties at \$55.00 a day. Starting January 1, 2024 that rate will increase to \$60.00 per day.

RECOMMENDATION

Approve the Joint Powers Agreement between Goodhue County and Dakota County to provide boarding services for Dakota County at the Goodhue County Adult Detention Center effective immediately.

JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF DAKOTA AND THE COUNTY OF GOODHUE FOR BOARDING INMATES AT THE GOODHUE COUNTY ADULT DETENTION CENTER

This Agreement is made and entered into between Goodhue County, 430 West 6th St., Red Wing, MN 55066, through the Goodhue County Sheriff's Office, hereinafter referred to as "Goodhue County or Contractor" and the County of Dakota, 1580 Highway 55, Hastings, MN 55033, State of Minnesota, through the Dakota County Sheriff's Office, hereinafter referred to as "Dakota County or County".

WHEREAS, Dakota County and Goodhue County are governmental units as that term is defined in Minn. Stat. § 471.59; and

WHEREAS, Minn. Stat. § 471.59 authorizes local governmental units to jointly or cooperatively exercise any power common to the contracting parties; and

WHEREAS, Dakota County, has a need for boarding services for both male and female inmates, hereinafter collectively referred to as "inmates" or "Dakota County inmates" and wishes to contract with Goodhue County to board Dakota County inmates at the Goodhue County Adult Detention Center, hereinafter called the "Facility"; and

WHEREAS, Goodhue County currently has bed space and staffing capacity available at the Facility.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual undertakings and agreements hereinafter set forth, Goodhue County and Dakota County agree as follows:

I. TERM

Goodhue County agrees to furnish the services set forth in this Agreement during the period commencing September 1, 2023, and terminating on December 31, 2024, with two, one-year optional renewal upon written agreement of both parties and with the understanding that terms of the Agreement may be subject to review annually by either Dakota or Goodhue County.

II. GOODHUE COUNTY DUTIES

Goodhue County Shall:

- A. Accept and provide for the secure custody, care and safe keeping of Dakota County inmates in the Facility in accordance with all Federal, State or local laws, statutes, ordinances, rules and regulations, policies and procedures, and court orders pertaining to this Agreement, or to the facilities, programs, and staff for which Goodhue County is responsible. This includes, but is not limited to, all Standard Assurances, which are attached as Exhibit B.
- B. Permit Dakota County to purchase bed space on a space available basis. Any such purchase shall be under the terms and conditions of this Agreement. Goodhue County will accept up to 10 inmates from September 1, 2023 through October 31, 2023 and up to 20 inmates from November 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023. From January 1, 2024 thereafter, Goodhue County will accept a maximum of 30 inmates, unless agreed upon by both parties.
- C. Provide Dakota County inmates with the same level of medical care and services provided to Goodhue County inmates, including arranging the transportation of inmates requiring removal from the Facility for emergency medical treatment. Goodhue County shall have the sole authority to determine whether any Dakota County inmates housed in the Facility require emergency medical and dental care. Goodhue County shall notify the Dakota County's

authorized agent whenever an inmate is removed from the Facility in order to provide emergency medical or dental treatment. All inmates requiring emergency medical treatment will be treated according to the joint medical protocol established between Dakota and Goodhue Counties which is attached and incorporated as Exhibit A. This joint medical protocol shall also govern all hospital visits or admissions.

- D. Admit or release inmates as provided in the Agreement, but only after Goodhue County receives the appropriate documentation to confirm the identity of the inmate, which must be presented by an authorized agent or employee of Dakota County. The identity and authority of the Dakota County agent or employee must also be confirmed through appropriate documentation before an inmate is admitted or released. The Facility will be available to admit or release inmates twenty- four (24) hours a day.
- E. Permit Dakota County inmates to participate in the Goodhue County work release program or any other Goodhue County programs in which other inmates housed in the Facility participate, if such participation is possible under the terms of this Agreement; the terms and conditions of their confinement in the Facility; Dakota County policy, where applicable; and court orders.

III. DAKOTA COUNTY DUTIES

Dakota County Shall:

- A. Be responsible for transporting all Dakota County inmates to and from the Facility, except in those cases where the inmate is transported to a medical care facility for emergency medical or dental treatment pursuant to this Agreement.
- B. Be responsible for providing Goodhue County with all necessary orders, writs, and other documentation prior to housing or releasing an inmate.

IV. PAYMENT

- A. Payment for all services performed and goods or materials supplied by Goodhue County pursuant to this Agreement shall be made by Dakota County as follows:
 - 1. Compensation for each inmate held at the Facility under the terms of this Agreement during the period of September 1, 2023, through December 31, 2023, shall be a daily rate of Fifty-five and no/100 dollars (\$55.00), per-day, per-bed, plus any medical and dental costs and during the period of January 1, 2024, through December 31, 2024, shall be a daily rate of Sixty and no/100 dollars (\$60.00), per-day, per-bed, plus any medical and dental costs. The Agreement will be subject to review annually by either Dakota or Goodhue County. The parties must agree in writing to any changes to the daily rate. The daily rate may not increase more than one dollar (\$1.00) per year without Dakota County Board approval.
 - 2. All costs associated with emergency medical or dental services provided outside of the Facility pursuant to this Agreement, including transportation expenses, will be a reimbursable expense paid by Dakota County to Goodhue County upon invoice to Dakota County.
- B. Payments shall be made by Dakota County within thirty (30) calendar days after receipt of invoice from Goodhue County. Invoices must be submitted monthly and must state the inmates' names, dates inmates are incarcerated during the billing period, and detail of any costs over and above the fixed per diem.

If the invoice is incorrect, defective, or otherwise improper, Dakota County will notify Goodhue County within ten (10) calendar days of receiving the incorrect invoice. Upon receiving the corrected invoice from Goodhue County, Dakota County will make payment within thirty (30) calendar days.

V. CANCELLATION

This Agreement may be canceled by either party at any time with or without cause upon forty-five (45) calendar days written notice to the other party. In the event of such a cancellation, Goodhue County shall be entitled to payment, determined on a pro rata basis, for work or services satisfactorily performed through the date of cancellation.

Termination of this Agreement shall not discharge any liability, responsibility, or right of any party which arises from the performance of or failure to adequately perform this Agreement prior to the effective date of termination. Nor shall termination discharge any obligation which by its nature would survive after the date of termination, including by way of illustration only and not limitation, the Standard Assurances attached as Exhibit B.

VI. ASSIGNMENT

Neither party shall assign its rights or obligations under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other party.

VII. AMENDMENTS

Any amendments to this Agreement shall be in writing.

VIII. DATA PRACTICES

All data collected, created, received, maintained, or disseminated because of this Agreement is governed by the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act, Minn. Stat. Ch. 13 and the Minnesota Rules implementing the Act ("Data Practices Act"). For purposes of executing its responsibilities under this Agreement, Goodhue County shall be considered part of the corrections system as defined in Minn. Stat. § 13.85. Goodhue County's employees and agents shall have access to private or confidential data maintained by Dakota County to the extent necessary to carry out its responsibilities under this Agreement. Any such private or confidential data received by Goodhue County shall retain its data classification with Goodhue County. Goodhue County is responsible to ensure data it collects regarding each inmate is maintained in accordance with the Data Practices Act and its policies.

IX. INDEMNITY

Each party to the Agreement shall be liable for its own acts to the extent provided by law and hereby agrees to indemnify, hold harmless, and defend the other, its officers and employees against any and all liability, loss, costs, damages, expenses, claims, or actions, including attorney's fees which the other, its officers and employees may hereinafter sustain, incur, or be required to pay, arising out of or by reason of any act or omission of the party, its agents, servant, or employees, in the execution, performance, or failure to adequately perform its obligations pursuant to this Agreement.

X. MERGER

It is understood and agreed that the entire Agreement between the parties is contained herein and this Agreement supersedes all oral agreements and negotiations between the parties relating to the subject matter. All items referred to in this Agreement are incorporated or attached and are deemed part of this Agreement.

XI. CONFLICT OF INTEREST

If there is a conflict between any provision of any Exhibit and the body of this Agreement, the body of this Agreement will prevail. To the extent reasonably possible, the Exhibits will be construed and

constructed to supplement, rather than conflict with, the body of this Agreement. If there is a conflict between any provision of an Exhibit and another Exhibit, the following is the order of precedence: (1) Exhibit A and (2) Exhibit B.

XII. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS/STANDARDS

- A. Each party agrees to comply with all Federal, State, and local laws, ordinances, rules, regulations and executive orders pertaining to unlawful discrimination on account of race, color, creed, religion, national origin, sex, gender, marital status, status about public assistance, disability or age.
- B. Each party further agrees to comply with all Federal, State, and local laws or ordinance, and all applicable rules, regulations, and standards established by any agency of such governmental units, which are now or hereafter promulgated insofar as they relate to the County's performance of the provisions of this Agreement.
- C. Goodhue County shall procure at its own expense, all licenses, permits, or other rights for the provision of the services contemplated herein.
- D. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the substantive and procedural laws of the State of Minnesota, without giving effect to the principles of conflict of laws. All proceedings related to this Agreement shall be venued in the State of Minnesota.

XIII. RECORDS/REPORTS

- A. Goodhue County agrees to maintain records relating to all services provided to inmates under the terms of this Agreement according to Minnesota State Statutes and Goodhue County's document retention policy. Such records shall be made available for audit or inspection at any time upon request of Dakota County or its authorized representative.
- B. Goodhue County agrees to provide the Sheriff of Dakota County with written notice of all claims filed by any Dakota County inmate against it concerning boarding/detention services.
- C. During the Term of this Agreement, upon request by the Sheriff of Dakota County, Goodhue County shall submit to the Sheriff of Dakota County copies of all inspection reports completed by the Federal Bureau of Prisons, the Minnesota Department of Corrections or any other State of Federal agency dealing with the Detention Center.

XIV. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR STATUS

Goodhue County is to be and shall remain an independent contractor with respect to any and all work performed under this Agreement. It is agreed that nothing herein contained is intended or should be construed in any manner as creating or establishing the relationship of co-partners between the parties hereto or as constituting Goodhue County as the agent, representative, or employee of Dakota County for any purpose or in any manner whatsoever. Any and all claims that arise or may arise on behalf of Goodhue County, its agents, servants or employees as a consequence of any act or omission on the part of Goodhue County or its agents, servants, employees while engaged in the performance of the Agreement shall in no way be the obligation or responsibility of Dakota County.

XV. SUBCONTRACTING/SUCCESSORS

A. Subcontracts. Goodhue County shall not enter into any agreement providing secured beds for Dakota County at any facility other than the Goodhue County Correctional Facility.

B. Successors. Dakota County and Goodhue County each binds itself and its successors, legal representatives, and assigns to the other party to this Agreement and to the partners, successors, legal representatives, and assigns of such other party, in respect to all covenants of this Agreement.

XVI. DEFAULT

Neither party shall be liable to the other party for any loss or damage resulting from a delay or failure to perform due to unforeseeable acts or events outside the defaulting party's reasonable control, providing the defaulting party gives notice to the other party as soon as possible. Acts and events may include acts of God, acts of terrorism, war, fire, flood, epidemic, acts of civil or military authority, and natural disasters.

XVII. CONTRACT RIGHTS/REMEDIES

- A. Rights Cumulative. All remedies available to either party under the terms of this Agreement or by law are cumulative and may be exercised concurrently or separately, and the exercise of any one remedy shall not be deemed an election of such remedy to the exclusion of the other remedies.
- B. Waiver. Waiver for any default shall not be deemed to be a waiver of any subsequent default. Waiver for breach of any provision of this Agreement shall not be construed to be modification for the terms of this Agreement unless stated to be such in writing and signed by the Contract Agents of Dakota County and Goodhue County specified in this Agreement.

XVIII. CONTRACT AGENTS

The authorized agents for purposes of administration of this Agreement are Captain Heather Stephens for the Goodhue County Sheriff's Office and Captain Benjamin Verby for the Dakota County Sheriff's Office.

EXHIBIT A

When a Dakota County inmate is transported to Goodhue County, Dakota County will send all prescription medications the inmate is taking and all necessary medical information to Goodhue County at the time of admission at Goodhue County. Goodhue County will provide medical, dental, and mental health treatment following its clinical protocols and procedures. Goodhue County shall bill Dakota County for any and all medications, and for all medical, dental, and mental health care received by Dakota County inmates, to include all emergency medical transports, in addition to the payment of the daily correctional facility bed rate. However, it is understood and agreed that when an inmate is admitted to a hospital that involves an overnight stay, and Dakota County is providing security for said inmate, then the inmate will no longer be considered to be boarded by Goodhue County and Dakota County will not be liable for payment of the daily bed rate for the hospitalized inmate. Goodhue County medical staff shall have the authority to provide all routine and non-emergency medical needs to the inmate at the Goodhue County Facility.

EMERGENCY ROOM VISITS

All medical emergencies will be transported to the appropriate facility as directed by the Goodhue County medical staff either by ambulance or by Goodhue County staff.

Goodhue County shall notify Dakota County of these situations as soon as possible and provide updates to the Dakota County designated contact as needed.

HOSPITAL ADMISSIONS

An inmate needing hospitalization will be transported to Regions Hospital. Goodhue County shall notify Dakota County of this situation as soon as possible. Dakota County will agree to send security supervision to the hospital facility upon notification. An inmate admitted to the hospital may have a permanent transfer to the care and custody of Dakota County, as determined by the authorities of the Dakota County facility.

HOSPITAL VISITS

An inmate needing medical follow-up clinic visits or medical specialty clinic visits will be transported by Dakota County correctional staff who will provide supervision of any visits required outside of the Goodhue County Correctional Facility. Goodhue County medical staff shall notify Dakota County medical staff of all scheduled appointments required outside of the Goodhue County Correctional Facility. Dakota County medical staff will assume and ensure the responsibility of arranging the medical transportation and supervision by the Dakota County correctional staff.

MEDICAL RECORDS

Medical record information, including test results and prescriptions, will be shared between the two facilities as medically necessary.

TUBERCULOSIS SCREENING

Screening of inmates for tuberculosis must comply with Minnesota Statutes § 144.455 pertaining to tuberculosis screening and follow-up practices. The Goodhue County medical staff and Dakota County medical staff shall communicate this information to ensure compliance with state regulations. Goodhue county medical staff will document TB screenings and notify Dakota County medical staff of the test results. Goodhue County will bill Dakota County for any TB screenings performed by Goodhue County medical staff on Dakota County inmates.

EXHIBIT B STANDARD ASSURANCES

1. NON-DISCRIMINATION. During the performance of this Contract, the Contractor shall not unlawfully discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, creed, religion, sex, national origin, disability, sexual orientation, age, marital status, veteran's status or public assistance status. The Contractor will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed and that employees are treated during employment without unlawful discrimination because of their race, color, creed, religion, sex, national origin, disability, sexual orientation, age, marital status, veteran's status, or public assistance status. Such action shall include, but not be limited to the following: employment, upgrading, demotion, or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The Contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices which set forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.

The Contractor will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of Contractor, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, creed, color, religion, sex, national origin, disability, sexual orientation, age, marital status, veteran's status, or public assistance status.

No funds received under this Contract shall be used to provide religious or sectarian training or services.

The Contractor shall comply with any applicable federal or state law regarding non-discrimination. The following list includes, but is not meant to limit, laws which may be applicable:

- A. <u>The Equal Employment Opportunity Act of 1972</u>, as amended, 42 U.S.C. § 2000e *et seq.* which prohibits discrimination in employment because of race, color, religion, sex, or national origin.
- B. <u>Equal Employment Opportunity-Executive Order No.11246, 30 FR 12319, signed September 24, 1965,</u> as amended, which is incorporated herein by reference, and prohibits discrimination by U.S. Government contractors and subcontractors because of race, color, religion, sex, or national origin.
- C. <u>The Rehabilitation Act of 1973</u>, as amended, 29 U.S.C. § 701 *et seq.* and 45 C.F.R. 84.3 (J) and (K) implementing Sec. 504 of the Act which prohibits discrimination against qualified handicapped persons in the access to or participation in federally-funded services or employment.
- D. The Age Discrimination in Employment Act of 1967, 29 U.S.C. § 621 et seq. as amended, and Minn. Stat. § 181.81, which generally prohibit discrimination because of age.
- E. The Equal Pay Act of 1963, as amended, 29 U.S.C. § 206(d), which provides that an employer may not discriminate on the basis of sex by paying employees of different sexes differently for the same work.
- F. Minn. Stat. Ch. 363A, as amended, which generally prohibits discrimination because of race, color, creed, religion, national origin, sex, marital status, status with regard to public assistance, disability, sexual orientation, or age.
- G. <u>Minn. Stat. § 181.59</u> which prohibits discrimination against any person by reason of race, creed, or color in any state or political subdivision contract for materials, supplies, or construction. Violation of this section is a misdemeanor and any second or subsequent violation of these terms may be cause for forfeiture of all sums due under the Contract.
- H. Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, 42 U.S.C. §§ 12101 through 12213, 47 U.S.C. §§ 225, 611, with regulations at 29 C.F.R. § 1630, which prohibits discrimination against qualified individuals on the basis of a disability in term, condition, or privilege of employment.
- I. <u>Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964</u>, 42 U.S.C. 2000d, *et seq.* and including 45 CFR Part 80, prohibits recipients of federal financial assistance from discriminating on the basis of national origin which includes not discriminating against those persons with limited English proficiency.
- J. Equal Protection of the Laws for Faith-based and Community Organizations-Executive Order No. 13279, signed December 12, 2002 and as amended May 3, 2018. Prohibits discrimination against grant seeking organizations on the basis of religion in the administration or distribution of federal financial assistance under social service programs, including grants and loans.
- K. <u>Vietnam Era Veterans' Readjustment Assistance Act of 1974</u>, as amended, 38 U.S.C. 4212, with regulations at 41 C.F.R. Part 60-250, which prohibits discrimination in employment against protected veterans.
- 2. **DATA PRIVACY**. For purposes of this Contract all data created, collected, received, stored, used, maintained, or disseminated by Contractor in the performance of this Contract is subject to the requirements of the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act, Minn. Stat. Ch. 13 and the Minnesota Rules implementing the Act now in force or hereafter adopted as well as any applicable Federal laws on data privacy. Contractor must comply with the applicable data management requirements as if it were a governmental entity. The remedies in Minn. Stat. § 13.08 apply to the Contractor. Contractor does not have a duty to provide access to public data to the public if the public data are available from the governmental agency (County), except as required by the terms of this Contract. All subcontracts shall contain the same or similar data practices compliance requirements.

- 3. **RECORDS DISCLOSURE/RETENTION.** Contractor's bonds, records, documents, papers, accounting procedures and practices, and other evidences relevant to this Contract are subject to the examination, duplication, transcription, and audit by the County and either the Legislative or State Auditor, pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 16C.05, subd. 5. Such evidences are also subject to review by the Comptroller General of the United States, or a duly authorized representative, if federal funds are used for any work under this Contract. The Contractor agrees to maintain such evidences for a period of six (6) years from the date services or payment were last provided or made or longer if any audit in progress requires a longer retention period.
- 4. <u>WORKER HEALTH, SAFETY AND TRAINING</u>. Contractor shall be solely responsible for the health and safety of its employees in connection with the work performed under this Contract. Contractor shall make arrangements to ensure the health and safety of all subcontractors and other persons who may perform work in connection with this Contract. Contractor shall ensure all personnel of Contractor and subcontractors are properly trained and supervised and, when applicable, duly licensed or certified appropriate to the tasks engaged in under this Contract. Each Contractor shall comply with federal, state, and local occupational safety and health standards, regulations, and rules promulgated pursuant to the Occupational Health and Safety Act which are applicable to the work to be performed by Contractor.
- 5. <u>CONTRACTOR GOOD STANDING.</u> Contractor shall maintain Good Standing status with the Office of the Minnesota Secretary of State, and shall notify County of any changes in Good Standing status within 5 calendar days of such change. Foreign business entities must maintain a certificate of authority (foreign corporations, limited liability companies, limited partnerships, and limited liability limited partnerships), or a statement of foreign qualification (foreign limited liability partnerships), or a statement of partnership authority (general partnerships). See Minn. Stat. §§ 303.03 (corporations); 322C.0802 (limited liability companies); 321.0902 and 321.0907 (foreign limited liability limited partnerships); 323A.1102(a) (foreign limited liability partnership); 321.0902 and 321.0907 (foreign general partnerships).
- 6. <u>CONTRACTOR DEBARMENT, SUSPENSION, AND RESPONSIBILITY CERTIFICATION</u>. Federal Regulation 45 CFR 92.35 prohibits the State/Agency from purchasing goods or services with federal money from vendors who have been suspended or debarred by the federal government. Similarly, Minn. Stat. § 16C.03, subd. 2 provides the Commissioner of Administration with the authority to debar and suspend vendors who seek to contract with the State/Agency. Vendors may be suspended or debarred when it is determined, through a duly authorized hearing process, that they have abused the public trust in a serious manner.

By signing this Contract, the Contractor certifies that it and its principals* and employees:

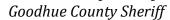
- A. Are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from transacting business by or with any federal, state, or local governmental department or agency; and
- B. Have not within a three (3) year period preceding this Contract: 1) been convicted of or had a civil judgment rendered against them for commission of fraud or a criminal offense in connection with obtaining, attempting to obtain, or performing a public (federal, state, or local) transaction or contract; 2) violated any federal or state antitrust statutes; or 3) committed embezzlement, theft, forgery, bribery, falsification or destruction of records, making false statements, or receiving stolen property; and
- C. Are not presently indicted or otherwise criminally or civilly charged by a governmental entity for: 1) commission of fraud or a criminal offense in connection with obtaining, attempting to obtain, or performing a public (federal, state, or local) transaction; 2) violating any federal or state antitrust statutes; or 3) committing embezzlement, theft, forgery, bribery, falsification or destruction of records, making false statements, or receiving stolen property; and
- D. Are not aware of any information and possess no knowledge that any subcontractor(s) that will perform work pursuant to this Contract are in violation of any of the certifications set forth above; and
- E. Shall immediately give written notice to the Authorized Representative should Contractor come under investigation for allegations of fraud or a criminal offense in connection with obtaining, or performing a public (federal, state, or local government) transaction; violating any federal or state antitrust statutes; or committing embezzlement, theft, forgery, bribery, falsification or destruction of records, making false statements, or receiving stolen property.

*"Principals" for the purposes of this certification means officers; directors; owners; partners; and persons having primary management or supervisory responsibilities within a business entity (e.g. general manager; plant manager; head of a subsidiary, division, or business segment and similar positions).

RE: Request to Order the EdgeWater Boat

SUMMARY

The Goodhue County Sheriff's Office is seeking the County Board's approval to order the EdgeWater boat, which is replacing the Everglades boat. This boat is funded 75% by the Port Security Grant Program and 25% by the 2024 Capital Plan.

BACKGROUND

The Goodhue County Sheriff's Office received approval for the FY2023 Port Security Grant Program award which will allow us to replace the current Everglades boat with the EdgeWater boat. The FY2023 grant starts September 1, 2023 and according to the grant guidelines, the equipment can be ordered any time after that date. The EdgeWater vendor stated the order would have to be placed in 2023 in order for the build to begin in 2024. After the EdgeWater boat is received, the Sheriff's Office will sell the Everglades boat through Auction Associates, which is the same place the squads are sold.

The vendor stated no money down is needed when the order is placed.

RECOMMENDATION

Approve the Goodhue County Sheriff's Office to place the order for the EdgeWater boat in 2023 to be built and paid for in 2024.

State of Minnesota Joint Powers Agreement

This Agreement is between the State of Minnesota, acting through its Department of Public Safety on behalf of the Bureau of Criminal Apprehension ("BCA"), and the County of Goodhue on behalf of its Prosecuting Attorney ("Governmental Unit"). The BCA and the Governmental Unit may be referred to jointly as "Parties."

Recitals

Under Minn. Stat. § 471.59, the BCA and the Governmental Unit are empowered to engage in agreements that are necessary to exercise their powers. Under Minn. Stat. § 299C.46, the BCA must provide a criminal justice data communications network to benefit political subdivisions as defined under Minn. Stat. § 299C.46, subd. 2 and subd. 2(a). The Governmental Unit is authorized by law to utilize the criminal justice data communications network pursuant to the terms set out in this Agreement. In addition, BCA either maintains repositories of data or has access to repositories of data that benefit authorized political subdivisions in performing their duties. The Governmental Unit wants to access data in support of its official duties.

The purpose of this Agreement is to create a method by which the Governmental Unit has access to those systems and tools for which it has eligibility, and to memorialize the requirements to obtain access and the limitations on the access.

Agreement

1 Term of Agreement

- **1.1 Effective Date.** This Agreement is effective on the date the BCA obtains all required signatures under Minn. Stat. § 16C.05, subdivision 2.
- **1.2 Expiration Date.** This Agreement expires five years from the date it is effective.

2 Agreement Between the Parties

2.1 General Access. BCA agrees to provide Governmental Unit with access to the Minnesota Criminal Justice Data Communications Network (CJDN) and those systems and tools which the Governmental Unit is authorized by law to access via the CJDN for the purposes outlined in Minn. Stat. § 299C.46.

2.2 Methods of Access.

The BCA offers three (3) methods of access to its systems and tools. The methods of access are:

- A. **Direct access** occurs when individual users at the Governmental Unit use the Governmental Unit's equipment to access the BCA's systems and tools. This is generally accomplished by an individual user entering a query into one of BCA's systems or tools.
- B. Indirect Access occurs when individual users at the Governmental Unit go to another Governmental Unit to obtain data and information from BCA's systems and tools. This method of access generally results in the Governmental Unit with indirect access obtaining the needed data and information in a physical format like a paper report.
- C. **Computer-to-Computer System Interface** occurs when the Governmental Unit's computer exchanges data and information with BCA's computer systems and tools using an interface. Without limitation, interface types include: state message switch, web services, enterprise service bus and message queuing.

For purposes of this Agreement, Governmental Unit employees or contractors may use any of these methods to use BCA's systems and tools as described in this Agreement. Governmental Unit will select a

- method of access and can change the methodology following the process in Clause 2.10.
- **2.3 Federal Systems Access.** In addition, pursuant to 28 CFR §20.30-38 and Minn. Stat. §299C.58, BCA may provide Governmental Unit with access to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) National Crime Information Center.
- 2.4 Governmental Unit Policies. Both the BCA and the FBI's Criminal Justice Information Systems (FBI-CJIS) have policies, regulations and laws on access, use, audit, dissemination, hit confirmation, logging, quality assurance, screening (pre-employment), security, timeliness, training, use of the system, and validation. Governmental Unit has created its own policies to ensure that Governmental Unit's employees and contractors comply with all applicable requirements. Governmental Unit ensures this compliance through appropriate enforcement. These BCA and FBI-CJIS policies and regulations, as amended and updated from time to time, are incorporated into this Agreement by reference. The policies are available at https://bcanextest.x.state.mn.us/launchpad/.
- 2.5 Governmental Unit Resources. To assist Governmental Unit in complying with the federal and state requirements on access to and use of the various systems and tools, information is available at https://sps.x.state.mn.us/sites/bcaservicecatalog/default.aspx. Additional information on appropriate use is found in the Minnesota Bureau of Criminal Apprehension Policy on Appropriate Use of Systems and Data available at https://bcanextest.x.state.mn.us/launchpad/cjisdocs/docs.cgi?cmd=FS&ID=795&TYPE=DOCS.

2.6 Access Granted.

- A. Governmental Unit is granted permission to use all current and future BCA systems and tools for which Governmental Unit is eligible. Eligibility is dependent on Governmental Unit (i) satisfying all applicable federal or state statutory requirements; (ii) complying with the terms of this Agreement; and (iii) acceptance by BCA of Governmental Unit's written request for use of a specific system or tool.
- B. To facilitate changes in systems and tools, Governmental Unit grants its Authorized Representative authority to make written requests for those systems and tools provided by BCA that the Governmental Unit needs to meet its criminal justice obligations and for which Governmental Unit is eligible.
- **2.7 Future Access.** On written request from the Governmental Unit, BCA also may provide Governmental Unit with access to those systems or tools which may become available after the signing of this Agreement, to the extent that the access is authorized by applicable state and federal law. Governmental Unit agrees to be bound by the terms and conditions contained in this Agreement that when utilizing new systems or tools provided under this Agreement.
- **2.8 Limitations on Access.** BCA agrees that it will comply with applicable state and federal laws when making information accessible. Governmental Unit agrees that it will comply with applicable state and federal laws when accessing, entering, using, disseminating, and storing data. Each party is responsible for its own compliance with the most current applicable state and federal laws.
- **2.9 Supersedes Prior Agreements.** This Agreement supersedes any and all prior agreements between the BCA and the Governmental Unit regarding access to and use of systems and tools provided by BCA.
- **2.10 Requirement to Update Information.** The parties agree that if there is a change to any of the information whether required by law or this Agreement, the party will send the new information to the other party in writing within 30 days of the change. This clause does not apply to changes in systems or tools provided under this Agreement.
 - This requirement to give notice additionally applies to changes in the individual or organization serving the Governmental Unit as its prosecutor. Any change in performance of the prosecutorial function must be provided to the BCA in writing by giving notice to the Service Desk, BCA.ServiceDesk@state.mn.us.
- **2.11 Transaction Record.** The BCA creates and maintains a transaction record for each exchange of data utilizing its systems and tools. In order to meet FBI-CJIS requirements and to perform the audits described in Clause 7, there must be a method of identifying which individual users at the Governmental Unit conducted a

particular transaction.

If Governmental Unit uses either direct access as described in Clause 2.2A or indirect access as described in Clause 2.2B, BCA's transaction record meets FBI-CJIS requirements.

When Governmental Unit's method of access is a computer-to-computer interface as described in Clause 2.2C, the Governmental Unit must keep a transaction record sufficient to satisfy FBI-CJIS requirements and permit the audits described in Clause 7 to occur.

If a Governmental Unit accesses data from the Driver and Vehicle Services Division in the Minnesota Department of Public Safety and keeps a copy of the data, Governmental Unit must have a transaction record of all subsequent access to the data that are kept by the Governmental Unit. The transaction record must include the individual user who requested access, and the date, time and content of the request. The transaction record must also include the date, time and content of the response along with the destination to which the data were sent. The transaction record must be maintained for a minimum of six (6) years from the date the transaction occurred and must be made available to the BCA within one (1) business day of the BCA's request.

- 2.12 Court Information Access. Certain BCA systems and tools that include access to and/or submission of Court Records may only be utilized by the Governmental Unit if the Governmental Unit completes the Court Data Services Subscriber Amendment, which upon execution will be incorporated into this Agreement by reference. These BCA systems and tools are identified in the written request made by the Governmental Unit under Clause 2.6 above. The Court Data Services Subscriber Amendment provides important additional terms, including but not limited to privacy (see Clause 8.2, below), fees (see Clause 3 below), and transaction records or logs, that govern Governmental Unit's access to and/or submission of the Court Records delivered through the BCA systems and tools.
- 2.13 Vendor Personnel Screening. The BCA will conduct all vendor personnel screening on behalf of Governmental Unit as is required by the FBI CJIS Security Policy. The BCA will maintain records of the federal, fingerprint-based background check on each vendor employee as well as records of the completion of the security awareness training that may be relied on by the Governmental Unit.

3 Payment

The Governmental Unit currently accesses the criminal justice data communications network described in Minn. Stat. §299C.46. The bills are sent annually for a total annual cost of Six Hundred Dollars (\$600.00).

The Governmental Unit will identify its contact person for billing purposes, and will provide updated information to BCA's Authorized Representative within ten business days when this information changes.

If Governmental Unit chooses to execute the Court Data Services Subscriber Amendment referred to in Clause 2.12 in order to access and/or submit Court Records via BCA's systems, additional fees, if any, are addressed in that amendment.

5 Assignment, Amendments, Waiver, and Agreement Complete

- **5.1 Assignment.** Neither party may assign nor transfer any rights or obligations under this Agreement.
- **5.2 Amendments.** Any amendment to this Agreement, except those described in Clauses 2.6 and 2.7 above must be in writing and will not be effective until it has been signed and approved by the same parties who signed and approved the original agreement, their successors in office, or another individual duly authorized.
- **5.3 Waiver.** If either party fails to enforce any provision of this Agreement, that failure does not waive the provision or the right to enforce it.
- **5.4 Agreement Complete.** This Agreement contains all negotiations and agreements between the BCA and the Governmental Unit. No other understanding regarding this Agreement, whether written or oral, may be used to bind either party.

6 Liability

Each party will be responsible for its own acts and behavior and the results thereof and shall not be responsible or liable for the other party's actions and consequences of those actions. The Minnesota Torts Claims Act, Minn. Stat. § 3.736 and other applicable laws govern the BCA's liability. The Minnesota Municipal Tort Claims Act, Minn. Stat. Ch. 466 and other applicable laws, governs the Governmental Unit's liability.

7 Audits

- **7.1** Under Minn. Stat. § 16C.05, subd. 5, the Governmental Unit's books, records, documents, internal policies and accounting procedures and practices relevant to this Agreement are subject to examination by the BCA, the State Auditor or Legislative Auditor, as appropriate, for a minimum of six years from the end of this Agreement.
 - Under Minn. Stat. § 6.551, the State Auditor may examine the books, records, documents, and accounting procedures and practices of BCA. The examination shall be limited to the books, records, documents, and accounting procedures and practices that are relevant to this Agreement.
- 7.2 Under applicable state and federal law, the Governmental Unit's records are subject to examination by the BCA to ensure compliance with laws, regulations and policies about access, use, and dissemination of data.
- 7.3 If the Governmental Unit accesses federal databases, the Governmental Unit's records are subject to examination by the FBI and BCA; the Governmental Unit will cooperate with FBI and BCA auditors and make any requested data available for review and audit.
- **7.4** If the Governmental Unit accesses state databases, the Governmental Unit's records are subject to examination by the BCA: the Governmental Unit will cooperate with the BCA auditors and make any requested data available for review and audit.
- 7.5 To facilitate the audits required by state and federal law, Governmental Unit is required to have an inventory of the equipment used to access the data covered by this Agreement and the physical location of each.

8 Government Data Practices

- 8.1 BCA and Governmental Unit. The Governmental Unit and BCA must comply with the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act, Minn. Stat. Ch. 13, as it applies to all data accessible under this Agreement, and as it applies to all data created, collected, received, stored, used, maintained, or disseminated by the Governmental Unit under this Agreement. The remedies of Minn. Stat. §§ 13.08 and 13.09 apply to the release of the data referred to in this clause by either the Governmental Unit or the BCA.
- 8.2 Court Records. If Governmental Unit chooses to execute the Court Data Services Subscriber Amendment referred to in Clause 2.12 in order to access and/or submit Court Records via BCA's systems, the following provisions regarding data practices also apply. The Court is not subject to Minn. Stat. Ch. 13 but is subject to the Rules of Public Access to Records of the Judicial Branch promulgated by the Minnesota Supreme Court. All parties acknowledge and agree that Minn. Stat. § 13.03, subdivision 4(e) requires that the BCA and the Governmental Unit comply with the Rules of Public Access for those data received from Court under the Court Data Services Subscriber Amendment. All parties also acknowledge and agree that the use of, access to or submission of Court Records, as that term is defined in the Court Data Services Subscriber Amendment, may be restricted by rules promulgated by the Minnesota Supreme Court, applicable state statute or federal law. All parties acknowledge and agree that these applicable restrictions must be followed in the appropriate circumstances.

9 Investigation of Alleged Violations; Sanctions

For purposes of this clause, "Individual User" means an employee or contractor of Governmental Unit.

9.1 Investigation. The Governmental Unit and BCA agree to cooperate in the investigation and possible prosecution of suspected violations of federal and state law referenced in this Agreement. Governmental Unit and BCA agree to cooperate in the investigation of suspected violations of the policies and procedures referenced in this Agreement. When BCA becomes aware that a violation may have occurred, BCA will inform Governmental Unit of the suspected violation, subject to any restrictions in applicable law. When Governmental Unit becomes aware that a violation has occurred, Governmental Unit will inform BCA subject to any restrictions in applicable law.

9.2 Sanctions Involving Only BCA Systems and Tools.

The following provisions apply to BCA systems and tools not covered by the Court Data Services Subscriber Amendment. None of these provisions alter the Governmental Unit internal discipline processes, including those governed by a collective bargaining agreement.

- 9.2.1 For BCA systems and tools that are not covered by the Court Data Services Subscriber Amendment, Governmental Unit must determine if and when an involved Individual User's access to systems or tools is to be temporarily or permanently eliminated. The decision to suspend or terminate access may be made as soon as alleged violation is discovered, after notice of an alleged violation is received, or after an investigation has occurred. Governmental Unit must report the status of the Individual User's access to BCA without delay. BCA reserves the right to make a different determination concerning an Individual User's access to systems or tools than that made by Governmental Unit and BCA's determination controls.
- **9.2.2** If BCA determines that Governmental Unit has jeopardized the integrity of the systems or tools covered in this Clause 9.2, BCA may temporarily stop providing some or all the systems or tools under this Agreement until the failure is remedied to the BCA's satisfaction. If Governmental Unit's failure is continuing or repeated, Clause 11.1 does not apply and BCA may terminate this Agreement immediately.

9.3 Sanctions Involving Only Court Data Services

The following provisions apply to those systems and tools covered by the Court Data Services Subscriber Amendment, if it has been signed by Governmental Unit. As part of the agreement between the Court and the BCA for the delivery of the systems and tools that are covered by the Court Data Services Subscriber

Amendment, BCA is required to suspend or terminate access to or use of the systems and tools either on its own initiative or when directed by the Court. The decision to suspend or terminate access may be made as soon as an alleged violation is discovered, after notice of an alleged violation is received, or after an investigation has occurred. The decision to suspend or terminate may also be made based on a request from the Authorized Representative of Governmental Unit. The agreement further provides that only the Court has the authority to reinstate access and use.

- **9.3.1** Governmental Unit understands that if it has signed the Court Data Services Subscriber Amendment and if Governmental Unit's Individual Users violate the provisions of that Amendment, access and use will be suspended by BCA or Court. Governmental Unit also understands that reinstatement is only at the direction of the Court.
- **9.3.2** Governmental Unit further agrees that if Governmental Unit believes that one or more of its Individual Users have violated the terms of the Amendment, it will notify BCA and Court so that an investigation as described in Clause 9.1 may occur.

10 Venue

Venue for all legal proceedings involving this Agreement, or its breach, must be in the appropriate state or federal court with competent jurisdiction in Ramsey County, Minnesota.

11 Termination

- **11.1 Termination.** The BCA or the Governmental Unit may terminate this Agreement at any time, with or without cause, upon 30 days' written notice to the other party's Authorized Representative.
- 11.2 Termination for Insufficient Funding. Either party may immediately terminate this Agreement if it does not obtain funding from the Minnesota Legislature, or other funding source; or if funding cannot be continued at a level sufficient to allow for the payment of the services covered here. Termination must be by written notice to the other party's authorized representative. The Governmental Unit is not obligated to pay for any services that are provided after notice and effective date of termination. However, the BCA will be entitled to payment, determined on a pro rata basis, for services satisfactorily performed to the extent that funds are available. Neither party will be assessed any penalty if the agreement is terminated because of the decision of the Minnesota Legislature, or other funding source, not to appropriate funds. Notice of the lack of funding must be provided within a reasonable time of the affected party receiving that notice.

12 Continuing Obligations

The following clauses survive the expiration or cancellation of this Agreement: Liability; Audits; Government Data Practices; 9. Investigation of Alleged Violations; Sanctions; and Venue.

COURT DATA SERVICES SUBSCRIBER AMENDMENT TO CJDN SUBSCRIBER AGREEMENT

This Court Data Services Subscriber Amendment ("Subscriber Amendment") is entered into by the State of Minnesota, acting through its Department of Public Safety, Bureau of Criminal Apprehension, ("BCA") and the County of Goodhue on behalf of its Prosecuting Attorney ("Agency"), and by and for the benefit of the State of Minnesota acting through its State Court Administrator's Office ("Court") who shall be entitled to enforce any provisions hereof through any legal action against any party.

Recitals

This Subscriber Amendment modifies and supplements the Agreement between the BCA and Agency, SWIFT Contract number 226454, of even or prior date, for Agency use of BCA systems and tools (referred to herein as "the CJDN Subscriber Agreement"). Certain BCA systems and tools that include access to and/or submission of Court Records may only be utilized by the Agency if the Agency completes this Subscriber Amendment. The Agency desires to use one or more BCA systems and tools to access and/or submit Court Records to assist the Agency in the efficient performance of its duties as required or authorized by law or court rule. Court desires to permit such access and/or submission. This Subscriber Amendment is intended to add Court as a party to the CJDN Subscriber Agreement and to create obligations by the Agency to the Court that can be enforced by the Court. It is also understood that, pursuant to the Master Joint Powers Agreement for Delivery of Court Data Services to CJDN Subscribers ("Master Authorization Agreement") between the Court and the BCA, the BCA is authorized to sign this Subscriber Amendment on behalf of Court. Upon execution the Subscriber Amendment will be incorporated into the CJDN Subscriber Agreement by reference. The BCA, the Agency and the Court desire to amend the CJDN Subscriber Agreement as stated below.

The CJDN Subscriber Agreement is amended by the addition of the following provisions:

- 1. **TERM; TERMINATION; ONGOING OBLIGATIONS.** This Subscriber Amendment shall be effective on the date finally executed by all parties and shall remain in effect until expiration or termination of the CJDN Subscriber Agreement unless terminated earlier as provided in this Subscriber Amendment. Any party may terminate this Subscriber Amendment with or without cause by giving written notice to all other parties. The effective date of the termination shall be thirty days after the other party's receipt of the notice of termination, unless a later date is specified in the notice. The provisions of sections 5 through 9, 12.b., 12.c., and 15 through 24 shall survive any termination of this Subscriber Amendment as shall any other provisions which by their nature are intended or expected to survive such termination. Upon termination, the Subscriber shall perform the responsibilities set forth in paragraph 7(f) hereof.
- 2. **Definitions**. Unless otherwise specifically defined, each term used herein shall have the meaning assigned to such term in the CJDN Subscriber Agreement.

- **a.** "Authorized Court Data Services" means Court Data Services that have been authorized for delivery to CJDN Subscribers via BCA systems and tools pursuant to an Authorization Amendment to the Joint Powers Agreement for Delivery of Court Data Services to CJDN Subscribers ("Master Authorization Agreement") between the Court and the BCA.
- **b.** "Court Data Services" means one or more of the services set forth on the Justice Agency Resource webpage of the Minnesota Judicial Branch website (for which the current address is www.courts.state.mn.us) or other location designated by the Court, as the same may be amended from time to time by the Court.
- **c.** "Court Records" means all information in any form made available by the Court to Subscriber through the BCA for the purposes of carrying out this Subscriber Amendment, including:
 - i. "Court Case Information" means any information in the Court Records that conveys information about a particular case or controversy, including without limitation Court Confidential Case Information, as defined herein.
 - ii. "Court Confidential Case Information" means any information in the Court Records that is inaccessible to the public pursuant to the Rules of Public Access and that conveys information about a particular case or controversy.
 - iii. "Court Confidential Security and Activation Information" means any information in the Court Records that is inaccessible to the public pursuant to the Rules of Public Access and that explains how to use or gain access to Court Data Services, including but not limited to login account names, passwords, TCP/IP addresses, Court Data Services user manuals, Court Data Services Programs, Court Data Services Databases, and other technical information.
 - iv. "Court Confidential Information" means any information in the Court Records that is inaccessible to the public pursuant to the Rules of Public Access, including without limitation both i) Court Confidential Case Information; and ii) Court Confidential Security and Activation Information.
- **d.** "**DCA**" shall mean the district courts of the state of Minnesota and their respective staff.
- e. "Policies & Notices" means the policies and notices published by the Court in connection with each of its Court Data Services, on a website or other location designated by the Court, as the same may be amended from time to time by the Court. Policies & Notices for each Authorized Court Data Service identified in an approved request form under section 3, below, are hereby made part of this Subscriber Amendment by this reference and provide additional terms and conditions that govern Subscriber's use of Court Records accessed through such services, including but not limited to provisions on access and use limitations.

- f. "Rules of Public Access" means the Rules of Public Access to Records of the Judicial Branch promulgated by the Minnesota Supreme Court, as the same may be amended from time to time, including without limitation lists or tables published from time to time by the Court entitled *Limits on Public Access to Case Records or Limits on Public Access to Administrative Records*, all of which by this reference are made a part of this Subscriber Amendment. It is the obligation of Subscriber to check from time to time for updated rules, lists, and tables and be familiar with the contents thereof. It is contemplated that such rules, lists, and tables will be posted on the Minnesota Judicial Branch website, for which the current address is www.courts.state.mn.us.
- **g.** "Court" shall mean the State of Minnesota, State Court Administrator's Office.
 - **h.** "Subscriber" shall mean the Agency.
- **i.** "Subscriber Records" means any information in any form made available by the Subscriber to the Court for the purposes of carrying out this Subscriber Amendment.
- 3. REQUESTS FOR AUTHORIZED COURT DATA SERVICES. Following execution of this Subscriber Amendment by all parties, Subscriber may submit to the BCA one or more separate requests for Authorized Court Data Services. The BCA is authorized in the Master Authorization Agreement to process, credential and approve such requests on behalf of Court and all such requests approved by the BCA are adopted and incorporated herein by this reference the same as if set forth verbatim herein.
 - **a. Activation**. Activation of the requested Authorized Court Data Service(s) shall occur promptly following approval.
 - **b. Rejection**. Requests may be rejected for any reason, at the discretion of the BCA and/or the Court.
 - c. Requests for Termination of One or More Authorized Court Data Services. The Subscriber may request the termination of an Authorized Court Data Services previously requested by submitting a notice to Court with a copy to the BCA. Promptly upon receipt of a request for termination of an Authorized Court Data Service, the BCA will deactivate the service requested. The termination of one or more Authorized Court Data Services does not terminate this Subscriber Amendment. Provisions for termination of this Subscriber Amendment are set forth in section 1. Upon termination of Authorized Court Data Services, the Subscriber shall perform the responsibilities set forth in paragraph 7(f) hereof.
- 4. SCOPE OF ACCESS TO COURT RECORDS LIMITED. Subscriber's access to and/or submission of the Court Records shall be limited to Authorized Court Data Services identified in an approved request form under section 3, above, and other Court Records necessary for Subscriber to use Authorized Court Data Services. Authorized Court Data Services shall only be used according to the instructions provided in corresponding Policies & Notices or other materials and only as necessary to assist Subscriber in the efficient performance of Subscriber's duties

required or authorized by law or court rule in connection with any civil, criminal, administrative, or arbitral proceeding in any Federal, State, or local court or agency or before any self-regulatory body. Subscriber's access to the Court Records for personal or non-official use is prohibited. Subscriber will not use or attempt to use Authorized Court Data Services in any manner not set forth in this Subscriber Amendment, Policies & Notices, or other Authorized Court Data Services documentation, and upon any such unauthorized use or attempted use the Court may immediately terminate this Subscriber Amendment without prior notice to Subscriber.

5. GUARANTEES OF CONFIDENTIALITY. Subscriber agrees:

- **a.** To not disclose Court Confidential Information to any third party except where necessary to carry out the Subscriber's duties as required or authorized by law or court rule in connection with any civil, criminal, administrative, or arbitral proceeding in any Federal, State, or local court or agency or before any self-regulatory body.
- **b.** To take all appropriate action, whether by instruction, agreement, or otherwise, to insure the protection, confidentiality and security of Court Confidential Information and to satisfy Subscriber's obligations under this Subscriber Amendment.
- c. To limit the use of and access to Court Confidential Information to Subscriber's bona fide personnel whose use or access is necessary to effect the purposes of this Subscriber Amendment, and to advise each individual who is permitted use of and/or access to any Court Confidential Information of the restrictions upon disclosure and use contained in this Subscriber Amendment, requiring each individual who is permitted use of and/or access to Court Confidential Information to acknowledge in writing that the individual has read and understands such restrictions. Subscriber shall keep such acknowledgements on file for one year following termination of the Subscriber Amendment and/or CJDN Subscriber Agreement, whichever is longer, and shall provide the Court with access to, and copies of, such acknowledgements upon request. For purposes of this Subscriber Amendment, Subscriber's bona fide personnel shall mean individuals who are employees of Subscriber or provide services to Subscriber either on a voluntary basis or as independent contractors with Subscriber.
- **d.** That, without limiting section 1 of this Subscriber Amendment, the obligations of Subscriber and its bona fide personnel with respect to the confidentiality and security of Court Confidential Information shall survive the termination of this Subscriber Amendment and the CJDN Subscriber Agreement and the termination of their relationship with Subscriber.
- **e.** That, notwithstanding any federal or state law applicable to the nondisclosure obligations of Subscriber and Subscriber's bona fide personnel under this Subscriber Amendment, such obligations of Subscriber and Subscriber's bona fide personnel are founded independently on the provisions of this Subscriber Amendment.
- 6. APPLICABILITY TO PREVIOUSLY DISCLOSED COURT RECORDS. Subscriber acknowledges and agrees that all Authorized Court Data Services and related Court Records disclosed to Subscriber prior to the effective date of this Subscriber Amendment shall be subject to the provisions of this Subscriber Amendment.

- 7. LICENSE AND PROTECTION OF PROPRIETARY RIGHTS. During the term of this Subscriber Amendment, subject to the terms and conditions hereof, the Court hereby grants to Subscriber a nonexclusive, nontransferable, limited license to use Court Data Services Programs and Court Data Services Databases to access or receive the Authorized Court Data Services identified in an approved request form under section 3, above, and related Court Records. Court reserves the right to make modifications to the Authorized Court Data Services, Court Data Services Programs, and Court Data Services Databases, and related materials without notice to Subscriber. These modifications shall be treated in all respects as their previous counterparts.
 - a. Court Data Services Programs. Court is the copyright owner and licensor of the Court Data Services Programs. The combination of ideas, procedures, processes, systems, logic, coherence and methods of operation embodied within the Court Data Services Programs, and all information contained in documentation pertaining to the Court Data Services Programs, including but not limited to manuals, user documentation, and passwords, are trade secret information of Court and its licensors.
 - **b.** Court Data Services Databases. Court is the copyright owner and licensor of the Court Data Services Databases and of all copyrightable aspects and components thereof. All specifications and information pertaining to the Court Data Services Databases and their structure, sequence and organization, including without limitation data schemas such as the Court XML Schema, are trade secret information of Court and its licensors.
 - **c. Marks.** Subscriber shall neither have nor claim any right, title, or interest in or use of any trademark used in connection with Authorized Court Data Services, including but not limited to the marks "MNCIS" and "Odyssey."
 - Restrictions on Duplication, Disclosure, and Use. Trade secret information d. of Court and its licensors will be treated by Subscriber in the same manner as Court Confidential Information. In addition, Subscriber will not copy any part of the Court Data Services Programs or Court Data Services Databases, or reverse engineer or otherwise attempt to discern the source code of the Court Data Services Programs or Court Data Services Databases, or use any trademark of Court or its licensors, in any way or for any purpose not specifically and expressly authorized by this Subscriber Amendment. As used herein, "trade secret information of Court and its licensors" means any information possessed by Court which derives independent economic value from not being generally known to, and not being readily ascertainable by proper means by, other persons who can obtain economic value from its disclosure or use. "Trade secret information of Court and its licensors" does not, however, include information which was known to Subscriber prior to Subscriber's receipt thereof, either directly or indirectly, from Court or its licensors, information which is independently developed by Subscriber without reference to or use of information received from Court or its licensors, or information which would not qualify as a trade secret under Minnesota law. It will not be a violation of this section 7, sub-section d, for Subscriber to make up to one copy of training materials and configuration documentation, if any, for each individual authorized to access, use, or configure Authorized Court Data Services, solely for its own use in connection with this Subscriber Amendment. Subscriber will take all steps reasonably necessary to protect the copyright, trade secret, and trademark rights of Court and its licensors and Subscriber will advise its bona fide personnel who are permitted access to any of the Court Data Services Programs and Court Data Services Databases, and trade secret information of Court and its licensors, of the restrictions upon duplication, disclosure and use contained in this Subscriber Amendment.

- e. Proprietary Notices. Subscriber will not remove any copyright or proprietary notices included in and/or on the Court Data Services Programs or Court Data Services Databases, related documentation, or trade secret information of Court and its licensors, or any part thereof, made available by Court directly or through the BCA, if any, and Subscriber will include in and/or on any copy of the Court Data Services Programs or Court Data Services Databases, or trade secret information of Court and its licensors and any documents pertaining thereto, the same copyright and other proprietary notices as appear on the copies made available to Subscriber by Court directly or through the BCA, except that copyright notices shall be updated and other proprietary notices added as may be appropriate.
- **f. Title; Return.** The Court Data Services Programs and Court Data Services Databases, and related documentation, including but not limited to training and configuration material, if any, and logon account information and passwords, if any, made available by the Court to Subscriber directly or through the BCA and all copies, including partial copies, thereof are and remain the property of the respective licensor. Except as expressly provided in section 12.b., within ten days of the effective date of termination of this Subscriber Amendment or the CJDN Subscriber Agreement or within ten days of a request for termination of Authorized Court Data Service as described in section 4, Subscriber shall either: (i) uninstall and return any and all copies of the applicable Court Data Services Programs and Court Data Services Databases, and related documentation, including but not limited to training and configuration materials, if any, and logon account information, if any; or (2) destroy the same and certify in writing to the Court that the same have been destroyed.
- 8. INJUNCTIVE RELIEF. Subscriber acknowledges that the Court, Court's licensors, and DCA will be irreparably harmed if Subscriber's obligations under this Subscriber Amendment are not specifically enforced and that the Court, Court's licensors, and DCA would not have an adequate remedy at law in the event of an actual or threatened violation by Subscriber of its obligations. Therefore, Subscriber agrees that the Court, Court's licensors, and DCA shall be entitled to an injunction or any appropriate decree of specific performance for any actual or threatened violations or breaches by Subscriber or its bona fide personnel without the necessity of the Court, Court's licensors, or DCA showing actual damages or that monetary damages would not afford an adequate remedy. Unless Subscriber is an office, officer, agency, department, division, or bureau of the state of Minnesota, Subscriber shall be liable to the Court, Court's licensors, and DCA for reasonable attorneys fees incurred by the Court, Court's licensors, and DCA in obtaining any relief pursuant to this Subscriber Amendment.
- 9. LIABILITY. Subscriber and the Court agree that, except as otherwise expressly provided herein, each party will be responsible for its own acts and the results thereof to the extent authorized by law and shall not be responsible for the acts of any others and the results thereof. Liability shall be governed by applicable law. Without limiting the foregoing, liability of the Court and any Subscriber that is an office, officer, agency, department, division, or bureau of the state of Minnesota shall be governed by the provisions of the Minnesota Tort Claims Act, Minnesota Statutes, section 3.376, and other applicable law. Without limiting the foregoing, if Subscriber is a political subdivision of the state of Minnesota, liability of the Subscriber shall be governed by the provisions of Minn. Stat. Ch. 466 (Tort Liability, Political Subdivisions) or other applicable law. Subscriber and Court further acknowledge that the liability, if any, of the BCA is governed by a separate agreement between the Court and the BCA dated December 13, 2010 with DPS-M -0958.

10. AVAILABILITY. Specific terms of availability shall be established by the Court and communicated to Subscriber by the Court and/or the BCA. The Court reserves the right to terminate this Subscriber Amendment immediately and/or temporarily suspend Subscriber's Authorized Court Data Services in the event the capacity of any host computer system or legislative appropriation of funds is determined solely by the Court to be insufficient to meet the computer needs of the courts served by the host computer system.

11. [reserved]

- 12. ADDITIONAL USER OBLIGATIONS. The obligations of the Subscriber set forth in this section are in addition to the other obligations of the Subscriber set forth elsewhere in this Subscriber Amendment.
 - a. Judicial Policy Statement. Subscriber agrees to comply with all policies identified in Policies & Notices applicable to Court Records accessed by Subscriber using Authorized Court Data Services. Upon failure of the Subscriber to comply with such policies, the Court shall have the option of immediately suspending the Subscriber's Authorized Court Data Services on a temporary basis and/or immediately terminating this Subscriber Amendment.
 - b. Access and Use; Log. Subscriber shall be responsible for all access to and use of Authorized Court Data Services and Court Records by Subscriber's bona fide personnel or by means of Subscriber's equipment or passwords, whether or not Subscriber has knowledge of or authorizes such access and use. Subscriber shall also maintain a log identifying all persons to whom Subscriber has disclosed its Court Confidential Security and Activation Information, such as user ID(s) and password(s), including the date of such disclosure. Subscriber shall maintain such logs for a minimum period of six years from the date of disclosure, and shall provide the Court with access to, and copies of, such logs upon request. The Court may conduct audits of Subscriber's logs and use of Authorized Court Data Services and Court Records from time to time. Upon Subscriber's failure to maintain such logs, to maintain accurate logs, or to promptly provide access by the Court to such logs, the Court may terminate this Subscriber Amendment without prior notice to Subscriber.
 - **c. Personnel.** Subscriber agrees to investigate, at the request of the Court and/or the BCA, allegations of misconduct pertaining to Subscriber's bona fide personnel having access to or use of Authorized Court Data Services, Court Confidential Information, or trade secret information of the Court and its licensors where such persons are alleged to have violated the provisions of this Subscriber Amendment, Policies & Notices, Judicial Branch policies, or other security requirements or laws regulating access to the Court Records.
 - d. Minnesota Data Practices Act Applicability. If Subscriber is a Minnesota Government entity that is subject to the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act, Minn. Stat. Ch. 13, Subscriber acknowledges and agrees that: (1) the Court is not subject to Minn. Stat. Ch. 13 (see section 13.90) but is subject to the Rules of Public Access and other rules promulgated by the Minnesota Supreme Court; (2) Minn. Stat. section 13.03, subdivision 4(e) requires that Subscriber comply with the Rules of Public Access and other rules promulgated by the Minnesota Supreme Court for access to Court Records provided via the

BCA systems and tools under this Subscriber Amendment; (3) the use of and access to Court Records may be restricted by rules promulgated by the Minnesota Supreme Court, applicable state statute or federal law; and (4) these applicable restrictions must be followed in the appropriate circumstances.

- 13. FEES; INVOICES. Unless the Subscriber is an office, officer, department, division, agency, or bureau of the state of Minnesota, Subscriber shall pay the fees, if any, set forth in applicable Policies & Notices, together with applicable sales, use or other taxes. Applicable monthly fees commence ten (10) days after notice of approval of the request pursuant to section 3 of this Subscriber Amendment or upon the initial Subscriber transaction as defined in the Policies & Notices, whichever occurs earlier. When fees apply, the Court shall invoice Subscriber on a monthly basis for charges incurred in the preceding month and applicable taxes, if any, and payment of all amounts shall be due upon receipt of invoice. If all amounts are not paid within 30 days of the date of the invoice, the Court may immediately cancel this Subscriber Amendment without notice to Subscriber and pursue all available legal remedies. Subscriber certifies that funds have been appropriated for the payment of charges under this Subscriber Amendment for the current fiscal year, if applicable.
- **14. MODIFICATION OF FEES.** Court may modify the fees by amending the Policies & Notices as provided herein, and the modified fees shall be effective on the date specified in the Policies & Notices, which shall not be less than thirty days from the publication of the Policies & Notices. Subscriber shall have the option of accepting such changes or terminating this Subscriber Amendment as provided in section 1 hereof.

15. WARRANTY DISCLAIMERS.

- **a. WARRANTY EXCLUSIONS.** EXCEPT AS SPECIFICALLY AND EXPRESSLY PROVIDED HEREIN, COURT, COURT'S LICENSORS, AND DCA MAKE NO REPRESENTATIONS OR WARRANTIES OF ANY KIND, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO THE WARRANTIES OF FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE OR MERCHANTABILITY, NOR ARE ANY WARRANTIES TO BE IMPLIED, WITH RESPECT TO THE INFORMATION, SERVICES OR COMPUTER PROGRAMS MADE AVAILABLE UNDER THIS AGREEMENT.
- **b. ACCURACY AND COMPLETENESS OF INFORMATION.** WITHOUT LIMITING THE GENERALITY OF THE PRECEDING PARAGRAPH, COURT, COURT'S LICENSORS, AND DCA MAKE NO WARRANTIES AS TO THE ACCURACY OR COMPLETENESS OF THE INFORMATION CONTAINED IN THE COURT RECORDS.
- 16. RELATIONSHIP OF THE PARTIES. Subscriber is an independent contractor and shall not be deemed for any purpose to be an employee, partner, agent or franchisee of the Court, Court's licensors, or DCA. Neither Subscriber nor the Court, Court's licensors, or DCA shall have the right nor the authority to assume, create or incur any liability or obligation of any kind, express or implied, against or in the name of or on behalf of the other.
- 17. NOTICE. Except as provided in section 2 regarding notices of or modifications to Authorized Court Data Services and Policies & Notices, any notice to Court or Subscriber

hereunder shall be deemed to have been received when personally delivered in writing or seventy-two (72) hours after it has been deposited in the United States mail, first class, proper postage prepaid, addressed to the party to whom it is intended at the address set forth on page one of this Agreement or at such other address of which notice has been given in accordance herewith.

- 18. NON-WAIVER. The failure by any party at any time to enforce any of the provisions of this Subscriber Amendment or any right or remedy available hereunder or at law or in equity, or to exercise any option herein provided, shall not constitute a waiver of such provision, remedy or option or in any way affect the validity of this Subscriber Amendment. The waiver of any default by either Party shall not be deemed a continuing waiver, but shall apply solely to the instance to which such waiver is directed.
- 19. FORCE MAJEURE. Neither Subscriber nor Court shall be responsible for failure or delay in the performance of their respective obligations hereunder caused by acts beyond their reasonable control.
- **20. SEVERABILITY.** Every provision of this Subscriber Amendment shall be construed, to the extent possible, so as to be valid and enforceable. If any provision of this Subscriber Amendment so construed is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, illegal or otherwise unenforceable, such provision shall be deemed severed from this Subscriber Amendment, and all other provisions shall remain in full force and effect.
- 21. ASSIGNMENT AND BINDING EFFECT. Except as otherwise expressly permitted herein, neither Subscriber nor Court may assign, delegate and/or otherwise transfer this Subscriber Amendment or any of its rights or obligations hereunder without the prior written consent of the other. This Subscriber Amendment shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the Parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns, including any other legal entity into, by or with which Subscriber may be merged, acquired or consolidated.
- **22. GOVERNING LAW.** This Subscriber Amendment shall in all respects be governed by and interpreted, construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the United States and of the State of Minnesota.
- **23. VENUE AND JURISDICTION.** Any action arising out of or relating to this Subscriber Amendment, its performance, enforcement or breach will be venued in a state or federal court situated within the State of Minnesota. Subscriber hereby irrevocably consents and submits itself to the personal jurisdiction of said courts for that purpose.
- **24. INTEGRATION**. This Subscriber Amendment contains all negotiations and agreements between the parties. No other understanding regarding this Subscriber Amendment, whether written or oral, may be used to bind either party, provided that all terms and conditions of the CJDN Subscriber Agreement and all previous amendments remain in full force and effect except as supplemented or modified by this Subscriber Amendment.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Parties have, by their duly authorized officers, executed this Subscriber Amendment in duplicate, intending to be bound thereby.

Statements:

All agencies receiving data from the BCA or through the BCA will be charged at least \$50 per-month. (Regardless if they are connected directly to us or not)

Current paying agencies will continue to pay their current monthly fee regardless of the method of connection. (Exception: See VPN agency charges below)

New agencies will pay \$50 per-month.

Agencies that are currently not paying any fees will be charged \$50 per-month.

VPN agencies will pay \$50 per-month plus \$15.00 per-fob p/m (for CJA & Private Law Firm) or \$35 per-fob p/m (for NCJA).

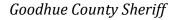

RE: Police and Fire Pension Plan Membership Resolution for Emergency Management Director

Summary:

In August of 2021, the County Commissioners approved a resolution for the Emergency Management Director to participate in the Police and Fire pension plan, partly due to the nature of the work performed. Since then, we have seen the benefits of having a MN POST licensed person in this position. The position has evolved since the pandemic and is now involved in responding to all emergencies, including emergencies requiring a law enforcement response. As a result, the job description has since been updated to reflect the necessary duties with an updated position title of Deputy Sergeant – Emergency Management Director.

Earl Merchlewitz was offered, accepted and has started as our Deputy Sergeant – Emergency Management Director. MN PERA has reviewed the updated job description and indicated this position would qualify as a dual position, making it eligible for the Police and Fire pension plan with a county board resolution.

The Deputy Sergeant – Emergency Management Director position is fully funded through the REP Grant Program and Emergency Management Performance Grant. It remains an exempt position. This updated job description and title has already been through the pay grade study as presented and thus we aren't asking for any changes there. The MN PERA amount for this position is included in the HR budget.

Recommendation:

We ask the Board to approve the attached resolution for Earl Merchlewitz to participate in the Police and Fire Plan while employed as the Deputy Sergeant – Emergency Management Director.

- 2. possesses full power of arrest,
- 3. charged with the prevention and detection of crimes, and
- 4. has the primary duty (over 50%) to enforce the general criminal laws of the state.

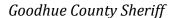

At a recent meeting with local Police Chiefs I mentioned the availability of the retired equipment. The reason for this request is the Cannon Falls Police Commission has reached out requesting the equipment to be donated.

Background

The 2006 MPH Speed Monitor Trailer was in service until a new Speed Monitor Trailer was purchased in 2022 through the Capital Replacement Plan. At the time, the Sheriff's Office made the decision to keep the old speed trailer because the trade in value was very minimal.

Since the new trailer was received the retired one has not been used and is taking up space in our storage building. The Cannon Falls Police Commission has had discussion of how a Speed Trailer could be used in their city in several areas to reduce speeding and speed related accidents. The Police Commission would take responsibility for the care and maintenance for the 2006 MPH Speed Monitor Trailer. The benefit of donating the speed trailer to Cannon Falls is it will continue to be used within Goodhue County.

The Port Security Grant Program (PSGP) provides funding to port authorities, facility operators, and State and local agencies for activities associated with implementing Area Maritime Security Plans, facility security plans and other port-wide management efforts.

On August 21, 2023 the Sheriff's Office received approval for the PSGP funding. The funding was approved to purchase a 22' 8" 230CC EdgeWater fiberglass boat with a Yamaha 300 HP Motor and a boat trailer used for security threat prevention and response.

Part 200, Subpart E may not be charged to other federal financial assistance awards to overcome fund deficiencies; to avoid restrictions imposed by federal statutes, regulations, or federal financial assistance award terms and conditions; or for other reasons. However, these prohibitions would not preclude recipients from shifting costs that are allowable under two or more awards in accordance with existing federal statutes, regulations, or the federal financial assistance award terms and conditions may not be charged to other federal financial assistance awards to overcome fund deficiencies; to avoid restrictions imposed by federal statutes, regulations, or federal financial assistance award terms and conditions; or for other reasons.

Article XVII - Education Amendments of 1972 (Equal Opportunity in Education Act) - Title IX

As such, it does not apply to tools, equipment, and supplies, such as temporary scaffolding, brought to the construction site and removed at or before the completion of the infrastructure project. Nor does a Buy America preference apply to equipment and furnishings, such as movable chairs, desks, and portable computer equipment, that are used at or within the finished infrastructure project but are not an integral part of the structure or permanently affixed to the infrastructure project.

Waivers

When necessary, recipients may apply for, and the agency may grant, a waiver from these requirements. Information on the process for requesting a waiver from these requirements is on the website below.

- (a) When the Federal agency has made a determination that one of the following exceptions applies, the awarding official may waive the application of the domestic content procurement preference in any case in which the agency determines that:

SUBJECT: Request to Order 2024 and 2025 Squads

Summary

It is requested the County Board authorize the Sheriff's Office to order squads in 2023, which are in the 2024 and 2025 Capital Plan.

The Sheriff's Office currently has requested 11 squads in both the 2024 and 2025 Capital Plan. In order to get the majority of the squads delivered in 2024 and 2025, Sheriff's Administration was notified the order needs to be placed in September 2023 for the Dodge Durango's and November 2023 for the Ford Explorer's.

The plan for 10 of the squads in the 2024 Capital Plan is to order six Dodge Durango's, to be delivered in 2024 and four Ford Explorer's to be delivered in 2025. The one additional unmarked squad will be ordered and delivered in 2024. The plan for seven of the squads in the 2025 Capital Plan is to order seven Ford Explorer's in November 2023 to be delivered in 2025. The additional four squads in the 2025 Capital Plan can be ordered and delivered in 2025.

Background

Sheriff's Administration was notified in August 2023 that Ford has had an increased demand for vehicles and decreased production, which has caused them to move their closing date for orders to November 2023, and those ordered will all be delivered in 2025. They will not deliver any squads in 2024. At the same time, Dodge was contacted and Sheriff's Administration was notified the Durango's need to be ordered by September 2023 in order to be delivered in 2024.

Payment for the 6 Durango's will be made in 2024 and payment for the 11 Ford Explorer's will be made in 2025 and the anticipated costs are within the amounts in the budget.

SUBJECT: Approval Resolution for Repurchase of Tax-Forfeited Land

BACKGROUND

Parcel 55.490.0700 forfeited to the State of MN due to nonpayment of property taxes. Carl Stumpf and Johnnie Harris-Stumpf have received numerous notices from us that the property would forfeit if taxes were not current. Delinquent taxes date back to pay 2019. On May 10, 2023 the property forfeited. An eviction hearing was held on July 26th. Johnnie was present at that hearing and said she was interested in repurchasing the parcel. A new hearing was scheduled for August 29th. That was set up to allow Johnnie the time to submit a letter requesting to repurchase the parcel and for that letter to go to the board. The county made contact with Johnnie multiple times during that period but no repurchase request letter was received. The eviction continuation hearing was held on August 29th. At that time, we received a letter asking to repurchase the parcel. Another eviction hearing has been scheduled for October 3rd. We indicated to Johnnie that upon your approval she has until September 29th to make full payment on all past due taxes, penalty, interest, costs and recording fees (23,513.12). Should we not receive full payment on or before September 29th, the parcel will move forward in the tax forfeiture process.

DISCUSSION

MN Statute 282.241 states that at this point in the process the property owner or taxpayer does not have a right to repurchase the property; however, they do have the privilege of submitting a written application to the County Board, requesting to repurchase a parcel of tax-forfeited property. The County Board by resolution has the authority and responsibility to approve or disapprove any written request for repurchase.

The County Board's approval is to be given only if at least one of the following conditions is determined to be true.

- 1. The County Board is to determine that the undue hardship or injustice resulting from the tax forfeiture will be corrected by the repurchase.
- 2. The County Board is to determine that the repurchase will best serve the public interest.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff feels condition #2 above is met and recommends the Board approve the repurchase of parcel 55.490.0700.

RESOLUTION FOR REPURCHSASE OF TAX-FORFEITED LANDS

WHEREAS, property located in the City of Red Wing described as parcel 55.490.0700 forfeited to the State of MN for delinquent taxes assessed for 2018 payable 2019 and subsequent years, as provided by the appropriate statutes, and

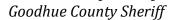
WHEREAS, MS 282.241 provides for repurchase after forfeiture of tax by aggregate of all delinquent taxes and assessments, together with penalties, interest and costs which would have accrued had said lands not forfeited to the State, unless prior to the time of repurchase such parcels shall have been sold, and

SUMMARY

The Goodhue County Sheriff's Office has been asked to provide policing services for the City of Goodhue after the resignation of their police force. This contract will start on August 24, 2023 and end December 31, 2023. This contract is similar to the other policing contracts within Goodhue County. The City of Goodhue has asked for policing coverage of six hours a day.

BACKGROUND

The City of Goodhue has been in discussion with the Goodhue County Sheriff's Office regarding police coverage in their city since the resignation of the Goodhue police force. On August 23rd, the City Council approved the contract with the Goodhue County Sheriff's Office to provide policing services for the City of Goodhue for the remainder of 2023. Continued discussions will be made between the City of Goodhue and the Goodhue County Sheriff's Office to discuss a future policing contract for 2024 and beyond. The contract for 2023 mirrors the policing contract of the other cities in Goodhue County.

RECOMMENDATION

Approve the policing contract between the Goodhue County Sheriff's Office and the City of Goodhue for 8/24/23-12/31/23.

AGREEMENT - LAW ENFORCEMENT SERVICES

August 24, 2023 - December 31, 2023

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this <u>23</u> day of <u>August</u>, 2023, by and between the County of Goodhue, hereinafter referred to as the County, the City of Goodhue, hereinafter referred to as the City, and the Goodhue County Sheriff, hereinafter referred to as the Sheriff.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the City is desirous of contracting with the County and the Sheriff for the performance of the hereinafter described law enforcement functions within the City boundaries, said function to be performed by the Sheriff, and

WHEREAS, such contracts are authorized and provided for by the provisions of Minnesota Statutes 471.59; 436.05; 626.76 and 629.40. NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to the terms of the aforesaid statutes, it is agreed as follows:

1. The County and the Sheriff agree to provide law enforcement services within the corporate limits of the City to the extent and in the manner hereinafter set forth. Except as otherwise hereinafter specifically set forth, the services aforementioned shall consist of the type of services coming within the jurisdiction of and customarily rendered by the Sheriff under the statutes of the State of Minnesota. Except as hereinafter otherwise provided for, the level of service shall be the same standard as provided for the unincorporated areas of Goodhue County.

All decisions concerning the implementation and performance of said law enforcement services, including the disciplining of officers and other matters incident to the performance of such services and the control of the personnel so employed, shall remain with the Sheriff.

Law enforcement services to be performed by the Sheriff shall include the enforcement of the state statutes and municipal ordinances of the City of Goodhue.

- 2. To facilitate the satisfactory performance of said functions, it is hereby agreed that the Sheriff shall have full cooperation as reasonable from the City, its officers, agents, and employees.
- 3. In the performance of said law enforcement functions, the Sheriff shall provide 42 hours per week of law enforcement service (Sunday through Saturday, at hours to be mutually agreed upon), the performance of said duties to be determined by the Sheriff. Said duties may be performed

outside the municipal boundaries of the City of Goodhue and not necessarily to the direct benefit of the City of Goodhue.

4. In consideration for the law enforcement service provided by the Sheriff to the City, as specified in Paragraph 3 above, the City shall pay to the County the amounts listed below, payable on the first day of each month, and shall continue monthly thereafter.

August = \$2,680

September = \$10,217

October = \$10,217

November = \$10.217

December = \$10,217

- 5. The City shall not be called upon to assume any liability for the direct payment of salaries, or other compensation or employer's expense to any County personnel, nor shall the City be responsible for any liability, other than that specifically provided for in this agreement. Except as otherwise specified, the City shall not be liable for compensation or indemnity to any County employee for injury or sickness arising out of his employment.
- 6. If, in the judgment of the Sheriff and/or City, it is necessary to add additional temporary law enforcement personnel for special events, the City agrees to reimburse the County for all necessary expenses.
- 7. If, in the performance of the services aforementioned, there are expenses in addition to those mentioned in the schedule, authorization to incur those expenses shall be given only after the City and the Sheriff, by mutual consent, agree to said expenses being incurred.
- 8. The City shall not assume any liability for acts of the Sheriff's personnel hired in the performance of their duties, and any law enforcement personnel hired under the terms of the agreement shall be deemed to be County employees, and the County shall hold the City harmless for any claim for damages resulting from their employment that may accrue to the City. Both parties reserve their liability limits and other rights under Minn. Stat., Chapter 466.
- 9. Unless sooner terminated, as provided for herein, this agreement shall be effective August 24th, 2023 through December 31st, 2023.
- 10. Not withstanding Paragraph 9, or any other provision or provisions of this Contract to the contrary, the City or County shall have the right to terminate this Contract at any time during the term of said Contract upon the giving sixty (60) days written notice to the other. In the event of Contract termination by the City or County during the term of said Contract, the City shall owe the County only the pro rata share of the original Contract price calculated to the date of said termination, and not the original Contract price agreed on.
 - 11. It is understood and agreed that the offenses for which any arrests are made be

prosecuted in the District Court in which the offense occurred and that any fines collected pursuant to conviction under municipal ordinance shall be paid over to the Treasurer of the City in a sum and of the distribution provided by the statute.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the municipality of the City of Goodhue, by Resolution duly adopted by its governing body, caused this Agreement to be signed by its Mayor and attested by its Clerk, and the County of Goodhue, by order of its Board of County Commissioners, has caused these presents to be subscribed by the Chairman of the Board and the seal of said Board to be affixed thereto and attested by the Goodhue County Administrator, and the Goodhue County Sheriff has signed this agreement, all on the day and year first above written.

Re: 457 Retirement Plan Enhancement

The Goodhue County Insurance Committee met on August 8, 2023 to review the 457b deferred compensation plan request for proposal (RFP) information.

Background

Goodhue County employees, who meet eligibility requirements, are covered by a defined-benefit pension plan through the Minnesota Public Employees Retirement Association (PERA). Both the employees and the employer contribute to the pension plan.

Despite the advantages of a defined-benefit pension plan, public sector workers may fall short of adequate retirement income without additional retirement savings. Goodhue County offers three (3) 457b deferred compensation plans that employees may contribute to in order to increase retirement savings.

Bolstering retention efforts has been a shared goal for County Board, Administration, Human Resources and the entire management team. One effort to support this goal is to increase employee knowledge of and participation in long-term savings plans such as the 457b deferred compensation plan. The first step in this campaign is a comprehensive review of existing plans with the Insurance Committee.

Process

The Insurance Committee met to review the current Empower and Nationwide plan designs which had not been updated for years – except for statutorily required amendments to comply with legislation (such as Secure 2.0). Note: the MNDCP plan is overseen by the Minnesota State Retirement System (MSRS) and Goodhue County is statutorily obligated to continue offering this plan option. The Insurance Committee recommended utilizing intellicents to conduct a request for proposal (RFP) and then establishing a subcommittee to review proposals.

The subcommittee reviewed materials and evaluated presentations from three (3) vendor finalist: Nationwide Retirement Solutions (incumbent), One America and John Hancock. The finalists were evaluated on: pricing structure, data security, administrative flexibility, operational efficiency, relationship manager responsiveness, communications, technology, innovation, ease of transition, and focus on employee success.

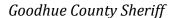

RE: Request to hire two additional Public Safety Telecommunicators

Summary:

The Goodhue County Sheriff's Office is requesting approval to hire two additional FTE Public Safety Telecommunicators as soon as possible. With the job posting, hiring and background process, these individuals won't start until later in the year and E911 funds will cover the first three or four months while they are in training. The expense of these individuals will not have to be covered by Goodhue County until approximately the second quarter of 2024.

Background & Request:

The position of Public Safety Telecommunicator (PST) is vital to the successful response to any emergency and non-emergency public safety incident throughout Goodhue County. Not since July of 2002 have we added additional PSTs to our Emergency Communication Center, while our partner agencies have added staff to accommodate their increase in calls for service.

Our PSTs process over 75,000 phone calls per year that require documentation for more than fourteen different agencies throughout Goodhue County. Unique to our office, our PSTs also serve as our Warrant Division, handling over 3,000 warrant files and court related orders annually.

In June of 2021, Captain Steffen completed a staffing analysis specific to the Emergency Communications Center. Options from the analysis suggested an increase of the existing number of PST's based on statistics from 2020, collective bargaining agreements, workloads, and state and national standards. An increase to the number of PSTs would lead to a decrease in the current overtime budget. This report is included with this request for your review and consideration.

Additionally, we have compared staffing numbers to our neighboring counties. All of them provide emergency and nonemergency call processing and dispatching for the agencies within their respective counties. Our public safety partners throughout the county are overwhelmingly in support of this request. Some have chosen to express their support in the attached letters for your review.

We have started to transform our Emergency Communications Center and related systems to support the wave of new technologies that have begun and to which our communities and public safety agencies have come to expect.

As you recall, this request was talked about again at the Budget Workshop on August 22nd and the consensus from the County Board was to bring it to the next board meeting for approval.

Recommendation:

It is the recommendation of the Sheriff that the County Board approve the request to hire two additional FTE Public Safety Telecommunicators and start the hiring process as soon as possible with knowing their salary and benefit expense will not have to be covered by Goodhue County until approximately the second quarter of 2024.
